


Pursuant to a summons issued by order of the Most Worshipful the Grand Master an Especial Communication of "The Grand Lodge of the Antient and Honourable Fraternity of Free and Accepted Masons of New Brunswick" was held in Freemasons Hall, Germain Street, in the City of Saint John, on Sunday afternoon, the 28th day of July, A. L. 5912, at 2.30 of the clock.

Grand Lodge was opened in *ample* form at 2.30 o'clock.

The M. W. Grand Master briefly stated that he had called this Communication for the purpose of having Grand Lodge and the Brethren of the City Lodges attend Divine Service in Trinity Church.

Owing to the absence in England of the Very Worshipful Grand Chaplain during the earlier part of the summer,

this service had been deferred until to-day, the first Sunday following his return.

A procession of the City Lodges and of the officers and members of Grand Lodge was then formed by the Grand Director of Ceremonies. The route to Trinity Church was by way of Germain, Union, Charlotte, Duke and Germain Streets.

The service was conducted by the Very Worshipful Grand Chaplain, the Reverend R. A. Armstrong, Rector of Trinity Church. The Grand Chaplain also preached.



Grand Lodge was opened in *ample* form at the hour of three of the clock.

The V. W. Grand Chaplain offered the following Special Prayer:

"Almighty and Eternal God, Great Architect and Ruler of the Universe, we, the frail creatures of Thy hand, yet made in Thine image, humbly beseech Thee to pour down upon this convocation assembled in Thy Holy Name the continual dew of Thy blessing. We thank Thee for Thy many mercies vouchsafed to us since last we met in Grand Lodge, and we pray that Thy Holy Spirit may be with us in our present Convention, that Unity, Concord, Charity and Good Will may prevail in all our deliberations and that we may here improve ourselves in Masonry to the glory of Thy Holy Name, the welfare of our fellowmen and the development of eternal character in ourselves. Amen."

The Brethren then joined with the Grand Chaplain in the reading of the 24th Psalm.

The M. W. Grand Master directed the Grand Pursuivant to admit Master Masons as visitors if in good standing and properly clothed.

It was resolved on motion of R. W. Brothers The Hon. John V. Ellis, P. G. M., and Andrew McNichol, P. D. G. M., "That the Minutes of the last Annual Communication having already been printed in the Proceedings of the past year, be taken as read and confirmed."

Also on like motion it was resolved, "That the Minutes of the Special Communication in connection with the Masonic Service at Trinity Church, Saint John, on Sunday the 28th day of July last, be taken as read and confirmed."

It was announced by the M. W. Grand Master that the Credential Committee would report at the evening session.

The M. W. Grand Master then delivered the following address:

GRAND MASTER'S ADDRESS.

Brethren of Grand Lodge:

Though it seems but a brief period since we last met in Grand Lodge, yet another year has been added to the history of Masonry in this jurisdiction—a year filled with its cares and responsibilities, its joys and pleasures—and once more I stand before you to give an account of my stewardship and extend to you a cordial and fraternal welcome to this the Forty-Fifth Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick.

We have met here to-day to pass in review the events of the past year and to adopt measures for the future, and it is my earnest desire that a spirit of true brotherly love may characterize all our deliberations, that we may strive to promote the highest good of our beloved Order, and that the results attained may be for the advancement of the Craft throughout this Grand Jurisdiction. This can only be done, my brothers, by continually keeping before us the importance of our mission, and by fostering in our hearts the cardinal principles on which our institution is based.

I am pleased to report to you that the utmost harmony has prevailed throughout the entire jurisdiction,

and though minor differences may have at times existed in some quarters, yet these differences have been adjusted by common sense and true Masonry without reference to the Grand Master.

You will also be pleased to learn that our relations with those Grand Lodges with which we are in fraternal correspondence continue to be most harmonious and pleasant, while the continued prosperity of the great British Empire, to which we are so proud to belong, must fill us all with a profound sense of gratitude to the Great Architect of the Universe.

As a proof that greater interest is shown in our Order, I am able to report a substantial increase in our membership. In many of the Subordinate Lodges there has been unusual activity throughout the past year and the increase in our numbers has been considerable. But, my brothers, I feel it necessary to remind you again that it is the internal not the external qualifications that recommend a man to be made a Mason. Let the standard of character for admission into our beloved fraternity be raised as high as possible and the outer door be guarded with the utmost vigilance. Let every man know that, when he is once admitted, he must demean himself in such a way that no reproach can be brought upon the Craft through any action of his.

OUR FRATERNAL DEAD.

Many changes have taken place since our last Annual Communication, and the pleasure that we experience in meeting to-day is tinged with a feeling of sadness as we reflect that several members of this Grand Lodge, whose presence has often added to the enjoyment of the sessions, can no longer meet with us. They have been claimed by the silent hand of Death. Friends and brothers have performed the last sad rites over their graves, and all that

we can now do is to cherish their memory and emulate whatever was noble and worthy in the lives of each. But, my brethren, may it not be true, as one of our greatest poets has expressed it, that—"there is no death, what seems so, is transition."

"There is no death! The stars go down
To rise upon some fairer shore;
And bright in Heaven's jewelled crown
They shine for evermore.

And ever near us, though unseen,
The dear immortal spirits tread;
For all the boundless Universe
Is life—there are no dead."

Hiram Lodge, No. 6, mourns the loss of one of its oldest Past Masters. Shortly after the opening of the new year, R. W. Brother Harry Beckwith passed to his rest and was buried with Masonic honours January 4, 1912. Brother Beckwith was initiated in Solomon's Lodge at Fredericton, September 5, 1865, was elected Worshipful Master of that Lodge in 1870, and after the amalgamation of Solomon and Saint Andrew's Lodges became Master of Hiram Lodge in 1882. He was elected Deputy Grand Master of this Grand Lodge in 1886, and for several years was the Representative of the Grand Lodge of Mississippi at the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick. Brother Beckwith bore the suffering of his last illness, which was constant and severe, with great fortitude and without murmuring. He was an earnest Mason and made many friends among the Craft and in the community where the greater part of his life was spent, because he possessed a warm and generous heart.

Lebanon Lodge sincerely mourns the loss of a distinguished Past Master, R. W. Brother Daniel Jordan, who died at Sackville, June 3, 1912. Brother Jordan first

received light in Masonry in Albion Lodge, of which he was an active member for several years. After removing from St. John to Fredericton, he affiliated with Hiram Lodge May 3, 1883, and became its Worshipful Master in 1888. He frequently attended the Communications of Grand Lodge and was elected Junior Grand Warden in 1891. A few years later he took up his residence in Sackville, and largely through his efforts the warrant of Lebanon Lodge, which had been surrendered in 1894, was restored in 1901. He was elected Master of Lebanon in that year and also for the next three years, retiring from office in 1904. By his zeal, thoroughness, and love of Freemasonry he proved a source of inspiration to all the other members of Lebanon Lodge, and there can be no doubt that his devotion to its interests helped largely to bring this Lodge to its present splendid condition. During the last few years the delicate state of Brother Jordan's health prevented him from regularly attending the meetings of his Lodge, but he still maintained a deep interest in its welfare, and his advice was often sought by the members, who placed very great confidence in his judgment and accurate knowledge of Masonry. Not only in New Brunswick, but also in the sister Province of Nova Scotia, was Brother Jordan regarded as an accurate ritualist, and his work was greatly admired for its correct and finished style. He will be much missed, not only by the brethren of his own Lodge, but also by the members of the Craft throughout the entire jurisdiction.

With sincere regret we to-day mourn the loss of R. W. Brother Isaac W. Doherty, M. D., who died at Rexton, September 4, 1911, after a very brief illness. He seldom missed the sessions of Grand Lodge when it was possible for him to be present, and had endeared himself to us all by his genial presence and courteous manners. Dr. Doherty was born in Kent County in 1831, and at the time of his

death was probably the oldest resident registered physician in the Province. He received his M. M. Degree in Keith Lodge, Moncton, in 1858, and on moving to Rexton affiliated with Lodge St. Andrew, No. 16, at Richibucto, at that time under the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of Scotland. He was the oldest Past Master of his Lodge, and so highly was he esteemed by his brethren that, on the occasion of the celebration of his golden wedding, August 26, 1904, they presented him with an address testifying in eloquent language to their admiration for him as a Mason and their respect for him as a man. At the regular communication of Grand Lodge, August, 1900, the rank and dignity of Past Deputy Grand Master was, on motion of P. G. M. John V. Ellis, conferred upon Brother Doherty for his long and faithful service in connection with the Craft. Brother Doherty was one of the best known men in the County of Kent, and was deservedly popular on account of his warm-hearted, sympathetic nature and manly qualities, and it may be truly said of him that he bound his friends to him, "grappling them with hoops of steel." He was buried with Masonic honours, and his remains lie interred in the Presbyterian cemetery at Rexton. In his will he expressed a wish that his Grand Lodge apron be presented as a gift to the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, and I am sure it will be accepted as a striking proof of his zeal for the Craft, and as the last tribute of a brother of whom it can well be said that, "taking him for all in all, we shall not soon see his like again." In peace he rests from his labours.

Hibernia Lodge, No. 3, sincerely mourns the loss of one of its oldest Past Masters, W. Brother George K. Cochran, who died very suddenly at Marysville, May 15, 1912. Brother Cochran received his M. M. Degree, May 29, 1878, and had been a Mason for thirty-four years. He was Master of Hibernia in 1898, and was a very active

member of that Lodge until he removed to Marysville about ten years ago. He was of a retiring disposition but was much beloved by his brother Masons on account of his warm and generous nature, and his readiness to lend a helping hand to those who needed assistance. His brethren laid him to rest with Masonic honours in Fernhill cemetery, Saint John. After life's fitful fever he sleeps peacefully.

W. Brother Benjamin Kilburn, a Past Master of Benjamin Lodge, died at his home in Victoria County, June 26, 1912. Brother Kilburn had been a member of Benjamin Lodge for upwards of thirty years and was very much devoted to the interests of that Lodge. Prior to the time of his last illness which was lingering and severe, he was a faithful attendant at all the Communications of the Lodge and was ever foremost in promoting what made for the general welfare of the Lodge and its members. He was a good citizen and gained the confidence and esteem of his fellow-men. His brethren laid him to rest with Masonic honours.

By the death of W. Brother Williams Woodworth, Howard Lodge loses its oldest Past Master. Brother Woodworth had been an active member of his Lodge for nearly fifty years, and had also acted as Secretary for eighteen years. He was a very regular attendant at his Lodge and ever active in promoting its welfare and interests. He was a good citizen and in his intercourse with his fellow-men always exemplified the principles of Freemasonry. His love for the Masonic order was constant and sincere, and his memory will long be cherished by the members of Howard Lodge.

VISITS TO LODGES.

The time at my disposal did not permit me to make as many visits to the private Lodges as I had proposed. I regret this exceedingly, but I trust the brethren in several

of the Lodges which I had expected to visit, will take the will for the deed, and that my successor in office will, at an early date, undertake the work that I failed to do. In all the Lodges which were visited I found the ritual well maintained and an evident desire on the part of the officers of each Lodge to be as perfect in the work as possible.

My first official visit was made to Moncton, Friday, October 13, 1911, for the purpose of consecration and dedicating Tweedie Lodge, No. 41, which had been working under a dispensation since May 12, 1911. On this visit I was accompanied from Saint John by R. W. Brother Thos. Walker, M.D., Past Grand Master, R. W. Brother Melvin L. Young, M.D., D. G. M., R. W. Brother Percy W. Wetmore, S. G. W., R. W. Brother J. Twining Hartt, Grand Secretary, W. Brother Chas. D. Jones, G. D. of C., W. Brother Fred. H. Hartt, Assistant G. D. of C., and Brother D. Arnold Fox, Grand Organist. In the evening of October 13, Tweedie Lodge was consecrated according to ancient usage and the custom of the Craft, the Grand Officers being assisted by several of the brethren of Keith Lodge, No. 23, viz., R. W. Brother George Ackman, as J. G. W., R. W. Brother George R. Sangster, as G. Treasurer, W. Brother B. E. Smith, as S. G. Deacon, W. Brother F. P. Forbes, as J. G. Deacon, W. Brother George H. Pick, as G. Pursuivant. There was a large number of members present from Keith Lodge as well as many from the neighboring towns of Sackville and Dorchester. After the ceremony of consecration had been performed, I had the pleasure of installing Brother Frederic W. Emmerson as Master, and also the other officers of the Lodge. On the conclusion of the work of installation the brethren present were briefly addressed both by Past Grand Master Walker and myself, and reference was made to the splendid character of the man whose name the new Lodge bears as well as to his services in the cause of Masonry in Moncton.

Following this those present enjoyed the sumptuous lunch provided by the members of Tweedie Lodge, after which the Worshipful Master called upon the following brethren for addresses—R. W. Brother Dr. M. L. Young, D. G. M., R. W. Brother Geo. Ackman, P. D. G. M., Brother the Rev. W. G. Lane. The speeches of each of these brethren were excellent and full of the true Masonic spirit. Tweedie Lodge starts with a fair membership and a good staff of officers and should have a bright and prosperous future. During our stay in Moncton, we were very much indebted to Brother Sangster for his kindness in giving us a drive to that part of the neighboring County of Albert now famous for its oil wells and natural gas.

On the evening of November 2, 1911, accompanied by R. W. Brother Melvin L. Young, M.D., D. G. M., and a full corps of Grand Lodge officers, I visited Carleton Union Lodge. Brother Enoch Thompson, the Worshipful Master, gave us a cordial welcome on behalf of the Lodge, and there was a pleasant interchange of fraternal greetings. The work for the evening was the M. M. Degree, which was conferred upon three candidates in an accurate and very impressive manner. When the business of the evening was concluded there was a call to refreshment, and the brethren of Carleton Union entertained their visitors with that hospitality for which this Lodge has long been famous. The hour for parting came all too soon, and the members of the Craft present felt that the evening had been most enjoyably spent. There can be no doubt of the continued prosperity of this splendid Lodge.

On the evening of November 20, I left St. John for the purpose of visiting the Lodges at Bathurst and Dalhousie, and also to consecrate the new Lodge Room at Campbellton. On this visit I was accompanied by V. W. Brother F. J. G. Knowlton, G. Treasurer, R. W. Brother J. Twining Hartt, G. Secretary and W. Brother Chas. D. Jones, G.

Director of Ceremonies. November 21, we visited Lodge St. John at Bathurst and found W. Brother J. N. Stewart, P. M., in the chair, who conferred the M. M. Degree upon one candidate in a manner highly creditable to himself and his staff of officers. Light refreshments were served at the conclusion of the labours of the evening, which were heartily enjoyed by all present. Next morning Past Master Stewart took the visiting members of Grand Lodge for a sleigh drive to Youghal on Bay Chaleur. The drive in the crisp November air was most delightful and the sight of the waters of the great bay named by Cartier on his first voyage to New Brunswick left an impression upon us all which cannot soon be forgotten. Before leaving Bathurst I had the pleasure of calling upon Dr. Duncan, one of the oldest Past Masters, in company with Brother Southwood. Brother Duncan is prevented by failing health from attending the meetings of the Lodge, but his interest in its welfare is still as warm as ever.

I next visited Restigouche Lodge at Dalhousie on the night of November 22, accompanied by the Grand Treasurer, Grand Secretary and Grand Director of Ceremonies. On arriving at the Lodge we found Worshipful Master Goldenberg and a good attendance of brethren present to meet us. R. W. Brother Dugald Firth, P. D. G. M., accompanied by Brothers A. E. G. McKenzie and Alexander, had come from Campbellton to take part in the proceedings of the evening. No candidate was in waiting to receive a degree, but portions of the M. M. Degree were exemplified by the Grand Lodge officers, and many questions on points of ritual answered. The books of the Lodge are accurately kept by our worthy Brother, Past Master J. E. Stewart, whom I was pleased to find acting as Secretary. We were pleasantly entertained by the members of Restigouche Lodge at the conclusion of the business of the evening, and greatly enjoyed the social hour spent in their company.

Next night, November 23, I had the pleasure of consecrating the new Masonic Lodge Room at Campbellton. There was a large attendance of members of the Craft present to witness the ceremony of consecration. When the work of consecration was concluded, I asked the W. M., Brother A. E. G. McKenzie, to take the chair and confer the F. C. Degree upon the candidate who was in waiting to receive it. The Worshipful Master and his officers did the work with accuracy and impressiveness. A splendid supper in the fine banquet hall adjoining the Lodge room brought this pleasant visit to a close. Here many speeches were made, all marked by good taste and much feeling. The members of the Craft in Campbellton are to be heartily congratulated on the completion of this splendid new Lodge, and the prosperity of Campbellton Lodge seems to be well assured.

January 2, 1912, accompanied by Past Grand Master Dr. Thos. Walker and a full corps of Grand and Past Grand officers, I visited Saint John's Lodge, No. 2, for the purpose of installing the Worshipful Master elect, Brother T. H. Belyea, and other officers. The attendance of members and visiting brethren was very large, and I was warmly welcomed to this, my Mother Lodge, by W. Brother Clement A. Rutherford, the retiring Master. Saint John's Lodge is now advanced several years on the second century of its existence, and is in a very prosperous condition. On the occasion of this visit, the officers of Grand Lodge wore for the first time the magnificent new regalia which had been ordered from Spencer's, London, by R. W. Brother Dr. Thos. Walker, P. G. M., during his recent visit to England. All present agreed that Brother Walker had performed the important task of selecting the new regalia with the greatest good judgment.

May 2, 1912, accompanied by R. W. Brother Percy W. Wetmore, S. G. W., R. W. Brother J. Twining Hartt,

G. Secretary, W. Brother Chas. D. Jones, G. D. of C., I had the great pleasure of paying an official visit to Hiram Lodge, No. 6, at Fredericton. Here we found W. Brother Lewis Bliss, whom I had installed in December, presiding over the Lodge with dignity and good judgment. After interchanging fraternal greetings I took occasion to install as Junior Grand Warden of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, Brother W. Thos. S. Wilkinson, who had been elected to this office at the last Annual Communication of Grand Lodge in August, but had been obliged to return to Fredericton before the ceremony of installation. The work for the evening was the M. M. Degree which was conferred upon one candidate by the Master and his officers with much impressiveness and thorough accuracy. On concluding the labours of the evening the brethren of Hiram entertained us most hospitably in their new banquet room, and the pleasant time spent with them over the social board will not soon be forgotten. Since my last official visit to Hiram in 1910, the Lodge room has been greatly enlarged, remodelled and refurnished throughout, presenting a very tasteful and elegant appearance, and is now perhaps the finest Lodge room in the jurisdiction. The members of Hiram are very active and enthusiastic Masons, and are doing their utmost to promote the interests of their Lodge.

Tuesday, June 4, accompanied by the Grand Director of Ceremonies and Grand Organist, I went to St. George for the purpose of visiting St. George Lodge, No. 12. At St. George we were joined by R. W. Brother Dr. Melvin L. Young, D. G. M. and R. W. Brother George F. Pinder, P. D. G. M. At the Lodge room in the evening we found a large gathering of the Craft present, many of whom had come from a distance of nine or ten miles to meet the Grand Master and Grand Lodge officers. After interchanging fraternal greetings with W. Brother Toy, I

took the opportunity to install him in his office of Junior Grand Deacon to which he had been appointed at the Annual Communication of Grand Lodge in August, 1911. I then requested him to take the chair and proceed with the work of the evening, which was to confer the M. M. Degree. This Degree was worked smoothly and accurately throughout, and in a manner creditable both to the Master and his staff of officers. W. Brother Grant, a Past Master, gave the lectures to the candidate and showed that he possessed a good knowledge of the ritual. After labour we were called to refreshment and spent a very pleasant social time with the good brethren of St. George, doing ample justice to the good cheer which was bountifully provided. I was very much impressed with the enthusiasm for Masonry and good fellowship existing among the members of this fine Lodge, which I believe is not surpassed in any other Lodge in the jurisdiction. During our stay in St. George we were taken for a delightful sail up the Magaguadavic river, through the canal, and on Lake Utopia to the camp of Brother Johnson, the Secretary of the Lodge. We also enjoyed a drive to L'Etang and had a sail on its magnificent harbour, by the possibilities of which we were much impressed. The courtesy and kind attention of Brothers Dr. H. I. Taylor, H. Magee, Capt. Johnson, J. Sutton Clark, and several others, made this visit a most delightful one.

July 23, accompanied by the Grand Secretary and Grand Director of Ceremonies, I went to Saint Stephen to visit Sussex Lodge, No. 7. On arriving at Saint Stephen we were met at the station by Brothers J. T. Whitlock, J. Vroom, A. Mungall and W. Inches, whose kind courtesy and thoughtful attention added greatly to the pleasure of our visit. In the afternoon and evening of the same day sessions were held in the Lodge for mutual instruction in order that greater accuracy on certain points of ritual might

be attained. Several brethren were present from Victoria and Alley Lodges, and portions of the F. C. and M. M. Degrees were worked and fully discussed. This visit was a most interesting one to myself and the Grand Officers who accompanied me and, I believe, instructive and profitable to all present. Rev. Canon Newnham, P. G. Chaplain, and Dr. M. L. Young, D. G. M., were present and took an active part in the evening's proceedings. R.W. Brother James Vroom still acts as Secretary of Sussex Lodge, and needless to say the books of the Lodge are faithfully and accurately kept. Sussex Lodge is in good condition and its members are enthusiastic Masons. Next day the Grand Lodge Officers were taken by Brother Graham, of Victoria Lodge, Milltown, on a delightful motor trip to Saint Andrews-by-the-Sea. Brother Graham acted as chauffeur himself and proved a most expert motorist bringing us back to Saint Stephen at a surprising rate of speed.

An Emergent Communication of Grand Lodge was held in the City of Saint John on Sunday, July 28, at the Masonic Temple for the purpose of attending Divine service. It had been my intention to have this service held June 23, the Sabbath preceding St. John Baptist's Day, but owing to the absence of the Grand Chaplain in England I thought it well to defer the service until his return. There was a good turn-out of members from the various Lodges in the city, the Craft having responded well to the summons. After Grand Lodge had been opened in ample form, a procession was formed under the direction of W. Brother Chas. D. Jones, G. D. of C., and W. Brother Fred. H. Hartt, Assistant G. D. of C. The members of the Craft then proceeded to Trinity Church, where service was conducted by the Rector, Rev. R. A. Armstrong, Grand Chaplain. The service was most impressive, the music excellent, and all joined heartily in

the hymns. The sermon preached by the Grand Chaplain was an admirable one and worthy of the occasion. In eloquent language, the high aims and standards of Freemasonry were admirably depicted by the preacher, and the sermon made a deep impression on the mind of every member of the Craft who heard it. When the service was concluded, the procession was re-formed and the brethren returned to the Temple, where appropriate resolutions were passed thanking the Wardens of Trinity for their kindness in allowing the use of the church, and to the Grand Chaplain for his able sermon. Grand Lodge was then closed in ample form. I wish particularly to thank Sir Knight, Horace Porter, the Eminent Commander of the Knight Templars for his kindness in providing an escort for Grand Lodge, as the presence of the Knights added materially to the appearance of the procession.

APPOINTMENTS AS REPRESENTATIVES.

I have nominated W. Brother Samuel McKee for appointment as Representative of the Grand Lodge of New South Wales, near the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, in the place of V. W. Brother Freeman W. Wisdom, resigned.

W. Brother Alexander M. Rowan, as Representative of the Grand Lodge of Louisiana, near this Grand Lodge, in the place of W. Brother George K. Cochran, deceased.

W. Brother C. Berton Lockhart, as Representative of the Grand Lodge of Texas, near this Grand Lodge, in place of W. Brother Hugh H. McLean, resigned.

R. W. Brother Robert Murray, as Representative of the Grand Lodge of Tennessee, near this Grand Lodge.

During the year many inquiries have been submitted to me on questions of Masonic Law and Usage, to all of which careful attention was given and replies made. In most cases it was merely necessary to call the attention of brethren to the Constitution and existing regulations of Grand Lodge. If Masters of Lodges were careful to search the Constitution at all times, they would find therein the direct answer to nearly every question that can be asked. They should also cause the Constitution to be read in Lodge that "none may pretend ignorance of the excellent precepts it enjoins."

I have also been pleased to approve of changes in the By-Laws of several of the city Lodges. The new By-Laws of Keith Lodge, No. 23, has been submitted to me, and approved after careful examination.

Many dispensations have been granted to various Lodges for different purposes. These will be found in the Report of the Grand Secretary.

From the reports of the Grand Treasurer and Grand Secretary, which will be laid before you, you will see that the financial condition of Grand Lodge is sound, and that the increase in our membership has been considerable. The reports of the Deputy Grand Master and the District Deputy Grand Masters will also be laid before you, and show in greater detail the condition of the Craft throughout the jurisdiction.

I would also recommend, as has been customary in the past, that Grand Lodge place the sum of two hundred dollars at the disposal of the Grand Master to provide instruction for Private Lodges.

And now, my brothers, as I am about to return to you the gavel of authority with which I was intrusted three years ago, allow me to thank you sincerely for the distinguished honour which you then conferred upon me. It is true that I have not accomplished nearly as much as

I had hoped to do, for the position of Grand Master requires much labour on the part of anyone who assumes the responsibilities of that office, but the work has been with me a labour of love, and I am perfectly satisfied if what has been done meets with your approval. It is human to err and I know that mistakes have been made, yet I am sure you will view them with charity and give me credit for an earnest desire to do the best I could.

I desire before closing to thank all my associate officers for the uniform courtesy and kindness that have been shown me, and for their readiness at all times to assist me in the performance of my duties. The remembrance, my brothers, of your many acts of kindness and your words of approval, will live long in my memory, and I trust that I may always act in the future in such a manner as to show myself worthy of your confidence and your respect.

To our faithful friend and brother, Grand Secretary J. Twining Hartt, I feel myself particularly indebted for the valuable assistance which he has so often given me, as well as for the prompt and efficient way in which he has discharged his official duties.

Finally, my brothers, may I ask for my successor in office the same generous support that has been accorded to me by the other Grand officers and the members of the Craft throughout this jurisdiction. And now, as we enter upon our labours, it is my earnest desire that all our deliberations may be carried on in the spirit of brotherly love, and that the richest blessings of Providence may rest upon us and the noble fraternity whose beneficent influence has made itself felt throughout the earth.

The Report of the Board of General Purposes was next presented and read by the President, R. W. Brother Melvin L. Young, M.D., D. G. M., and on due motion, it was received and laid on the table.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF GENERAL PURPOSES.

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, F. & A. M.:

The Board of General Purposes presents the following as its report for the past year:

At its first meeting after the Annual Communication, the Board elected R. W. Brother George B. Hegan, Vice-President; and also under the regulations regarding the Fund of Benevolence, elected R. W. Brother Alex. R. Campbell and the Grand Treasurer to act with the M. W. Grand Master in the administration of the Fund and the granting of relief.

Grand Lodge will recall that the Board in its report a year ago stated that Past Grand Master Walker, then in England, was acting for the Board in the purchasing of new regalia. On his return the R. W. Brother reported that, on consideration, he had placed the order with Messrs. Spencer & Co., Great Queen Street, London, and had concurred in their suggestion not to have the work hurried, thereby insuring more uniform workmanship. The regalia was received in December last, the total cost including duty, insurance and the regilding of the old jewels, being \$1,142.45, which is less than was at first estimated. It is proposed to print in the Annual Proceedings an itemized statement of the prices paid for the several aprons and collars in order that the figures may be available for future reference.

The Board also proposes to procure a second set of collar jewels for use with the old regalia; and for the proper protection of the new regalia, a steel cabinet with eight drawers has been ordered, to cost approximately \$95.00.

The Board has also taken action towards the fitting up with doors and shelving, of one of the vaults in the Masonic Temple so that there may be a place of safety for the records of Grand Lodge and for those of such subordinate Lodges as may care to take advantage of it.

As is customary, the report of the Brethren who audited the year's accounts is presented herewith. It is as follows:

The above report and the statements of the Grand Treasurer and Grand Secretary will, doubtless, occasion much satisfaction to Grand Lodge and to the Craft generally. The position of Grand Lodge was never so strong, financially nor in point of membership. As there is such a substantial balance to the credit of the General Account the Board recommends that the sum of fifteen hundred dollars be transferred to the Fund of Benevolence for investment.

Extensive improvements to the Lodge Room in Masonic Temple now in progress and which were not commenced as early as intended have made it impossible for Grand Lodge to assemble there; and, on consideration, the Board felt it but right to accept the offer, by Carleton Union Lodge, of the use of its comfortable hall, West St. John. The Board trusts that the necessity of crossing the harbour will not be found irksome by the visiting Brethren.

—*Carried.*

Also resolved on motion of W. Brother A. M. Rowan, P. G. Std. B.,

"That when Grand Lodge takes recess, it take recess until eight o'clock."

Moved by Past Grand Master Forbes, seconded by W. Brother Arthur W. Sharp, P. A. G. D. of C.,

"That the reports of the Grand Treasurer and Grand Secretary be taken from the table and printed, as usual, in the Proceedings of the year."—*Carried.*

R. W. Brother the Hon. John V. Ellis, P. G. M., referred to the circumstance that at the recent Masonic service in Trinity Church a collection had been taken up and that the authorities of the Church had since paid over the amount to the Grand Treasurer.

The R. W. Brother was strongly of the view that this money should not go into the Funds of Grand Lodge but should be applied to some worthy purpose in connection with Trinity Church, or to charity.

On his motion it was resolved,

"That the amount of the offertory be refunded to the Rector of Trinity Church, the V. W. Grand Chaplain, to be disposed of by him as he may think best."

In answer to an enquiry of R. W. Brother R. L. Maltby, P. D. G. M., it was stated that on occasions of special meetings of Grand Lodge to attend Divine Service it had not been customary to send proclamations throughout the jurisdiction.

The practice had been to notify the officers of Grand Lodge and also the members of Grand Lodge residing at or near the place of meeting.

There was some discussion, and then on motion of R. W. Brothers His Honour Judge Forbes, P. G. M., and R. L. Maltby, P. D. G. M., it was ordered,

"That in future, notices of all communications, regular and emergent, be sent to all members of Grand Lodge."

On motion duly seconded it was resolved,

"That the Report of the Board of General Purposes be taken from the table, its recommendations adopted and that it be printed in full in the Annual Proceedings."

R. W. Brother the Hon. John V. Ellis, P. G. M., speaking on behalf of the officers and members of Carleton Union Lodge, stated that tables would be clothed in the adjoining refectory so that members of Grand Lodge present need not re-cross the harbour before the evening session. The Brethren, one and all, were cordially urged to remain.

The Grand Master having acknowledged the kind thoughtfulness of Carleton Union Lodge, Grand Lodge took recess.

TUESDAY EVENING.

August 27th, 1912.

Grand Lodge resumed labour at eight o'clock, the M. W. Grand Master in the East.

R. W. Brother Ralph A. March, P. G. W., introduced the subject of a smaller Grand Lodge Certificate, such an one as could be readily carried by a Brother when travelling from place to place. Such a certificate was greatly needed by commercial men. He stated that a certificate of this nature was issued by the Grand Lodge of Nova Scotia and by some of the Grand Lodges in the United States. R. W. Brother March moved a general motion to the above effect.

A long discussion ensued shared in by R. W. Brothers His Honour Judge Forbes, Thomas Walker, M.D., William B. Wallace, Robert Murray and W. Brother Frank A. Godsoe.

Eventually the motion was withdrawn and the following, duly moved and seconded, was put to Grand Lodge and declared—*Carried*.

"That the Board of General Purposes be directed to enquire into the possibility of having a Grand Lodge Certificate provided in a reduced size if practicable, and if not, to recommend a plan for procuring Certificates which may be easily carried in a small form."

Brother the Rev. A. D. Archibald then requested permission to fulfill a duty which had been entrusted to him by the family of the late Right Worshipful Isaac W. Doherty, M.D., P. D. G. M., that was to place in the custody of Grand Lodge the late Brother's Deputy Grand Master's apron. The doing so was Brother Doherty's own desire as it was a provision of his last will. The Rev. Brother Archibald spoke eloquently of Brother Doherty's love for the Craft and of his life long attachment to Masonic principles. These traits had won for him the highest regard of his Brethren.

The M. W. Grand Master, in accepting the apron, added that it was a privilege thus to carry out Brother Doherty's express wish and that the apron worn by him would be treasured by Grand Lodge as a special memento of him.

The Credential Committee, W. Brothers E. R. W. Ingraham, Theodore H. Belyea and William B. Robertson, were announced, admitted and reported that the following Brethren were in attendance and entitled to seats in Grand Lodge.

(2) In the regulations as to "Aprons" of Grand Stewards to substitute the words "gold and gold tassels" for "silver and silver tassels."

The motion so to amend was seconded by Past Grand Master Forbes and regularly adopted.

W. Brother Frank A. Godsoe, P. G. D., moved, seconded by W. Brother George E. Day, P. G. Pur., the following amendment, of which due notice had in like manner been given:

"That under the head of 'Proposing Members,' Section 6, line 3, Page 48 in the Constitution, the words 'Cannot be withdrawn,' be struck out and the following words

inserted: 'It becomes the property of the Lodge, and cannot be withdrawn except by vote of the Lodge and upon the application for withdrawal by the recommenders of the petition, previous to the Report of the Investigating Committee being received.'"—*Carried.*

R. W. Brother George Ackman, P. D. G. M., presented his commission as representative of the York Grand Lodge of Mexico. This was in substitution for his former commission from the Grand Lodge Valle de Mexico.

W. Brother Robert Clerke presented his commission as representative of the Grand Lodge of North Dakota.

The motion was carried unanimously and was pleasantly acknowledged by Past Grand Master Walker.

A resolution was likewise unanimously adopted, conveying to the Worshipful Master, officers and members of Carleton Union Lodge, No. 8, the thanks of Grand Lodge for the use of the Lodge Room and for their unbounded hospitality to the Brethren.

Ordered, "That when Grand Lodge takes recess, it take recess until three o'clock to-morrow, Wednesday afternoon.

REPORT ON THE GRAND MASTER'S ADDRESS.

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge, Free and Accepted Masons of New Brunswick:

Your Committee charged with the duty of reporting upon the M.W. Grand Master's Address, feel that you will heartily join with him in rejoicing that harmony and good will prevail throughout this jurisdiction; and share his thankfulness to the Supreme Ruler of the Universe for the peace and prosperity of the great Empire to which we bear allegiance.

been appreciated by the Brethren in every part of the jurisdiction; and the hearty reception accorded to the reading of his report showed the appreciation of Grand Lodge.
