The one hundred and fifty-sixth annual communication of the Grand Lodge of the Ancient and Honourable Fraternity of Free and Accepted Masons of New Brunswick was held in the Masonic Temple, 92 Germain Street, Saint John, N. B. on Friday and Saturday, the 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> of May A.D. 2023, A.L. 6023.

But it certainly is good to communicate with many of the Brethren and non Brethren alike answering questions and disseminating information. I would like to thank M:W:B: Randall W. Nelson and R:W:B: Graham A. Fraser for always being ready to assist me with information and guidance from their previous experiences as Grand Secretary.

Grand Lodge is always a great time to get together and this year we anticipate a good attendance with a new slate of Officers who will be commencing their terms after Grand Lodge takes place. The election results have been tabulated two weeks prior to Grand Lodge with our electronic/mail in process. We would like to thank our retiring Grand Master, M:W:B: Thomas C. Borthwick, for a job well done within our province and throughout Canada, the United States and France.

Annual Reports of the Lodges in our province were all received earlier this year than in the past and I would like to thank the Secretaries of the thirty-four Lodges within New Brunswick. For future reference, we in the Office would like to see an even better response in returning the Annual Reports. It is suggested that each Lodge submit their Reports as early in the New Year as possible and defer payment of “per capita” fees until such time as Secretary, Treasurer and Audit Reports of the Lodge are read and passed in your Lodge. Annual Reports are necessary for three main reasons: first for the Grand Lodge Office to generate an up to date listing for all Grand Lodge Officers who are eligible to vote for Grand Lodge Office positions; second, to generate a list of our updated numbers of members for the Finance Committee to assist them in preparation of their annual “Proposed Budget” for Grand Lodge; third, for the “per capita” fees for members for Grand Lodge to function financially.

Our number of Lodges has remained at thirty-four in the past year although we are aware that there are some Lodges struggling membership wise and/or financially. One bright bit of news on this matter is that we welcome a new Lodge, Cornerstone, who are meeting under dispensation of the Grand Master with hopes to officially become the provinces thirty-fifth Lodge in the near future. Cornerstone’s inaugural meeting was held on Saturday, April 8<sup>th</sup>, 2023 in Moncton.

On the COVID-19 virus front, there is a new variant called “Arcturus” or “XBB.1.16” which is in the news and just might result in a 6<sup>th</sup> vaccination in the Fall of 2023? Currently in India and England but will more than likely spread to Canada. At present, Department of Health and Wellness in New Brunswick is suggesting that we continue to be vigilant, but no specific recommendations are forthcoming. The Grand Lodge of New Brunswick Office will continue to monitor and update Lodges as needed. Suggestion is to continue to wash hands

often, wear mask if so inclined and if sick at all with any respiratory symptoms, do not attend meetings or get-togethers. Stay safe Brethren.

I would encourage our members to continue to access our Grand Lodge website and also our private Facebook page where the latest updates and information are maintained for the information of our Brethren. As well, I continue to send regular update emails to all Secretaries in N.B. Lodges.

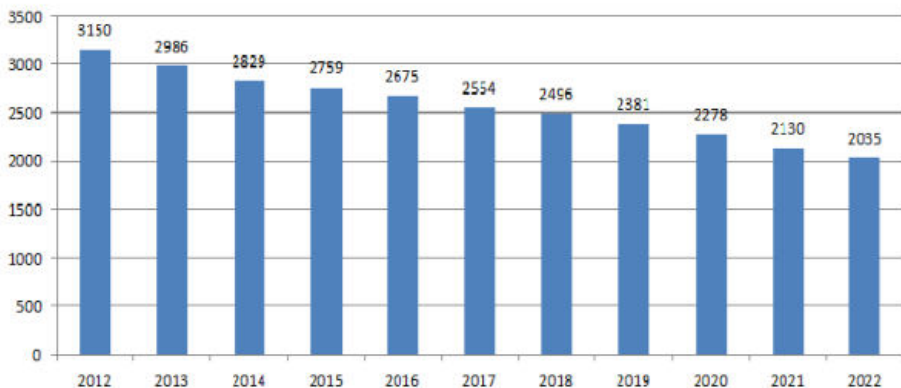

**GRAND MASTER'S ADDRESS**

To the Most Worshipful, Right Worshipful, Very Worshipful and Worshipful Brethren, Distinguished Visiting Guests and Brethren all,

It gives me great pleasure to present to you my report as Grand Master of the Ancient Fraternity of Free and Accepted Masons of New Brunswick. The years 2022-2023 have been very fulfilling to me as your Grand Master.

Once all the lodges reopened after COVID-19, we didn't have to close down because of the pandemic again. Coming out of COVID-19, our lodges have really

been busy doing degree work. Almost every lodge in the province has had at least one new candidate, some as many as eight or nine. This, as Grand Master, is what I love to see. We have had lodges, in the last year, put candidates through degree work who haven't had a candidate in ten years. I believe Masonry is on the rise in our province.

COVID-19 also brought some good to our Fraternity, that is, zoom meetings started up which allowed us to stay in touch with our brothers. These zoom meetings have created a lot of new friendships with brothers from around the world. Today we have five brothers from Bermuda as a fallout/benefit from COVID-19. Zoom also allows brothers who are shut in to be able to join in with their brothers for Masonic education and fellowship.

The attendance at lodge meetings is up which is so nice to see. As I travel this province and attend a lot of meetings, I am so pleased to see things happening in our lodges. Events like community breakfasts, suppers, or social events, which bring all brethren together.

My second year started off right after our Annual Communication - boots on the road - or as I like to say, tires on the pavement. That next weekend, my wife and I were off to New Hampshire on Friday and Saturday for their session. Then Sunday and Monday off to Rhode Island. The following weekend was to the Grand Lodge of Quebec and then off to Nova Scotia for their Annual Communication. While at Grand Lodge of Nova Scotia, I was bestowed with an Honorary Past Grand Master. I was very honored to receive this.

The following weekend was the Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island, which unfortunately I could not attend as my wife, and I had a previous engagement. I would like to thank my Deputy Grand Master R:W:B: Christopher Kitson and his wife Jacqueline for attending and representing the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick. After this, we got a little break until mid-July where we attended the Grand Lodge of Canada in the province of Ontario.

Then came October and Newfoundland! Anyone who has been to Newfoundland knows how things go. I was honored to have my wife Patty, R:W:B: Allen Hatt and his wife Lynn, W:B: Michael MacDonald and his wife Bonnie, W:B: Adam Hatt and his wife Cara, and Brother Peter Justason, all accompany me to this session. The brothers from Newfoundland met us with open arms and their hospitality is the best!

M:W:B: Donald Lambert was so pleased to see the brethren who accompanied me and thought it was amazing that four brothers would follow the Grand Master to Newfoundland for their session.

Then, in November, we received a special invitation for my wife and I to attend the Grand Lodge of New Jersey, which I believe is a first for the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick.

Following this came a huge invitation for us to attend the Grand Lodge of France held in Paris. I thought about it for like two minutes, and then my wife and I planned a cruise around Italy, Spain and Portugal and flew back to Paris for their session. The session in Paris was something else. It started with a river cruise on the Seine for dinner. Their session was attended by ninety different representatives from around the world and there were close to thirty-five hundred brethren in attendance. The new working Grand Master from the United Grand

Lodge of England was in attendance who spoke and commented that it was his first official visit since taking office in September.

Then, in March of 2023, was the Connecticut Annual Communication which my wife and I attended. Continuing onwards, in May, we visited the Grand Lodge of Maine.

At every one of these sessions, we were welcomed with open arms and treated like royalty and family. The friendships that were made are out of this world, brotherly love like you've never seen. After each of these Annual Communications, it was always "When and where are we going to see each other again?" Everyone was always looking forward to the next one. While in Connecticut and talking with Grand Masters, they say "So, we will see you at our next Annual Communication?". I informed them that after May 13<sup>th</sup> we would have a new Grand Master. They all say "We know, but we want you to continue to visit us at our annual Communications, as well as your new Grand Master. We will be sending out a special invitation to you and your wife". I am pretty excited to be part of this and to be able to represent our Grand Lodge in this capacity.

I finally got to attend the All-Canada conference in Winnipeg with R:W:B: Christopher Kitson, our Deputy Grand Master, and our Grand Secretary, R:W:B: William M. Koval. It was well attended, and I found it interesting how other Jurisdictions are doing.

On behalf of our Grand Lodge, we had four brothers attend the Peppercorn Ceremony in Bermuda. It is one of the biggest Masonic Ceremonies with brothers attending from all over the world. The brothers from NB presented the Superintendent of Scotland with a Travelling Gavel along with the rules and encouraged the brothers there to visit other lodges. In Bermuda, there are three Scottish Lodges, four English Lodges and four Irish Lodges. One in every ten men in Bermuda is a Mason.

When I became Grand Master, W:B: Michael J. MacDonald and Brother Peter C. Justason got together and wrote a passport book - knowing how much I like to travel. This book contains the name, number and start time of every New Brunswick Lodge and a place for the Secretary to stamp and sign it. On my Official visits, I presented the Worshipful Master with three books. He will give them to three brothers and encourage them to travel and get the book filled. This is another way to get brothers to visit other lodges.

I made an Official visit to every Lodge in the Province with the exception of Templum Phoenix, but I talked with the members and apologized for not visiting and explained we had family matters we were dealing with. I would like to thank our Deputy Grand Master, R:W:B: Christopher Kitson for making an Official visit in my place. During my visits, attendance ranged from twenty-six to sixty-eight with the average being forty-five to forty-eight.

We had three executive and three Board of General Purposes meetings in which many things were discussed. During the Board meeting in November, the members voted to suspend M:W: Past Grand Master William C. Boone for Masonic misconduct. The Grand Master removed the suspension a month later believing that every Mason should have a fair trial. Further charges were brought against M:W:B: William C. Boone and a trial date was set for March. After hours of negotiating, M:W:B: Boone accepted an eleven-month suspension.

In April, a new daytime lodge - Cornerstone - had its first meeting under dispensation.

The Grand Lodge had many invitations to other concordant bodies, and I can say, a Grand Lodge representative was present at every one of them. This was something that I promised when I became Grand Master.

Our Books for Bikes program is growing, and it is so nice to see more and more Lodges getting involved in this program. Our Masonic Charity and Housing is very active with our biggest Charity - Camp Goodtimes. The Veteran Banners program is growing, and we need to show that we are proud of all our Veterans.

During COVID-19, we had to find a way to vote. Electronic balloting was introduced by M:W: Past Grand Master Randall W. Nelson and R:W:B: James A. Leavitt. They got Electronic balloting started not knowing if it would continue after the pandemic was over. It worked for us and allowed brothers to stay more engaged with Grand Lodge elections. A brother didn't have to drive three or four hours to cast a ballot. Voting numbers were up slightly and we believe this year numbers will be significantly higher. This year will be the first Official Electronic voting in our Grand Lodge as the motion to adopt it was passed at last year's Communication.

I would like to thank all my Grand Lodge Officers who served over the past two years. It has been my pleasure working with each and every one of you. I thank each and every Lodge for hosting an Official visit and preparing a delicious meal for the brothers, especially those who had meatloaf. For the brothers not knowing about this, meatloaf is one of the Grand Master's favorite meals.

This time last year, we were all praying for R:W:B: Mark H. Ouellette after he had suffered a stroke. Here it is a year later, and Mark has had tremendous improvement so much so that I believe he is here in Grand Lodge today. What a very special day it is in the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick.

I would like to thank a few people now who have been by my side encouraging me through my last eight years on becoming your Grand Master. First of all, my wife Patty; she has been a rock by my side, never giving up on me. The last two years, Patty and I have dealt with a family matter which I pray no one ever has to deal with. During these trying times, she never let me sway from my commitment as your Grand Master. My children still continue to encourage me. I deeply thank R:W:B: Allen E. Hatt, who has been with me for four years - two as Assistant Grand Director of Ceremonies and two as Grand Director of Ceremonies and more road miles than he ever expected. To the past Grand Masters, who I called many times looking for advice, I thank you. To my Grand Secretary, RWB William M. Koval, who has done an amazing job, I appreciate it. At the Grand Lodge office, I thank Mrs. Lisa McKenzie from the bottom of my heart. You will never know how much I appreciate the things you have done for me. Even more importantly, the things you do for the brothers, thank you. The last two years as your Grand Master have been a whirlwind. The time has come and gone in a blink, and I really don't know where the two years have gone. It has been my Honour to serve this Fraternity.

In closing, I would like to thank the fraternity for believing in me as your Grand Master. I believe I have represented our Jurisdiction with Honor and Pride.

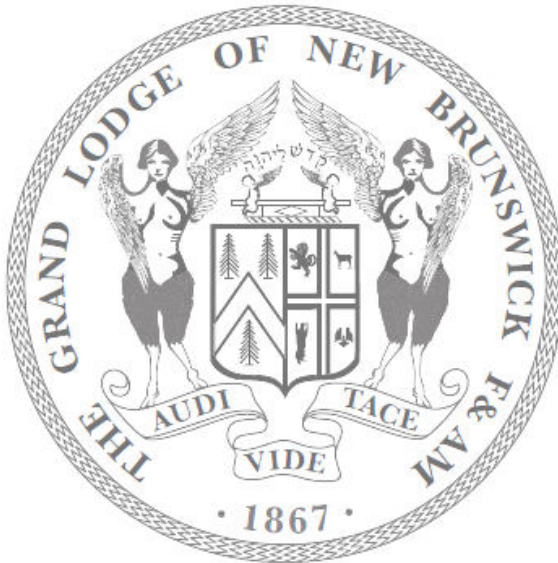

**Executive Committee – October 18<sup>th</sup>, 2022**

Updated members on work done regarding Home Lodge. 53 members to date with 7 being Life members. 1 member currently in Palliative Care and so made a Life member. Addresses up to date and Invoices out for 2022 with letter

regarding members having 2 years from date of letter (Sept. 12/22) to Affiliate with a Lodge or Demit will be granted from GLNB.

Request made to Finance Committee to review the Expenses Allocation to members of Grand Lodge with regards to travelling.

Concerning a Lodge where Gnostic faith book placed on Altar. The MWGM had the DDGM in the District removed until the subject was discussed at Executive meeting. Information reviewed regarding Gnosticism and appeared to be not a Religion, but a collection of thoughts and teachings intertwined with the Christian faith. In some research, beliefs Polytheistic vs. Monotheistic as practiced by Freemasons. **Decision** made that Gnostic books not to be placed on Altar until further discussion and clarification of Gnostic faith obtained.

The Grand Secretary contacted Rideau Hall in Ottawa and has an email address for those Lodges who wish to receive the new King's portrait for display in their Lodge rooms, will send out info to Secretaries.

Grand Representatives, currently have 4 openings, plan to contact all Grand Lodges participating in Program to review future participation and membership.

Book written by a MWB to be discussed at BoGP. A brief discussion was held on content of book.

### **Board of General Purposes – October 29<sup>th</sup>, 2022**

Discussion on merger of Districts No. 2 and No. 7. No major concerns since RWB assumed DDGM for both. Amendment to Regulations on Agenda for merger.

Board updated on proposal to archive information reviewing the GLNB "Archival Policy Statement" of 2004 and draft proposal for "Policies and Procedures of the Library and Archives". Motion carried that the Policy of be adopted and utilized for Archiving information for the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick.

COVID-19- currently no restrictions per Dept. of Health and Wellness N.B. Encouraged continuing vigilance with hand washing and mask wearing of those who feel more comfortable doing same. Members encouraged to obtain both COVID and Flu vaccines as we enter flu season. COVID vaccine protective against newest variants. Flu vaccine protective against 4 strains of flu. Flu season has already begun in October.

Reviewed the Motion and 2 amendments to the Regulations to be presented at Grand Lodge 2023. These to be forwarded to Jurisprudence Committee for review.

Order of Recognition at Lodge meetings – noted differences in introductions of Grand Lodge Officers in Constitutions and Officer's Manual. Ritual Committee to review and update Officer's Manual.

Concerns with Book as written by a MWB. Much discussion of inaccuracies, personal attacks, and possible breaches to Grand Lodge Constitutions. Motion made that the Board recommend that the Grand Master suspend the MWB per his powers in the Constitutions of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick. Grand

Secretary to compose letter and forward to Chair of Jurisprudence Committee and, once returned, have Grand Master sign, and send letter via Registered Mail

### **Executive Committee – February 21<sup>st</sup>, 2023**

Noted that a Worshipful Brother was obligated into his Master's Chair taking oath from Gnostic Book. Book was only used for oath and then removed for rest of Installation. Gnostic faith discussions are still ongoing.

Reviewed the year to date financial statements. Income and expenses as budgeted for. Budget for 2023 and 2024. Per Capita now \$45 with no plans at present re increase. Hoping to maintain the current level of members as this our main source of income. Reviewing increase in Travel for Grand Lodge members. The Committee will be ready to present Proposed Budgets for 2023/2024 to Grand Lodge in May 2023.

Noted 2 postings on FreeRunners site in past month where Square and Compass on emblem. Grand secretary to contact group to monitor their postings and assure Square and Compass not part of posting.

Reviewed Privacy concerns and whether there is a need for Grand Lodge Officers to sign a Privacy and Confidentiality form to assure same: To refer to Jurisprudence Committee.

Reviewed a Motion, Notice of Motion and 2 changes to Regulations. Noted that there will be another Notice of Motion to be added which will be presented at BoGP meeting March 11th along with these.

Note that Trial of the Most Worshipful Brother is scheduled to be held on Thursday, March 11, 2023, commencing since Mediation has been unable to solve situation.

Update of members of Committee of new Lodge, Cornerstone, to meet under Dispensation of GM. This to be a Daytime Lodge and to meet in Moncton.

Discussed whether GLNB has mandate for each Committee of Grand Lodge as was questioned by Jurisprudence Committee recently. No mandates in writing we are aware of. This may be addressed in future.

Copy of proposed new Officer's Manual received which will be given to the new Ritual Committee to review, amend and present for print.

### **Board of General Purposes – March 11<sup>th</sup>, 2023**

The need to have written mandates and rules for each Committee to be carried forward and sent to Chairman of each Committee after Grand Lodge 2023.

A member read letter as written by him regarding most recent breaches of confidentiality within the Fraternity especially within BoGP. Noted that info from last BoGP available to members outside of meeting almost immediately upon completion of meeting. Copy of letter given to Grand Secretary upon conclusion. Observed that in Business often a form signed by members to address issue. Also noted that some concordant bodies have privacy waiver on bottom of application forms for new members. DDGM's feel there to be a "fine line" between what they can and cannot report to Districts after BoGP meetings and would like

clarification. Grand Secretary to look into matter. Re-design of Application form? Confidentiality waiver for members of all Committees?

Noted that planned Trial, averted after mutual agreement reached with involvement of Grand Master. Note that book, "A Tale of Trials" removed from sale, 11 month suspension to be served by the Most Worshipful Brother's suspension started on March 9, 2023.

Most Worshipful the Grand Master thanked all members of the Board for their involvement and participation for his term as GM.

At the time of this report being written on what could be the last reporting from districts No.2 and No. 7 individually. I have approximately less than two months left in my term as DDGM.

Where did the time go?

When I was first asked to represent our G.M. in both districts No. 2 and No. 7, I must admit I had concerns on how I would be received. That Question was soon put to rest. All six lodges welcomed me with Brotherly love. They went out of their way to make me feel welcomed.

It is with great pleasure that I report on behalf of all the Lodges within the jurisdiction of District 6.

Hiram Lodge No. 6: Is in Fredericton and meets at 7:30PM on the first Thursday each month with the exception of July and August. Lead by Worshipful Master Danny Dort, Hiram Lodge was able to increase their membership numbers in 2022. This in spite of suffering 2 deaths, 5 demits and 2 suspensions. They had 1 member return to the active membership list during the year. Hiram Lodge is very active in promoting Brotherhood and meet on a regular monthly basis in a relax setting to enjoy the fellowship of other Brothers, their wives and mutual friends. They are active in the Books for Bikes program as well as taking a very active role in supporting Camp Goodtimes. Hiram Lodge has been very active in conferring degrees on new candidates as they often have multiple candidates receiving degrees throughout the year. Although Hiram Lodge experienced some very dedicated members seeking and obtaining demits, I believe, they have stabilized and, if they can stay the course, should experience a very positive future.

Alexandria Lodge No. 33: Is also in Fredericton and meets at 7:30PM on the first Monday of each month. Although their By-laws allow Alexandria Lodge the opportunity to change meeting nights when conflicts with statutory holidays occur, they maintain consistency by continuing to meet on their regular meeting night. They also recess during the months of July and August. Under the leadership of RWB Ian Culligan, presently serving his 8<sup>th</sup> term as Worshipful Master, Alexandria Lodge has positioned itself with a line of progression that should result in a new Master being elected for the next 6 years. Alexandria Lodge boast the highest membership in the district at 101 members. Average meeting attendance at Alexandria Lodge during 2022 was 29 present which included an average of 5 visitors. Alexandria Lodge was able, in spite of having 1 demit, 2 deaths, and 2 suspensions, able to increase their membership by 2 in 2022. During the summer of 2022 Alexandria Lodge was approached to partner in a community breakfast opportunity which netted in excess of \$5,000.00 for Camp Goodtimes. Through the generosity of its membership and in partnership with local community minded businesses Alexandria Lodge, through the Books for Bikes program, was able to give 19 bicycles to 9 boys and 10 girls in the Fredericton area. During one of these presentations a name was drawn and it was determined there were 2 students with very similar names. Canadian Tire Store, Smythe Street stepped forward and donated an additional bicycle so no student left school unhappy that day. Alexandria Lodge hosted The Most Worshipful Tom Borthwick, Grand Master on a recent official visit. There was 63 Mason in attendance representing 23 Lodges from around the province. Both financially and in membership numbers, Alexandria Lodge is very well positioned for a long, bright future in Freemasonry.

Grand Lake Lodge No 47: Is located in the Village of Minto and meets on the second Wednesday of each month with the exception of January and February.

This schedule was reviewed by the Lodge membership and confirmed to continue this practice for the next number of years. It serves both the District and Freemasonry well in that it gives those Masons visiting the Grand Lake area during the summer months an opportunity to get their Masonic fix. Grand Lake Lodge is a typical country Lodge in that on first glance one is left to wonder if it is worth continuing to operate. With the Lodge owning the building and taking on the expenses associated with that plus in a community with a declining population, until the recent provincial amalgamation, the members must work extra hard to raise funds to keep operating. The present membership, under the leadership of VWB Kevin Wilson, WM has shown a strong desire to put in the effort to keep the Lodge open and although closure of the Lodge may be one misfortune away, until that happens, it is my belief, we should continue supporting the brethren of this Lodge in their efforts to keep the Lodge afloat. As of this writing I have not received a report from this Lodge and am unable to speak on its current membership numbers or financial position.

Cherry Mountain Lodge No 50: Is located in the Village of Harvey Station and meets on the second Thursday of each month again with the exception of July and August. WB Allan Johnson sits in the East for the second time taking over from WB Geoff Hutchins. Cherry Mountain Lodge is a leader within District #6 regarding community involvement. There is very little that goes on in the community that this Lodge is not involved with in some capacity.

Cherry Mountain Lodge hosted the DDGM during his official visit to the Lodge on December 8 and also hosted MW Tom Borthwick, GM and in excess of 50 members on February 8 during his official visit. Membership in Cherry Mountain Lodge declined in 2022 from 89 members to 84. The average attendance at meetings was 18 members including guests. This also shows a decline from the previous year. Although membership and attendance both showed a decline in 2022 Cherry Mountain Lodge remains a very vibrant Lodge and for the foreseeable future, with a core of younger Masons being guided by a group of senior, very experienced Masons, they will rebound and remain a very active participant in events planned in the Harvey area.

Landmark Lodge No 51: Is located in the geographical center of the province in Boiestown. They meet on the third Tuesday of the month with the exception of July and August. Landmark Lodge has 55 members registered with Grand Lodge at the end of 2022. This represents a decline of 1 member from the previous year. RWB Darrell Munn has assumed the responsibilities of Worshipful Master for 2023. This represents one of several times he has led this Lodge. From looking at their 5 year plan his plan is to not only improve the Lodge owned building but also increase membership annually. Landmark Lodge closed out 2022 on a sad note with the passing of Br. Lorne Amos, their long time and very capable secretary. The Lodge honoured Br. Amos and his family with a Masonic funeral that was attended by a large turnout of his brethren, including the Grand Master, many other Grand Lodge officers, and several brethren from Landmark Lodge and the District.

Landmark Lodge is in a similar position as that of Grand Lake Lodge wherein they own their building and all the expenses regarding upkeep and operating costs. With small membership numbers the membership must work extra hard to

raise funds or do the upkeep themselves. Covid was especially hard on Landmark Lodge and its fundraising efforts. They also are in a small community that is very well known and famous but is not attracting new residents. This makes the future of this Lodge uncertain with regards to the expectation of Entered Apprentices joining their ranks. This forces Landmark Lodge to rely heavily on affiliations to keep operating. As long as the membership is willing to put in the extra hard work to remain open, it is, I believe, our duty as Mason to help as far as our cable tow will allow.

Granite Lodge No 54: Is located in Temperance Vale, near Nackawic, NB. They meet at the community center in Temperance Vale on the third Wednesday each month. They also recess during the months of July and August. The presiding Master for 2023 is WB Cecil Pirie. Granite Lodge is the smallest of the traditional Lodges in District #6 with 48 members. It faces recruitment problems similar to Minto, Harvey and Boiestown in that the nearest community, Nackawic, is not growing in population quickly enough to produce the required number of candidates to shown positive annual growth. Granite Lodge differs from the other comparable Lodges in that they rent space to hold their Lodge meetings, thereby keeping cost to a minimum. Granite Lodge often relies on affiliated members or visitors to fill chairs for meeting which does have a positive effect on this Lodge. There is a saying within the district that 'if you are visiting Granite Lodge be prepared to fill a chair". The membership of this Lodge is active in community affairs and do support the local school with the Books for Bikes program. They support the widows of deceased brethren along with the sick and affirmed brethren. As with the other smaller Lodges in smaller communities it takes a great effort by the members to keep the Lodge open and Freemasonry in the minds of the residents of the community.

Templum Phoenix Lodge No. 57: The newest Lodge in District #6, Templum Phoenix is not a traditional Lodge per se. They meet 4 times a year at the Masonic Hall in Fredericton. Meeting time is Saturday at 1:00PM. Templum Phoenix's Worshipful Master is RWB Robert MacLeod, who lives in Campbellton. Templum Phoenix does not initiate new members therefore is made up of Masons affiliated from another lodges and jurisdictions. Their membership consists of Masons from Nova Scotia, New Hampshire, and all parts of New Brunswick. Templum Phoenix concentrates on a more in-depth masonic educational experience and extended fellowship amongst its brethren. Although having only 17 members, Templum Phoenix appears very sound financially. Unfortunately, I did not have an opportunity to attend this Lodge until very recently. My scheduled official visit had to be cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances and time did not allow for it to be rescheduled.

In summary, Lodges in District 6, as mentioned previously, are dealing with declining membership. This is primarily due to the age of our membership and the lingering effects of Covid. Although many lodges are initiating new members, those numbers, in many cases, fall short of those leaving the Fraternity and may not alleviate or eliminate the problems of an increase in taxation or an increase in operating costs, or worst still an unexpected major repair expense to the building. These alone or in any combination could impact some lodges very negatively and create a situation wherein the membership may not be able to sufficiently increase fundraising to overcome the associated cost increase. District #6 and

masonry in the district may look very different in the next 5 years. With those lodges who own their building likely being impacted the most by the expected increases in cost, and they being, for the most part, situated in smaller communities, this may result in lodges going into darkness with members choosing to become either inactive or demit rather than face the long drive to a lodge in a larger center. As of to-day there does not appear to be any lodges in the district in this state, however, one misfortune or major unexpected expense may trigger such a move.

I, as District Deputy Grand Master for District #6, was able, with the exception of Templum Phoenix No 57 and, as of this date, Landmark Lodge No.51, to make an official visit to all Lodges in the District. I will conclude my official visits with an official visit to Landmark Lodge No 51 scheduled for April 21, 2023. I have a District #6 meeting scheduled to coincide with the final official visit of The Most Worshipful, Thomas Borthwick, Grand Master at Grand Lake Lodge No 47 on May 10, 2023. I, as DDGM, made 5 visits to Hiram Lodge, 10 visits to Alexandria Lodge (my home lodge), 4 to Grand Lake Lodge, 5 to Cherry Mountain Lodge, 5 to Landmark Lodge, 4 to Granite Lodge and 1 to Templum Phoenix. I also attended on the Grand Master at several of his official visits throughout the province.

As many of you know my appointment was to complete the term of RWB Allan Bishop, who unfortunately became ill shortly after his appointment as DDGM. Although I am honoured that I was chosen as his replacement, I am very mindful of the unfortunate circumstances that opened that door which allowed me to serve in this position and I ask all brethren to join with me in keeping RWB Allan Bishop and all brothers, facing any and all forms of illness, in our thoughts and prayers.

I must say thank you and express my appreciation to the Worshipful Masters, Lodge Officers, and Brethren of District #6 for your unwavering support during my year as your DDGM. It was truly humbling in the way I was received at each Lodge, and I will be forever grateful for the support I received from the brethren throughout the district. A special thank you to RWB Kent Davis for serving as my Assistant Grand Director of Ceremonies and to RWB William Koval and Lisa Mackenzie for keeping me, for the most part anyway, out of trouble.

Most Worshipful, Thomas C. Borthwick, Grand Master, it has been a true pleasure and a most joyful and humbling experience to have served you as your District Deputy Grand Master for District #6. It has been an experience I will treasure for the remainder of my life and I sincerely ‘Thank You’ for placing your faith and trust in me by asking me to serve in this capacity. I sincerely hope I have met all of your expectations.

I am pleased to table this, the 35<sup>th</sup> Annual Report of NB Masonic Charities & Housing Co. for the year ending December 31, 2022. A milestone for sure for the "Brethren" of this Grand Jurisdiction who have been dedicated to the Purposes for which we were created, I.e. supporting children with childhood afflictions and Seniors we serve, those less fortunate among us. .

A very special thank you to all the Masons of New Brunswick and our extended family, for your continued support; and to our Board of Directors as well, who give of their time and talents in support of the work of Masonic Charities, thank you on behalf of the Children we support and the seniors we serve.

### Charities

Thank you for your service and good counsel in a year that saw significant change at the Board level.

We were called upon to mourn the loss of Bro Lorne Amos, Landmark No.' 51, Director. His memory we cherish in our hearts. RWB Daryl Moore resigned as Treasurer in April and we heartfully thank him for his many years service to Masonic Charities in that capacity.

Also, we thank WB Derek Knowles and WB Allan Johnson for their terms as Director, they having withdrawn at the completion of their respective terms.

Camp Goodtimes - 2022 was held July 4<sup>th</sup> to the 9<sup>th</sup> with Masons Day on the 9<sup>th</sup> and was well attended by Masons and their Spouses. Regrettably Camp

registration declined again to about 33 and cost continued to escalate due to minimum wage increases for Camp Staff and inflation. The Board is increasingly concerned with declining registrations and escalating costs.

On a positive note, we were able to fund our Children's charities in 2022 as follows:

N B Deaf Blind Association .....	\$1,250.00
Scottish Rite Dyslexic Learning Centre.....	\$3,000.00
Portage Atlantic .....	\$1,250.00

and according to our Budgetary plan.

Preliminary financial results for Charities suggest that we operated in Deficit again in 2022, to the extent of about \$29,000 ( subject to Audit) and due largely to fundraising short falls.

### **Quinn House**

During the year significant changes occurred at Quinn House. Firstly , our Part time Administrator resigned necessitating the Management Committee to step in and actively manage the facility on a day to day basis.

Also, a decision was made to establish a fully functioning Office on site to facilitate records retention and communication among the Committee, outside third parties and serve as a point of contact for vendors and suppliers in the day-to-day operation of the facility. Note; in addition to our Postal address (Quinn House PO Box 3923 , St Andrews NB E5B3S9 ) we now have an email address ([QuinnHouse9@gmail.com](mailto:QuinnHouse9@gmail.com)).

The Management Committee is now up to full strength and consists of:

WB Peter Justason and RWB Keith Burgess as Chairman

In the fall the Committee initiated a search for a person to replace our Administrator whom I am pleased to report was engaged in February of 2023, again on a part time basis.

Thank you Brethren for all your efforts and support over these past months.

Despite the challenges, the facility continued to operate reasonably smoothly but with a preliminary deficit of just over \$5,000 deficit against budget (and subject to Audit). This driven by escalating maintenance costs on an ageing facility and two vacancies during the year.

### **Challenges ahead**

As we go into 2023 two major issues will need to be addressed by Masonic Charities:

1. Charting a path forward for Quinn House, given that the Operating Agreement with NB Housing expires in March 2024 (and with that the operating subsidy of \$2,400 monthly ,implied there-in)
2. Revitalizing the Board by filling vacancies and restructuring Committees, including the Executive, so as to address emerging issues

with a focus on our primary objectives, Children's charities and Senior's housing.

### REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

To: The Most Worshipful the Grand Master, Officers and Members of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, F. & A.M.

Our 2022 Consolidated Statement of Income shows a bottom line deficit of \$36,000. Investment income at \$16,648 was slightly better than our budget of \$15,000. However, \$28,000 in trading losses in our investment portfolios, during a sharply declining market, went right to our bottom line. Aside from the investments, our Grand Lodge operations were very much in line with budget. Dues revenue at \$85,945 was \$811 below budget as membership continued to decline. The per capita dues increase from \$41.00 to \$45.00 was deferred for the third consecutive year to ease some pressure on lodges as they worked through the long term effects of COVID. The fee has been moved to \$45.00 for the year 2023 and that should offset a slight decline in member numbers. We are aware that several lodges have new candidates proceeding through degree work and it may be possible to see zero decline in member numbers this year. With this possibility we are projecting 2024 per capita income at the same level as 2023.

Expenses for the year at \$116,579 were \$7,638 below budget as the result of continued good control of office and administrative expense. Our 2023 expense budget reflecting no increase over the 2022, should be attainable.

Our balance sheet composition was relatively unchanged year over year. Our Investment Portfolios still account for 90% of our total assets and approximately half of the overall asset decrease is reflected in the year end portfolio values. During the year we returned to our long range investment strategy of 60% equities and 40% income products. We are currently at approximately 50/50 and we continue to work closely with our investment advisors to restore value while retaining a steady income stream.

I want to thank the members of the Finance Committee including, Richard Burpee, Keith Burgess and Gordon Thorne as well as Harry Follett, Grand Treasurer and William Koval, Grand Secretary, who have continued to provide good support throughout the year.

## REPORT OF THE FOREIGN RELATIONS COMMITTEE

To: The Most Worshipful The Grand Master; Officers; and Members of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, F&AM.

The Grand Lodge of New Brunswick F&AM continues to maintain Foreign Relations with many jurisdictions. During the past year, the Grand Lodge office was asked to confirm the status of our relations with a number of jurisdictions and responses were provided when requested. Submissions for official recognition of two Grand Lodges; the Grand Lodge of Georgia AF&AM and Gran Logia de Estado Andres Quintana Roo (Mexico), were received and considered with recommendation of this Committee to officially recognize them at our Grand Lodge proceedings.

Grand Representatives are members of our Grand Lodge and other Grand Lodges in Canada, the U.S. and the World to which an acknowledged exchange of members is in effect to share fraternal foreign relations. Our Grand Lodge has 59 full or partial exchanges set up with a current deficit of 5 positions where our members have passed away in the past 2-3 years. Our Grand Master has proposed members to replace two of these positions with our Grand Lodge Office awaiting confirmation from those 2 Grand Lodges before announcing our new Representatives.

Our special publication, “The Acacia Book” is a list of recognized and non recognized Grand Lodges throughout the World. This information is also available to us electronically in the Office. This information has been referred to many times in the past year and, as well, contact has been ongoing with “The Commission on Information for Recognition of the Grand Masters of North America” Committee.

## REPORT OF THE GRAND HISTORIAN

To: The Most Worshipful The Grand Master, Officers, and Members of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, F. & A. M.

The past year has seen a major change at Grand Lodge, especially how we vote. Less dramatic, but still a significant development, has been forging a relationship with the Public Archives of New Brunswick. On that subject, the *Policies and Procedures of the Library and Archives* adopted by the Board of General Purposes in October 2022 defines the scope and actions of the Grand Historian and Grand Secretary regarding the library and archives held in Saint John and directs them to assist subordinate lodges elsewhere in the jurisdiction to achieve the same. To better inform the Board of General Purposes on the matter,

representatives from PANB, Josh Green and Fred Farrell, were invited to the meeting of the board in October 2022.

PANB have thus far received from Grand Lodge records of several lodges that went into darkness. This example has been followed by some subordinate lodges, most notable is St. George #12. They have had expert help from PANB in having their parade banner, that dates to the early 1800's, restored and returned to them. Also, their original warrant from the United Grand Lodge of England has been archived there and a copy was returned to the lodge. Much of their collection of minute books etc. have been archived there. Other lodges are talking about doing the same.

Preservation of records has been the subject of my remarks in lodges when I've attended on the Grand Master for many of his official visits. Several lodges had specific things to bring to my attention and are mentioned below by way of recognition and follow-up. Other lodges had more general subjects to discuss; interest in the possible services of PANB was generally the case.

Dorchester, NB – A progress report on Sussex #4. The Westmorland Historical Society made a small room available in Keillor House (a museum) where old warrants, furniture and some artifacts have been placed as a memorial. Clearly, there has been masonic guidance in setting up this room. The wall with the names of brethren, their occupation, etc. that used to ornament the East, has been preserved. The altar, made by an operative stonemason who worked at the penitentiary, has been transported to the Masonic Temple in Amherst, NS. Sussex #4 drew its origins from the brethren of Amherst, NS hence the wish to complete the masonic circle with this gift. A visit to Keillor House will interest visiting masons.

Exciting developments at Keith #23 deserve to be mentioned here, specifically, a minute book, long thought to have been lost, has been found. It documents their first meeting, with MWB Alexander Keith himself in attendance. WB John Timmins has all the details. It pays to rummage through the storage rooms!

March 2022 – Visit with RWB David “Bud” Gillrie – informative visit with tour through his treasure trove – a copy of his History of Hiram #6 is in the Hiram #6 Box in Grand Lodge library.

Colebrooke #39 – one of New Brunswick's historical buildings; purpose-built by masons in the 1920's; the room is unforgettable and irreplaceable. The building was listed as an historical landmark in 2007.

Mananook #38 2022– Grand Manan in June! A small membership, but the camaraderie is palpable. Their lodge, now over a hundred years old, holds some artifacts of the same age or older. The experience of the visit was worth the trip, but the time was too short to enquire into their history, records. Perhaps a longer stay for the next visit would be fruitful.

Alexandria #33

June 2022 – A travelling Gavel that originated with Bethel #40, in Edmundston, resurfaced after resting for a time; rescued by WB Curtis Hansen. The gavel circumnavigates the province and brethren from that lodge, now in darkness, are

remembered. It returns to Campbellton #32 each cycle. It was restarted on its journey there by way of Westmorland #44, then Zetland #24. (See below)

Return visit February 6<sup>th</sup> 2023 – Bro. Edwin Corey – invited a tour of his house on Church St., Fredericton. Built by a mason, it includes such features as symbols, ordered steps, pillars, etc. An historic site.

Campbellton #32 July 2022 - The Gavel from Bethel #40 was welcomed home by DDGM Bruce Roper, who received it from WB Kurt Lavigne, Master of Zetland #24. The story of the gavel was related to the assembled brethren; Bethel #40 shall not be forgotten as long as the gavel keeps circulating.

Carleton #35 September 2022 – RWB Marc Ouellette attended lodge for the 1<sup>st</sup> time since he became ill.

Miramichi #17 October 2022- lodge is the result of union of Chatham #18 & Northumberland #17 – meeting now in a magnificent building donated to the fraternity, now under renovation – the Moose Head mounted in the lodge room impresses everyone. Their records and documents are currently in storage. Recently, a deceased member bequeathed a stamp collection as well as memorabilia from visiting American lodges. The suggestion of the Grand Historian was to have the stamp collection evaluated by an expert. When renovations are complete, a display of memorabilia is planned to ornament this impressive lodge.

Tobique #48 February 2023 – a relatively small membership, struggling with the usual issues. A strong community spirit, support from other lodges in the district and a healthy relationship with the local Branch of the Canadian Legion, all give hope. Records have not always been kept but those that can be found shall be gathered by WB Mahaney.

BOGP – March 2023 – the digitization of documents would be facilitated by employing a summer student. An application is in process to have funding for this added to the budget for 2024.

## **REPORT OF THE TRAINING, EDUCATION AND MENTORSHIP COMMITTEE**

To the Most Worshipful the Grand Master, Officers and Members of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, F&AM.

The Education committee has been working on, and facilitating a number of different projects.

The Education available on GLNB site is being constantly updated with papers, quizzes and training materials constantly added to. (40+ items and links to 100s more) We acknowledge the support of a number of Brothers across New Brunswick who have submitted content and would hope that this continues. The

amount of Education delivered in Lodges seems to have increased over the past few years, and it is recognized that materials from our website are utilized on a frequent basis.

Speaking with newer members across the province it would seem that on-line education materials and training are welcomed, and it is hoped we can grow our on-line training courses. To this end, the committee has been making efforts to have an education course currently running in the Grand Lodge of Canada in the Province of Ontario made available to GLNB members. Previous efforts were stalled during the COVID Pandemic, and communications have just started to flourish once again.

A group of Brothers in District 2, seeing the need for the training of members looking to take on Officer roles, have re-drafted the Officer Manual. The education committee gave feedback to the draft, and once the Ritual committee has ratified this will start to work to develop training materials and course delivery.

The committee recently learned that Albion Lodge has Degree information on CDs which they make available to candidates. The committee is investigating the possibility of having the content made available to candidates via GLNB Website, password protected.

It would seem that the GLNB Mentorship program is not being utilized to its full capability throughout the Province. It is recommended that an Education session for Lodge Mentors (and those who wish to become Lodge Mentors) be undertaken this year. A training session was run a few years ago which some members of the committee delivered, it is felt that this could be revamped and delivered fairly easily.

We recognize that during and post the COVID outbreak the DDGM training and instruction course was suspended. Although the information is still available online the Committee recommends that in-person training be re-instituted for the incoming DDGM since they play a pivotal role in the development and coaching of our Lodges and members.

The Education committee would suggest that GLNB give thought to creating a position of Grand Lecturer. This Brother would not only provide a focus for the promulgation and coordination of education materials and papers, but could deliver education at official visits, or arrange the booking of visiting lecturers / educators.

**REPORT OF THE RITUAL COMMITTEE**

---

To the Most Worshipful the Grand Master, Officers and Members of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, F&AM.

I would like to acknowledge the support, advice and contributions made by Committee Members RWB Robert McLeod, WB Hans Erdman and WB Alex DeWare.

Three issues were formally dealt with by the Ritual Committee as a whole:

Issue 1: Verifying that all in the Lodge are of the correct degree and eligibility before returning from refreshments.

Commentary:

The Ritual Committee feels this is only a potential issue for Lodges with high attendance. Many smaller Lodges have trouble filling all the Officers positions and the Worshipful Master would know exactly who was where before going to refreshments. Any newcomer would be obvious. The members of the Ritual Committee are not aware that this has been an issue to date.

Recommendation:

1. The Tyler's duties to include the monitoring of the Brethren while at labour or refreshment.
2. For the large Lodges, it could be made optional to check with the Senior Warden before returning to labour.

Issue 2: Whether semi-public installations of Officers should be done while under labour or refreshments when non-masons are present.

Commentary:

The Ritual Committee were unanimous in their view that any semi-public installation of Officers should be done in refreshment when non-masons are present.

Recommendation:

Any semi-public installation of Officers when non-masons are present shall be conducted while the Lodge is in refreshment.

Issue 3: Whether the Great Lights should be open or closed during the time non-masons are present during a semi-public installation.

Commentary:

This issue certainly brought forth widely divergent views among committee members as to whether the Great Lights should be open or closed during the time non-masons are present during a semi-public installation. As Chairman, I sought additional views from two Past Grand Masters and a Past Senior Grand Warden who have conducted numerous semi-public installations. All three indicated that the Great Lights were left open during the semi-public installations in the same position as when the Lodge was opened. None expressed having any concerns raised with the practice over many years of performing such installations.

Recommendation:

That the Great Lights continue to remain open during any semi-public installations in the same position as when the Lodge was opened.

## Changes to the Constitutions

### Amendment – Article 56 - “Annual Meetings”

*Notice of Motion served in May 2022*

*MWB Gordon R. Rattray will move or cause to be moved in May 2023.*

WHEREAS many brethren only attend one day missing part of the Grand Lodge;  
and WHEREAS the cost of travel and accommodations are getting very high;  
and WHEREAS many brethren work;  
and WHEREAS electronic voting will remove the necessity of attending to vote;  
and WHEREAS the work of Grand Lodge can be achieved in one day;

Be it therefore resolved that the annual communication of Grand Lodge be reduced to one day by amending Section 56 with the removal of Friday from the meeting date.

#### Existing Text:

**56. Annual Meetings – The place of holding the annual communication of Grand Lodge is the City of Saint John, and the time, the Friday preceding the second Saturday in May. Grand Lodge, by a majority vote at any annual communication, may fix upon any other place within the Province as the place at which the next annual session shall be held. Formal notice of motion must be given of a proposition to change the place of meeting and of the place to which the meeting is to be changed at least (60) days prior to the first day of the annual session. None but members of Grand Lodge shall be present at the communications without permission of the Grand Master or presiding officer.**

#### Proposed Amendment

**56. Annual Meetings – The place of holding the annual communication of Grand Lodge is the City of Saint John on the second Saturday in May. Grand Lodge, by a majority vote at any annual communication, may fix upon any other place within the province as the place at which the next annual session shall be held. Formal notice of motion must be given of a proposition to change the place of meeting and of the place to which the meeting is to be changed at least (60) days prior to the first day of the annual session. None but members of Grand Lodge shall be present at the communications without permission of the Grand Master or presiding officer.**

#### Rationale:

The purpose of this amendment is to have all necessary work of the annual communication held on Saturday. The Friday agenda is slated to be one hour and 45 minutes, this can be done on Saturday morning by not having a church parade. Certainly, the Brothers all attend their own churches with their families and do not need this service. With this amendment all the brothers attending can participate in all the activities of the day. In general with everyone in attendance for one day the Saturday attendance will be better.

and WHEREAS the Official Seal of each Lodge is sanctified by the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the following changes to Article 145 of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick Constitutions & Regulations be amended as follows:

Existing text:

**145. Dues Cards – A Lodge may, however, issue a card receipt for dues signed by its Secretary, bearing on the reverse side of the certificate, under the seal of Grand Lodge and hand of the Grand Secretary, that the Lodge is duly warranted and registered.**

Proposed Change:

**145. Dues Cards - A Lodge may, however, issue a card receipt for dues signed by its Secretary, under the seal of Grand Lodge, that the Lodge is duly warranted and registered.**

Rationale:

By sealing with the official stamp of the Lodge as sanctioned by the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, it is not necessary to have the Grand Secretary sign each individual Dues card.
