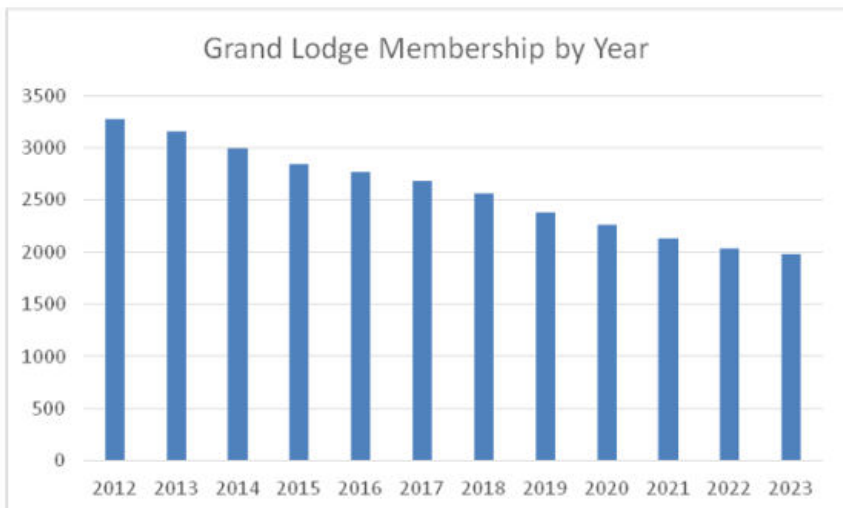

GRAND MASTER'S ADDRESS

To the Most Worshipful's, Right Worshipful's, Very Worshipful's, Worshipful Brethren, Distinguished Guests, and Brethren all, it's my pleasure to welcome you and offer warm fraternal greetings to our 157th Annual Communication of this "Grand Lodge of the Ancient and Honorable Fraternity of Free and Accepted Masons of New Brunswick".

To our Distinguished Visitors joining us this weekend thank you all. I hope your visit will and has been enjoyable and our hospitality to your satisfaction. To all the Concordant and Affiliated bodies of our jurisdiction I'm proud to be a member of all the Concordant bodies and support them as a member and the Most Worshipful Grand Master. I am happy you've joined us and offer my appreciation for the particular part your body provides to the enhancement of Freemasonry in our jurisdiction.

Memories

The memories that are important to remain with me the rest of my life are those smaller but significant life's happenings such as a particular person, a kind word spoken, a gesture, a chance meeting, unexpected appropriate conversation, spectacular view, etc. With that in mind I'll offer these examples from my term as Grand Master.

- I was made an honorary Past Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Nova Scotia with all the rights and privileges.

Necrology

Brethren, again this year we have been saddened by the loss of 55 Brethren who were called to the Celestial Lodge above. We remember our Brethren and their dedication to Freemasonry. To the families of our departed Brethren, we extend our heartfelt condolences. I have either sent my condolences as the MWGM, attended their Masonic Service, or attended the departed Brother's celebration of life ceremonies. The Grand Secretary will now read the names of our departed Brothers. We will now observe a moment of silence and a prayer by our Grand Chaplain. Their memories we will cherish in our hearts forever.

Visitations

During my first year in office, I was able to make the Official Craft Lodge and District Craft visits to 32 out of the 34 Lodges plus an unofficial visit to Cornerstone Lodge UD. I was warmly and fraternally greeted. I am proud of the WM, Officers, and Brethren of the Lodges in this Jurisdiction for all they do for our Fraternity, their fund raisers, and the education that was presented and the degree work on eligible candidates. Due to 2 late in the season snowstorms I was unable to do my official visit to Woodstock Lodge #11 and Templum Phoenix Lodge #57 and wasn't able to reschedule their visit before this Grand Lodge,

but I have an official visit planned to each of these lodges in the near future plus my visitation schedule I have planned out for my second term which looks quite similar to my calendar in my first term.

In my first year as Grand Master I was able to attend the annual communications of our sister jurisdictions of New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Quebec, Nova Scotia, PEI, GL of Canada in Province of Ontario, Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge in Windsor, Ontario, Newfoundland and Labrador, Massachusetts, and Maine. Again, I thank each and every one of them for the invitation, courtesies and hospitality shown to my wife and I that we received.

I also attended the annual communications of the following Concordant bodies: Grand Chapter of RAM of New Brunswick, Her Majesty Supreme Queen's Official visit to Nereides Temple #78, Grand Chapter OES, the Tri Province Inter-Provincial Day, and the Grand Chapter of RAM/Grand Council in Truro, Nova Scotia, as well as many Craft Lodge installations within our Jurisdiction.

All Canada Conference

In 2024 the All-Canada Conference was held in-house in Winnipeg on April 26th – 27th. With the GM MWB Albert McAllister in attendance, it marked the first time that all jurisdictions have been represented at the All-Canada Conference.

Meetings at the All-Canada Conference starts at 10:00 am on Friday morning and ends at 6:00 pm on Friday evening and then resumes at 9:00 am and concludes at 4:00 pm on Saturday.

The Jurisdictional Reports are given by the Grand Masters in attendance starting with yours truly the MWGM of NB. As this report on the All-Canada Conference would be pages long if written in detail,

MWB Laurie M Bishop, the MWGM of GLNB told those present he had appointed a new webmaster who had designed a new website. That the membership and long-term planning committee is now looking into different types of branding. Education papers are continually asked to be done in the lodges. That the Deputy Grand Secretary will be putting on a database training session for the lodge secretaries at the Friday morning session of Grand Lodge. That the Bikes for Book program is still being used in our jurisdiction. Also, the Veterans on a banner program is still in use. The electronic balloting system is still being used in our jurisdiction. That the MWGM put out a directive that veterans who are Brothers can wear their medals in lodge between the middle of October to the middle of November.

MWB Robert Dupal, the MWGM of Quebec told those present mostly everything that has been stolen from the break-in at the Grand Lodge of Quebec building has been recovered and the damaged paintings can be fixed. The locks have been changed and a new and improved alarm system has been installed. Two people have been arrested for the crime. MWB Robert Dupal indicated they restructured their GL; GM sends letter welcoming new members to the Fraternity; a new constitution; information is translated to members; and that they have 7 rituals.

I will summarize items discussed by some of the GM and or their DGM's for those GM's who had OMD (other Masonic duties) starting with the jurisdiction report for NB. I discussed things like my appointment of a new webmaster,

different types of branding that the GL membership and long-term planning committee is looking into for our jurisdiction, continued educational papers given at lodge meetings, the Friday morning lodge Secretaries course, bikes for books program, veterans banner program, my directive concerning the wearing of medals by our veterans who are lodge members from the middle of October to the middle of November to name a few.

The **MWGM of Newfoundland and Labrador** said that they had put out a membership directive.

RWB Will Leano, RWDGM of Alberta mentioned we should get to know the EA and their families to form a closer bond and fellowship and ask the EA's what they think the lodge is about as they go through their degree. We should concentrate on quality versus quantity and try to cover as much as possible for the entrance interview. He also spoke on why Masons demit (i.e., family matters, health, etc.). The GL of Alberta has a membership committee who process candidate applications. The lodges website is a critical tool in Edmonton to attract members. They have had a couple of cases of member suicides over the last few years. We should always try to be aware of mental/physical health and wellness as well as Alzheimer's. RWB Leano told those present that the GL of Alberta passed a motion to accept and recognize Prince Hall Mason's as long as they recognize regular lodge of the GL of Alberta. This is in the process, and they hope it happens in 2024. The 5-year plan should be a Grand Lodge plan and not a GM's plan. That the members should look at Brothers who have demitted 10-15 years ago – the Brethren may have demitted because of a young family, etc. It was suggested that we have approximately 50,000 members in Canada – if every Brother gave \$10 the Fraternity could donate to as special charity.

RWB Jamie Ireland, RWDGM of the Grand Lodge of Canada in the Province of Ontario mentioned that the GM & DGM have monthly virtual meetings with the GM's DDGM's, the GM had the Masonry Magazine re-established electronically; all lodge summonses are sent to the GM & DGM from all the lodges in the Jurisdiction. Your GM only receives about 4 out of 34 lodges +1 lodge UD, the committee has produced a branded business card that the Brethren can hand out to men whom they think might make a good member. I have asked for a copy of this card from the DGM of the Grand Lodge of Canada in the Province of Ontario. The GM also had a committee to establish an online masonic store. RWB Ireland said that their GL has an advertising campaign geared to 21-50 year old men and that annual fire inspection of lodges is done.

MWB Albert McAllister, the MWGM of PEI mentioned in his report that membership has been increasing for the first time in 50 years in his Jurisdiction. MWB McAllister has reestablished their masonic picnic for the first time in 3 years after the pandemic turned the world upside down. The GL of PEI will be 150 years old.

RWB Emad Bisharat, RWDGM of Manitoba who hopes to be elected Grand Master in May of 2024 and the host Province of the All-Canada Conference has told us the All-Canada Conference will mark its 150th anniversary in May of 2025 and are planning on having a Ladies Program attached to the All-Canada Conference that takes place on April 25 & 26 of 2025. RWB Emad Bisharat also mentioned in his report that the Brethren of Manitoba have provided transportation for cancer patients for over 35 years.

MWB Jonas Cossette, the MWGM of Saskatchewan mentioned that he has 44 lodges and 1790 masons within those lodges in a population of 1.25 million people. They also have problems with people from other countries who do not understand the culture of the Province versus their country resulting in some bullying/hazing practices.

MWB Arthur Smith, the MWGM of BC & Yukon told us that his theme for his term is “Freemasons helping Freemasons”. They have 6 steps to initiation which help prepare candidates for Freemasonry and also help with retention – it would be interesting to know how that process is measured. The GM feels that it is his job to shake the hands of every Brother. MWB Smith also said the only difference between you and me is the apron and that you put me there. He is having their website updated and improved to make it more user friendly. MWB Smith also mentioned that we need to look after our present members that we already have as well as get new members into our lodges. MWB Arthur Smith also mentioned that they had masonic stickers made up and have them posted on trailers and such to let the community know that Masons exist in their community and that they do good work.

All the brethren were asked to break into groups. The groups consisted of (1) GM’s and District Grand Masters, (2) DGM’s, (3) Grand Secretaries/Deputy Grand Secretaries, and (4) the Observers (SGW & JGW of SK, SGW of Manitoba. Sovereign Grand Commander – Scottish Rite, Grand Master of DeMolay of Canada, and JD – DeMolay of Canada.

From the **observers** group came the following thoughts from their group: (1) We need to learn from each other; (2) everyone seems to face the same challenges no matter where they come from; (3) communication is the key; (4) it is disappointing to think that bullying and hazing still exists; (5) comparing notes with your members in a group setting is vital; and (6) keep in mind the diversity in cultures and values of one another.

From the **Grand Secretaries** group came the following: (1) What’s the hurry in putting candidates through the 3 degrees. Get to know the petitioner. Many lodges in various jurisdictions may take a year to confer all 3 degrees on their candidates. Many lodges have within their by-laws that men who come from other places in the world must live within the Jurisdiction for a year before their petition can be considered and received. The Grand Secretaries would like to see someone come up with a common application form to be used across Canada.

From the **Deputy Grand Masters** group came the following: (1) visit the universities in your city to let the young men who we are as the young men could be the future of our fraternity; (2) more town hall meetings; (3) assist GM in the 5-year GL vision plan including measurable and specific goals; (4) follow up on degrees with lodge secretaries to make sure GL database is current and up-to-date.

From the **Grand Masters** group came the following: (1) mentor your successor and make sure he has a little fun so he doesn’t get stressed too much; (2) we should make sure things in our year get passed on if relevant to our successor; (3) try to help make our successor (s) year as good as it can be for him.

This is only but a small account of things presented by GM’s and/or DGM’s from Jurisdictions across Canada, I would strongly encourage this Grand Lodge and its elected Officers (ie: MWGM, DGM, and Grand Secretary) to continue to

support this Conference as it generates many great ideas and sometimes solutions to common problems.

NS Special Event: St Andrews Lodge in Nova Scotia will celebrate its 275th anniversary from July 12 – 19, 2025. All are welcome.

Future topics suggested for the All-Canada Conference moving forward are: (1) For the notice have a maple leaf in the top part of the compass instead of picture of a screw (2) the ownership and sale of lodge buildings; and (3) ethnic lodges (ex. only Brothers of that nationality can be members, but any Brother can visit the lodge).

The Grand Lodge of Manitoba will celebrate its 150th anniversary in April 2025 complete with a lady's program. A couple of thoughts for the Ladies is a tour of the Human Rights Museum as well as shopping for the Ladies.

The newly elected 2025 executive consists of: President: DGM RWB Patrick Davis – GL Sask.; VP DGM RWB Jamie Ireland – GL of Canada in the Province of Ontario; Treasurer PGM MWB Marc David - GL of Quebec; Secretary – MWB Chibu Uson – GL of Manitoba.

State of the Craft

Our membership numbers for 2023-2024 have shown a significant improvement in the decline of membership over 2022-2023. However, our suspension and demit numbers being indicators of dissatisfaction in lodges are much too high, in fact there really should be no suspension, with very few demits As we know we cannot do anything about the passing of our Brethren which. was significant over this past year.

The real downside of shrinking membership is having to deal with the cost of maintaining our buildings with fewer members to share the burden, which hits particularly hard the rural stand-alone lodges. One solution is to sell the building and rent space elsewhere in the community, not always easy for some lodges perhaps, but several in our jurisdiction have moved in that direction with great success.

On the positive side of this issue, Daylight Lodge UD formed a year before to operate under dispensation, was Consecrated, Dedicated, and had their officers installed last August, making them the newest Lodge in our jurisdiction. A great achievement we are particularly proud of, and the Lodge is doing exceptionally well.

Regarding communications. Several forms of social media are being used within the jurisdiction and serving well, that particular niche of our membership using them, however, there remains a need for a good data base system that would improve the efficiency and lessen the manual labor of both our Grand Lodge office and each of the Lodge secretaries. Interestingly we do have such a system built a few years ago by our Assistant Grand Secretary MWB Ches Piercey. This database program could serve our jurisdiction for years, however getting it fully implemented and used by all Lodge secretaries has been a challenge as there remain many Lodges slow to adapt to change. At Grand Lodge 2024 a training seminar is being put on for all lodge secretaries on Friday morning for training on how to use this database. It is hoped that all or most of the lodge secretaries will take part.

Good quality education might be best done in Lodge with shorter much condensed information such as can be had with “Short Talk Bulletins”. My vision is utilizing our own very capable brothers amongst us to prepare “Homegrown” Short talk Bulletins that suit our situation. I’ve spoken with several brothers about this and sensed excitement and enthusiasm for the idea. Of course, some work is needed before we can get this up and running, which would fit well, the role of our present education committee.

In the form of a formal directive for Lodges of the Jurisdiction of New Brunswick all Veterans are allowed to wear their military medals for the whole month of November for thanking them for their service.

Another issue causing concern is a carryover from 2016, that’s resurfaced now. A particular Lodge in 2016 surrendered their charter, placed their Lodge building for sale and affiliated with a nearby Lodge. The directors of the Lodge corporation at that time shared with the Lodge brethren the proceeds from the sale. This resulted in the expulsion of the members involved and one of the expelled members is now requesting reinstatement. Of course, there are requirements of our own Constitution that need clarification and it is unlikely a resolution on this file will be made before the new administration takes over at Grand Lodge.

This past year this administration has had the pleasure of rededication of the Moncton Masonic Building for its 100th year anniversary. Complete with a tour of the building in English and French as well as static displays set up by members of the York Rite, Scottish Rite, Order of the Eastern Star and Luxor Shriners. There were a couple of hundred residents that took the tour and there would have been many more except the storm hampered the festivities a wee bit. Recognizing a few lodges on milestones they’ve reached.

Along with the many Lodges doing their own benevolent deeds within their communities, we have several other groups and bodies making a difference with their particular deeds serving humanity, I’ll recognize those groups now.

- The New Brunswick Charities and Housing Company Ltd who’ve provided these past three decades financial assistance to aid children through support organizations such as the NB Division of the Canadian Cancer Society, Canadian Deaf Blind Rubella Association and the Saint John Regional Hospital’s Memorial Playground, The company is very active with Masons of New Brunswick with their significant contributions to fully fund Camp Goodtime, a summer camp for children living with cancer. If that were not enough, as mentioned earlier in this report, they operate the eight-unit seniors residential complex in St. Andrews.

- Luxor Shriners with their ladies continue their tireless effort of raising funds to provide free transportation to the Shrine Hospital in Montreal for the families with children requiring expert medical treatment suffering complex or chronic orthopedic issues.

- The Scottish Rite and the brethren of that body of Masonry continue funding and volunteering their time operating the Dyslexic Centre in Moncton for children dealing with learning disabilities.

- The officers and brethren of Woodstock Lodge #11 involve themselves by funding and operating a senior’s residential complex.

- The “Bikes for Books”, program designed to encourage elementary level children to improve reading skills and foster a love of reading, continues to do well with many Lodges in our province and PEI under RWB Tom Borthwick of St George Lodge #12. This year the number of bikes moving about has risen to

277 quite a feat considering the program was started (6) years ago after being introduced to this province from lodges in the states.

Masonic charges were laid by a member of the Inner Guard against a member of the Widows Sons. A former member of Alexandria Lodge #33 took his demit and now is an affiliated member of Hiram Lodge #6 in Fredericton. The WM of Alexandria Lodge #33 appointed a mediator who failed in his attempt to mediate the issue. I assigned a past GL DDGM to try to mediate so as not to go to a Masonic Trial which is still ongoing.

To the Most Worshipful the Grand Master, Members of Grand Lodge and Brethren

I am pleased to table this the 36th Annual Report of NB Masonic Charities & Housing Co for the year ending December 31,2032. A milestone for sure for the 'Brethren' of this Grand Jurisdiction who have been dedicated to the Purposes for which we were created, i.e. supporting children with childhood afflictions and Seniors whom we serve; those less fortunate among us. A very special thank you to all the Masons of New Brunswick and our extended family for your continued support; and to our Board of Directors as well, who give of their time and talents in support of the work of Masonic Charities. Thank you on behalf of the Children we support and the seniors we serve.

We'd like to give a special thank you to RWB Keith Burgess for all his years of service and dedication. Thank you for your good counsel in a year that saw significant change at the Board level and your many years service to Masonic Charities as President.

Also, we thank RWB Dusty Corey and WB Allison Pendleton for their terms as Director; they having withdrawn at the completion of their respective terms.

Charities

Camp Goodtimes - 2023 was held July 10-15th with Masons Day on the 15th and was well attended by Masons and their Spouses. Regrettably Camp registration declined again to about 26 and costs continued to escalate due to Minimum wage increases for Camp Staff and inflation. The Board is increasingly concerned with declining registrations and escalating costs.

On a positive note, we were able to fund our Children's charities in 2023 as follows: Camp Goodtimes \$45,000

Preliminary financial results for Charities suggest that we operated in Deficit again in 2023, to the extent of about \$29,000 (subject to Audit) due largely to fundraising short falls and the decision we made to establish a fully functioning Office site to facilitate records retention and communication among the Committee and outside third parties and serve as a point of contact for vendors and suppliers in the day to day operation of the facility.

Challenges ahead:

As we go into 2024 two major issues will need to be addressed by Masonic Charities:

1. Charting a path forward for Quinn House, given that the Operating Agreement with NB Housing expired in March 2024 which has been extended to Dec31st, 2024 (and with that the operating subsidy of \$2.400 monthly, implied

there-in)

2. Revitalizing the Board by filling vacancies and restructuring Committees, including the Executive, so as to address emerging issues with a focus on our primary objectives, Children's charities and Senior's housing.

REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

To: The Most Worshipful the Grand Master, Officers and Members of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, F. & A.M.

Our 2023 Consolidated Statement of Income shows a bottom-line deficit of \$20,793. The per capita dues increase from \$41.00 to \$45.00 in effect for 2023, helped offset some of the decline in membership, however dues revenue at \$89,235 for the year was still \$3,000 below budget. We are aware that a good number of new candidates are proceeding through the initiation process and we hope this will slow the overall decline significantly. However, while we try to maintain our expense budget in the \$120,000 to \$125,000 range, it appears that we will need a further increase in per capita to offset the decline in membership.

Investment income at \$16,351 was slightly better than our budget of \$14,400. However, after adjustment of our portfolios in weak markets, we recorded losses of \$2,693 on sale of investments versus a budget of \$10,000 in gains. With interest rates significantly increased in recent years, we will be moving our portfolios more toward income producing products in an effort to stabilize our annual investment income.

Expenses for the year at \$130,711 were \$10,000 above budget primarily due to an \$9,000 excess in Grand Lodge Communication expense. Office and administrative expenses continue to be well controlled and we are budgeting only minor increases over 2023 to bring in total expenses at \$126,000 for 2024. Overall, we would expect to see a near breakeven bottom line in operations for the current year.

Our Investment Portfolios still account for 90% of our total assets. Throughout the year we stayed with our long-range investment strategy of 60% equities and 40% cash and income products. Since year end, we have fully converted our Benevolent Fund Portfolio to cash and fixed income products. This should ensure that we meet our annual \$10,000 Bursary commitment from income rather than encroaching on principal, at least for the next few years.

I want to thank all members of the Finance Committee who have continued to provide good support throughout the year. Specifically, I want to thank Gordon Thorne and Richard Burpee who have retired from the committee after many years of committed service and sound advice.

REPORT OF THE GRAND HISTORIAN

To: The Most Worshipful the Grand Master, Officers and Members of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, F. & A.M.

Archives: As approved by the Board of General Purposes in 2022, this Grand Lodge has developed a relationship with the Provincial Archives in Fredericton whereby our records can be categorized and stored in climate-controlled conditions. Cataloging our records stored in their facilities is a first step and are found under [[Masonic Lodge collection](#)]. The software used for this provides easy access for retrieval. Current documents are defined as anything under twenty years old; these are kept on site in the Grand Lodge office in Saint John. Likewise, we hold confidential materials of any age in our own facilities.

The catalog of documents and record books, etc. extends to over 100 pages. It can be printed at any time; however, such an extensive collection is easier searched with computer software.

Cataloging and documentation takes time, and so far, we have not turned to digitizing our archived materials. On the other hand, St. George #12 obtained funding from the Autism Society to fund a student to do this. St. George consequently has been the first to have their records mostly available in digital format. Grand Lodge has added funding to the budget this year for a summer student to work at PANB cataloging and digitizing our submissions.

Subordinate Lodges: Many lodges throughout the jurisdiction have been visited, usually accompanying the Grand Master in his official visits. Interest in archiving records has been followed by action in several cases. Any lodge wishing to pursue this can do so directly or through the grand lodge office.

Library: The library in the offices of Grand Lodge is under review. Emphasis has been placed on identifying books and articles online that brethren can download without cost, and several are available via the website.

Masonic History: The history of the fraternity in New Brunswick holds numerous characters, both major and minor, worthy of remembrance; and not just the past grand masters, although each one of them certainly deserves a page, and over the past year many of our living past grand masters have been recorded in video. This program will continue. Other past grand masters, as well as several individuals who did not seek elective office, were extraordinary men, who made significant contributions to their communities as well as to the fraternity. Documenting their lives is part of our work, even as we try to record the history being made year on year. The mason selected for further study in 2022-23 was Rev. Nicolo Franchetti (1878-1980). His biography will be published on the website. The mason currently being studied: MWB James Vroom.

REPORT OF THE RITUAL COMMITTEE

To: The Most Worshipful The Grand Master, Officers and Members of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, F & A.M.

The Ritual Committee was presented with a couple of requests:

The Sign of Fidelity:

The Sign of Fidelity, although not a clandestine aspect of Masonry, is a gesture of respect commonly used within Freemasonry. This sign is permissible during occasions attended by non-Masons, such as semi-public installations and Masonic Funerals. However, the concluding directive in our ritual book specifies that it should not be used in a banquet hall. The question arises: What distinguishes the Sign of Fidelity from the offering of a prayer of thanksgiving or grace to deity in a banquet hall? The consensus among the committee members is to support the removal of the phrase "SHALL NOT BE GIVEN AT BANQUET TABLE" from the ritual book. The feedback we provided was presented at the Board of General Purpose, and we garnered support to bring it to a vote at Grand Lodge.

Coded Ritual Book:

The committee was queried regarding their stance on endorsing the development of a coded ritual book and its potential availability online. Prior to posing the question, the Brother proposing the idea expressed confidence in their ability to create the coded book, emphasizing its intended purpose of facilitating learning and aiding in the retention of memory work. Feedback among committee members was predominantly positive, particularly from those who had previously utilized coded materials for learning purposes. However, there were reservations about making it accessible online. Some members questioned whether the online availability of such a resource would be appropriate, given that Masonic Rituals are already easily accessible via a simple Google search. Consequently, the consensus leaned towards the belief that having a coded resource online wouldn't diminish the accessibility of existing materials found online from other sources. The most recent coded ritual book is the 13th Edition. Approval was given to develop a coded rendition of the 14th Edition. Additionally, permission was granted for sharing it online with fellow Brothers, under the condition that it is hosted on a password-protected website accessible exclusively to members.

Updated Officer's Manual:

While the Officer's Manual undergoes yearly updates to reflect changes in Lodges, memberships, and the Constitution, it's noteworthy that the original version underwent its last major overhaul in 1993. A group of Brothers in District 2 had initiated the development of an updated version of the Officer's Manual. This revised edition aimed to incorporate a brief history of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick. Additionally, it included relevant sections of the Constitution that were frequently referenced for decision-making purposes.

Upon submission to the Ritual Committee, it became the committee's responsibility to verify the accuracy of the information, cross-reference it with the current Officer's Manual and Constitution, and subsequently format the document. The aim was to ensure that it is not only suitable for online presentation but also printable in booklet format.

Despite the increased length of the updated Officer's Manual, the inclusion of additional information, already present in other official documents, serves to

consolidate essential resources. This single document aids officers in comprehending their roles and the rationale behind specific procedures. The convenience of accessing a booklet stored in an apron case is expected to render it an invaluable tool for officers.

Apart from all members of the Ritual Committee, the completed draft copy of the Officer's Manual was also shared with all members of the Board of General Purpose for review, recommendations, and approval. After receiving feedback and recommendations, final edits were implemented, leading to the approval of the Officer's Manual in April 2024.

REPORT OF THE TRAINING, EDUCATION AND MENTORSHIP COMMITTEE

To: The Most Worshipful The Grand Master, Officers and Members of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, F & A.M.

Education Committee

It was noted that the “recommended reading” list has been removed from the Grand lodge site. This list provided a list of literature that Brothers had read and reviewed and allowed Brothers looking to purchase books to form an opinion prior to purchase. It was intended to add further to this list, and I have had quite a few brothers enquiring where it went.

It is recommended that this list be reinstated to allow Brothers the option to purchase literature for self education.

The Education currently available on the GLNB site is still includes:

- Various Quizzes
- Reading resources
- Submitted lectures / papers.

The Committee was successful in its efforts to secure access to the Ashlar College training programmes. Details can be found at – www.ashlarcollege.ca If it is agreeable to the Board of general Purposes **it is recommended that details of this course are made available in the Education section of the GLNB website.**

Officer Manual – previously gave feedback to the draft, once the Ritual committee has ratified this, then the education committee can start to work to devel-

op training materials and course delivery if required.

The education Committee has the following Currently Available Courses at its disposal: *(These differ to the on-line, they are more extensive since are designed to be instructor lead programs)* - Lodge Mentor & Mentoring; Worshipful Master; D.D.G.M.

With Reference to GLNB creating a position of Grand Lecturer. This will require a notice of Motion to be drafted, prior to submission for Vote at a subsequent Grand Lodge meeting. Rather than make that notice of Motion in May, it is proposed to canvas the Brothers informally to see if such a role would prove useful to the fraternity. The proposal would be that this role head the Education committee as well as co-ordinate training initiatives in NB and deliver lectures as required by MWGM. **The BoGP is asked to consider if this approach should be continued.**

One outstanding Recommendation that the Board of General Purposes may wish to have the education committee work on:

GLNB Mentorship programme is still not being utilized to its full capability throughout the province. It is recommended that an Education session for Lodge Mentors (and those who wish to become Lodge Mentors) be developed and run. A training session was successfully run a few years ago which some members of the committee delivered, it is felt that this could be revamped and delivered again easily.

REPORT OF THE MEMBERSHIP AND LONG TERM PLANNING COMMITTEE

To: The Most Worshipful The Grand Master, Officers and Members of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, F & A.M.

The membership and Long-Term Planning Committee meets every second month and discuss initiatives to be potentially made available for general Lodge use. The goal of each is to help identify what makes new members interested in joining a Masonic Lodge, how to best support these new members through their degrees, and how to keep them engaged post third degree. We feel that each of these three phases is critical to the long-term journey of a Mason and as such, to the long-term viability of a Lodge.

Identify what is working well:

It is felt by the committee that when it comes to Masonic membership, quality is more important than quantity, and as such our initial focus has been on efforts to encourage engagement and retention.

To better understand the current state of membership in New Brunswick, more data from the individual Lodges is required. Presently Grand Lodge collects data from each Lodge at year end. While this helps illustrate certain trends in membership, it does not provide any context around retention and engagement.

Proposed solution: In addition to the information presently collected by Grand Lodge, we recommend also having Lodges provide the following information: Number of new masons joined, number of masons who joined in the last 5 years who are still active, number of masons who joined in the last 5 years who are an active office (or make other regular contributions to the Lodge). This would allow us over time to identify the Lodges in the jurisdiction that excel at maintaining engagement over time and enable us to leverage their best practices.

Additionally, the committee is looking to add additional members to include representation from a greater base throughout the province and thereby increasing the input received from a greater portion of the more active Lodges.

Furthermore, research will be conducted into other Masonic jurisdictions to further identify best practices that drive engagement and retention.

Grand Lodge Public relations and promotion:

A Lodge in our jurisdiction had reached out to Grand Lodge asking if any promotional materials were available that could be used at a local fair (branded easy up, banners, flags), Upon review, while Grand Lodge presently does not maintain such materials, the request was referred to the Membership and Long Term Planning committee to assess the possibility.

Recommendation: Upon review, it is recommended by the committee that it would be beneficial to have Masonry represented at events such as local fairs and public fundraising events. Additionally, Lodge activities could all benefit from having promotional materials being made available.

The committee recommends that the Grand Lodge purchase a branded Easy-up tent and banner to be held at the grand Lodge in Saint John and be made available to local Lodges to sign out. These materials would assist individual Lodges create more visibility for our fraternity at events that they would in attendance at. If approved, the committee will get quotes and submit them to Grand Lodge for approval. Additionally, should approval be given to proceed, the committee recommends that guidelines be put into place regarding public interactions.

Branding and GLNB:

Additionally, the Most Worshipful, the Grand Master Bishop asked the Membership and Long-Term Planning Committee, to review the topic of Branding for the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick and report.

A preliminary on branding in relation to the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick was presented to the Board of General Purpose at the February 22, 2024, meeting for review. (See Attached) Additional research into the subject is ongoing and looks promising as an avenue for public relations.

Branding and GLNB – Preliminary Report February 22, 2024

MWB Laurie M Bishop asked the Membership and Long-Term Planning Committee, to review the topic of Branding for the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick. Below please find some points for review on the subject:

Why is it important to brand?

Regardless of size, organizations of all kinds need to invest in branding to stay relevant. Our Grand Lodge should recognize the importance of a Brand Identity and how it can directly establish the sense of value and strength of an organization. The Grand Lodge of A.F. & A.M. of Canada in the Province of Ontario has done extensive research into branding and have instituted a standardized branding policy and approach.

The use of uniform Brand Identity and Standards, distinguished by a strongly recognized Symbol, and highly identifiable with the Freemasons of our jurisdiction would be an initial proposal. Such as the Square and Compasses which is already known in New Brunswick.

Distinguish your organization from competitors.

With the number of other organizations competing for peoples time, standing out can be challenging. Branding would allow the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick (GLNB) to share our values, story, brand promise, and other assets through which to highlight Masonry's' uniqueness. Leveraging on these to create a point of difference to set the organization apart.

In aid of this, the Scottish Rite, Northern Masonic Jurisdiction have created the “**Not Just a Man. A Mason**” marketing campaign which is available, free of charge and has been used by many jurisdictions throughout North America. This has already in part been incorporated into our new Grand Lodge website.

Becoming more recognizable.

Another benefit of investing in a consistent branding effort, is to make Masonry in New Brunswick more memorable. When people can clearly identify our organization based on physical, visual, and auditory elements, it breeds familiarity. This fosters trust, which draws potential new members.

Build Increased Member loyalty.

Consistent branding helps deliver unique experiences and messaging to potential members as it allows them to form a bond. With this emotional connection, our members continue to support the organization and share their positive experiences. This can lead to more referrals through word of mouth.

Steps for Branding:

1. Identify your audience

The first step for branding is to understand who our potential members are.

Analyze current membership base.

The existing membership know what is impressive or lacking in our organization. Discover their interests and needs. What would members love to see in our brand?

Engage membership directly through calls, surveys, or studies.

Conduct market research.

Market research can help uncover opportunities and have conversa-

tions about Masonry. Also, it is an effective way to gather information on other organizations which we would be completing.

2. Create your Brand Promise

Your brand promise is more than a tagline or a slogan. It describes what GLNB and Masonry in New Brunswick stands for.

What does your perfect member *really* want?

How does Masonry provide this?

What factors motivate members to join?

Why does your existing membership choose to belong?

Answers to these questions can communicate benefits of membership, what GLNB intends to deliver, and why potential members should choose to join.

(Stick to the truth with no unnecessary hype.)

3. Determine GLNB mission and core values

Why become a Mason? We need to answer this question.

Describe the purpose of Masonry, who the membership is, the services we render, and how we do it. Summarize this in a few words to make it memorable.

Describe Core values. They are principles that drive our organization goals, mission, and vision. These beliefs shape Masonry, which then influences potential members.

Being specific, using our members' own words, we can ensure the entire organization embodies these principles.

4. Define your brand personality

Your brand personality, just like that of an individual's, is a combination of qualities that our organization exhibits. Ideally, these characteristics will attract people to Masonry and shape their perceptions.

Therefore, a personality that resonates with your membership could help you build an emotional connection and help us stand out.

What qualities do we love to associate with our brand? Do you want to be seen as visionary, competent, or charismatic?

5. Create brand assets

Choose the elements that will identify our organization. Some examples are colors, fonts, packaging, slogan, and your logo. Certain colors evoke specific emotions and convey meanings. Ensure that it is distinctive and easily recognizable.

6. Be consistent

From the website to social media channels and offline interactions with membership, branding must be consistent. Create brand guidelines to reinforce cohesiveness. Our membership should know what to expect or feel once they see our content, logos, or other brand assets. Consistency builds familiarity, trust, and loyalty. These feelings reflect successful branding and attract new members.

Branding focusses on presenting a consistent face to the public. In doing so, we should be able to build a greater sense of community, in which Masonry is recognizable to all. By increasing the public's awareness of the "Good Works" done by our brethren, we have the potential of adding to our numbers. By building on the success of Lodges in New Brunswick that already have maximized

public engagement, GLNB could see vast increases in potential membership.

REPORT OF THE WARRANTS COMMITTEE

To: The Most Worshipful The Grand Master, Officers and Members of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, F & A.M.

Existing Lodges:

There has been no change in the status of the existing 34 active lodges within the jurisdiction for the year ending December 31,2023.

Formation of a new Lodge:

In accordance with Article 83 of the Constitution of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick a petition was submitted to the Grand Master requesting the creation of a warrant for a new Lodge - Cornerstone Lodge. On December 16,2022 M.W.G.M. Thomas C. Borthwick approved this petition with the granting of a dispensation authorizing the brethren to meet as a lodge until a Warrant of Constitution shall be granted.

The Seven Masons submitting the petition, on receiving approval and maintaining a commitment to the principles of Freemasonry reflected in the Antient Charges, Landmarks, Constitution and Ritual of Grand Lodge diligently began a process of determining operational considerations that were of importance to them. This lodge located in Moncton will operate as a daylight lodge and meet bi-monthly on Saturday mornings with a focus on educational content, group discussions, guest speakers and debate. Cornerstone Lodge UD held their inaugural meeting on April 8, 2023 and recently completed their 6th meeting on March,23, 2024.

REPORT OF THE AD HOC COMMITTEE

To: The Most Worshipful The Grand Master, Officers and Members of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, F & A.M.

This year, the Ad Hoc committee was given the responsibility to be involved in the design, build, implementation, and ongoing maintenance of the Grand Lodge's new and improved website project. On my own initiative, I constructed a working prototype of a new website for Grand Lodge and had this prototype presented to Grand Lodge. Grand Lodge accepted my proposal to construct a new and improved website to replace the existing one.

The new design reflects the overall Masonic Brand and assists in the promotion of Freemasonry in New Brunswick. It provides a channel for new potentials to reach out and contact Grand Lodge for more information. This design started with a new Domain Name to reflect the purpose of the website: <https://discovermasonrynb.online> and the inclusion of marketing material on the front page of the website. It was also important to include a channel to allow new potentials to easily contact us. If a potential submits a More Information Request form, that request is sent to the Office of The Grand Secretary, that request is then forwarded to the appropriate DDGM for processing.

A further intent of this project was to mount a "Discover Masonry in New Brunswick" style marketing campaign to grow Freemasonry in New Brunswick. As a first step, the rebranded Grand Lodge of New Brunswick website will use print and digital resources for web/social media outreach and professionally produced video. This digital content was supplied free of charge from Scottish Rite, Northern Masonic Jurisdiction's "Not Just a Man. A Mason." marketing campaign. Currently several other Canadian Grand Lodges have already adopted this approach. (ON., NL., BCY). The follow-on activities would entail using the digital assets to further communicate the Masonic brand.

This project has three main driving purposes or principles:

- To educate new potential candidates and provide them the mechanism to be able to ask for more information.
- To provide existing New Brunswick Masons with key GLNB online informational assets and functionalities.
- To have an overall website design that minimizes the need for maintenance.

The Scottish Rite Northern Masonic Jurisdiction had initiated "A Campaign to Grow Freemasonry". They created the "Not Just a Man. A Mason." marketing campaign to help our entire North American Masonic family, free of charge. We can find traditional print and digital resources for our web/social media outreach and professionally produced video. (<https://scottishritenmj.org/njam>) This material includes a brand style guideline, and our new website follows it. The video on the front page of the new GLNB website is an example of SRNMJ digital media as well as the slider images at the top.

As part of an overall marketing campaign the video "Even Better, Not Just a Man, a Mason" (30 seconds) video can be used in commercial advertising. The Grand Lodge of New York has been running advertisements in movie theatres with much success. Their advertising has been driving many new potential candidates' inquiries. The Grand Lodge of New Jersey had run a single quarter page ad in the New York Times that generated more than 600 new potential

candidate’s inquiries from that one ad. The “Even Better” video can be used in that context to run “masonic” ads in New Brunswick Cineplex theatres The theatre clients consist of a large segment of male 21 to 40 years of age who are within our target demographic. The main purpose of the “Even Better” video is to drive traffic to the new GLNB website.

The GLNB website project had a Go Live Date of December 22, 2023, and was made available to all at that point.

Results of Newly added website functionality - Progress to Date March 31st

The new “More Information” forms allow new potential petitioners the ability to ask Grand Lodge for more information on Freemasonry.

The new website is using the **WordPress Wordfence** firewall and security scanner.

The number of successful brute force attacks on the new website -**ZERO**

On March 27th at 7:18 pm a hacker group initiated a brute force attack on discovermasonrynb.online. A brute force attack is just an automated hacker group trying to gain access by trying a massive list of passwords. For the next 117 minutes (< 2 hours) a single hacker group attempted to log into the admin console of the website unsuccessfully 472 times. This is a new login attempt every 15 seconds. These attempts originated from 129 different countries. The hackers were using two usernames which were invalid for our website. Each failed login generates a security alert email, which alerted me to the issue (472 emails). To completely block the hackers from trying to login with one of the two invalid usernames, I updated the firewall to block the use of those usernames. If the

hackers can gain access to the website, they can use it to send out spam emails or install ransomware on it. Even with unsuccessful login attempts, if the attempts continue for a long enough period, it can overwhelm the webserver and keep legitimate users out of the site. It effectively brings down the website. This attack was disturbing to me as I personally have never witnessed one before in my 32 years of IT experience.

I enjoyed my participation in this phase of the initiative and look forward to the rollout of additional phases of this overall project and commit my ongoing technical support of the new website.
