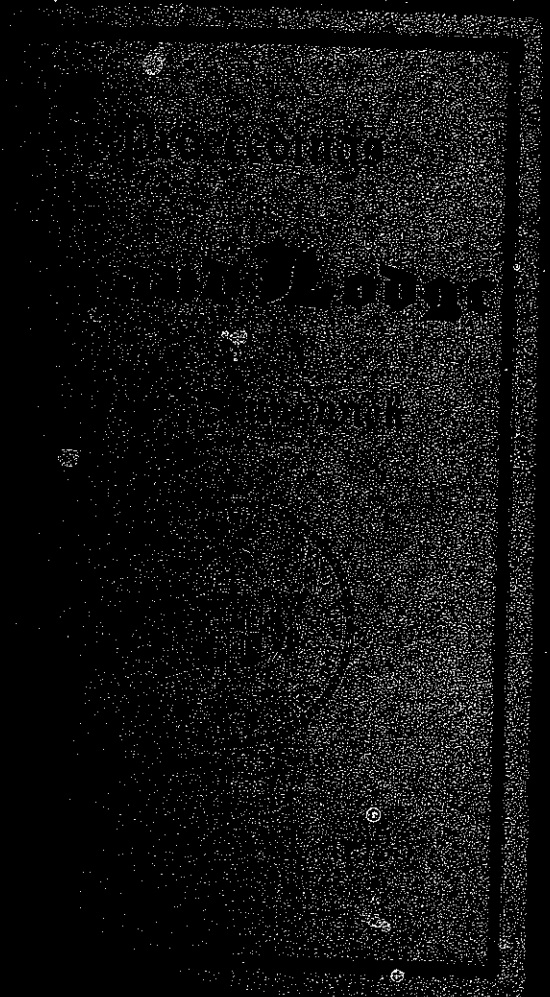

SERMON

V.W. C. GORDON LAWRENCE, M.A., *Grand Chaplain.*

*Thus He shewed me; and, behold, the Lord stood upon a wall, * * * with a plumb-line in His hand.*

AMOS VII, 7.

AMOS was one of the early prophets of Israel. We are accustomed to think of a prophet as one who predicts the course of events. Among the Hebrews the prophet did occasionally predict, or foretell, the consequences that might be expected to follow evil living; or he foretold at times the help and comfort that God would provide for His faithful people. But the characteristic function of the prophet was not to foretell, but to tell forth. He told forth truths about God. The teaching of Amos has been preserved nearly three thousand years, while myriads of other books have perished, because it contains lessons that are of real worth and of always appropriate application.

Nearly all successful teachers have taught by means of illustration. They have used signs and symbols that were selected to impress upon the mind wise and serious truths. Jesus of Nazareth, whose life and teaching have profoundly influenced the whole trend of civilization, illustrated his lessons by means of parables. The parable was a short story drawn from every day life. To many of the hearers it was no doubt a well-told story and nothing more. But in every parable a principle of morality or a spiritual truth was exemplified. The story partly concealed the truth from unworthy or unfriendly hearers; and it partly revealed it to those who had ears to hear or, in other words, to those who desired light on heavenly things. The par-

able, as a means of illustration, was a development of later Hebrew thought. In the days of the prophets teaching was frequently illustrated by means of the vision.

The vision differed from the parable in that it represented the lesson taught as having been revealed to the prophet by God Himself. Thus when the prophet was convinced of the truth of a sufficiently important lesson and was certain of its divine character, he introduced it with such words as, "I saw the Lord standing beside a wall," or "I heard the Lord saying unto me," and so forth. We cannot suppose that wherever in the ancient writings the prophets use such language they have been permitted with natural eyes to look upon God. They used these expressions, "I saw," and "I heard," to make their teaching impressive.

But in this the prophets were in no sense guilty of deception or of misrepresentation. They told the truth just as you do when you often unconsciously follow their example. One day a peculiarly profound thought occurs to you, so unlike your usual trend of thought that it seems to have come to you from without, and you say, "I have had an inspiration." But what does that mean? Inspiration is literally a "breathing in." There has been breathed into your mind an idea, a thought, a suggestion from the Great Spirit of Wisdom. You heard no audible voice but yet, it may be, God spoke to you as truly as He spoke to Amos or Hosea or Isaiah, as He speaks every day to men who keep their minds in harmony with Him. The wireless telegraph has been perfected only in our time but the principle of its operation has been in use between earth and heaven ever since man first learned to lift his eyes in silent appeal to God. Messages have always been coming from God to man, and we call that inspiration. And messages go back from man to God, and that is prayer.

In our consideration of this vision of the prophet Amos let us look first at the wall. You see its successive layers, each stone hewn and shaped and placed by the hands of a builder; each separate stone and each layer of stones cemented together with mortar applied with a trowel. Its angles are right angles, its layers are horizontal, its sides perpendicular. How did it come to be so? Here are evidences of a mind wise enough to design and to measure and to lay out work. And beside the Wisdom that designed, there has been Strength sufficient to divest those blocks of their superfluous parts and lift them to their proper position. And we perceive also the Beauty of manly courage and godlike faith that dared to attempt such an enterprise, and trusted in the laws of nature that the effort would not be in vain.

In our capacity as Speculative Masons let us think of that wall as representing the result of human endeavour, something that man attempts and finishes, something that he builds in imitation of the Creator whose image he bears. We might with profit consider our great Fraternity built up by our predecessors in the Craft so that now it is respected the world over. But I prefer that on this occasion we consider that wall as representing human character.

For character is the result of conscious effort continued from day to day. That which you most desire in the depths of your inmost heart is the plan by which you shape your building. Set your affection on things which are base and unworthy and your character becomes a wall of unlovely type. Set your affection on things above, on the unseen values of eternity, on truth and light and justice, and the built-up wall of your character will proceed along lines that please the eye of the Master. The stones which enter into that wall are thoughts and words and deeds. As a wise and skilful builder rejects some of the stones that are brought to him as unfit to have a place in his building,

so you ought often to reject many a thought that is suggested, to refrain from repeating much that is told you, and to abstain from many deeds which by the thoughtless and profane are performed to our knowledge every day.

A wall of masonry is not just a chance accumulation of stones and mortar. It is a studied and carefully planned arrangement executed with attention to every detail. Good character in man is not a wild and natural growth. It is only developed under careful discipline. The standard of righteousness is as unvarying as the Plumb. Virtue is as exact as the angle of the Square. Our determination to be good and true must be as continuous and unbroken as the Level line which stretches far beyond the bounds of space to the realms of eternity. Let no one suppose that it does not matter what he believes, or how he speaks, or what he does; for thoughts, words, and deeds are the building material of his character.

So much for the wall. We note next that it was being inspected. "Behold, the Lord standing beside a wall." Thus Amos reminds us that He who made the worlds is interested in the work of His creatures. He comes with authority to examine the work we present. Those who served in the Great War remember how novel an experience to us were the inspections of the army. We were inspected in every conceivable way; our deportment, our dress, our sleeping apartments, our food, our bodies, our correspondence. There seemed to be nothing that the army did not in some way look into. And he was a dull soldier who did not at least dimly guess that somewhere, not far away, is One who looks into the very thoughts and intents of the heart.

The Lord stands beside every wall. Though our thoughts, words, and actions may be hidden from the eyes of man, yet that all-seeing Eye, whom the sun, moon, and stars obey, pervades the inmost recesses of the human

heart. "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom." He who thinks lightly of God; who neglects to pay to the Great Architect of the Universe the reverence due to His Holy Name, is lacking in that wisdom which is needed to plan and direct any truly great work. Look up, my brothers, into the starry sky, the canopy of heaven, and behold the myriads of bodies all in motion, as they have been for untold ages, yet without collision or confusion. Study the order and the beauty apparent there. Think of the wisdom that planned their nice exactness. Think you that such a Master will be satisfied with careless or indifferent service? His work revealed in Nature involved a mysterious knowledge of the laws of moving bodies, of curved lines intersecting, of the principles of ornamentation and of many a science and art we may not even imagine. But our simple building is a matter of the relation of only two straight lines, one perpendicular and one horizontal. Yet it is a building that He will look into. Take heed that we build aright!

There remains for our consideration the instrument by which the test was being made. "Behold, the Lord * * * with a plumb-line in His hand." Through any given point an incalculable number of straight lines may be drawn in any number of planes. They may extend east or west or north or south, or up or down, in any number of variations; an immeasurable number of lines from that one point and every one of them is straight. But out of the thousands only one is plumb. A great many are nearly plumb but only one is strictly so. According to that one upright line will our work be tried.

When a wall gets out of plumb it leans either out or in. And when it leans seams begin to show on the opposite side. The seams are a visible sign to all who pass that the wall is not so well built as it might have been. It may be still a very useful wall affording support, or shelter, or

defence, but because it is not plumb, it is not so good as it might have been. For a wall ought to be built according to the plumb. The wall that leans ever so little is a reproach to the builder who ought to have kept it plumb.

In the wall of our character we are inclined to lean out or in. Inward in the way of selfishness, personal interest, love of gain, and pride. Think too much of self and your wall begins to lean and the seams open on the outer side. On the other hand the tendency to please the world rather than to serve God will draw your character away from the plumb in another direction. One may shrink from displeasing his neighbour and to avoid doing so he leans away from uprightness. Or he finds it trying and unpleasant to tell the truth on a certain occasion when a slight concession to fancy will bring popularity, a little flattery will win praise. But lean ever so little and the seams come and grow. For the wall that leans a little today will inevitably lean a little more tomorrow. And men say that, "So-and-so would be perfect but for this one flaw, he would be an upright man were it not for this one seam in his character." Alas, he has not built plumb!

A hard, hard thing it is to keep to that unerring line. We cast our eye anxiously down its length to learn how widely our work has varied from the plumb. In great humility and through many tears we look up to where it points to the great Master. We trust that He in His infinite wisdom knows that we have at least tried to please Him. May God forgive me if I am wrong in this, for I believe that although our work shows many flaws, the seams opening on every side, yet the great Master will know if we have tried to build aright. May it not be that in another world with choicer stone to quarry, and finer tools to work with, and brighter light to lead us,—may not the faithful apprentice of this life be advanced to a higher degree of service?

There have been times in the history of philosophy, as in that of religion, when men have gone to an extreme in emphasizing the seriousness of life. But few, if any, are guilty of that fault today. We are rather in the way of becoming a materialistic and superficial people. Application, attention to detail, and intensive study are not now our characteristics. We seldom take pains to do anything perfectly. We satisfy ourselves with approximately and quickly instead of deliberately and exactly.

Freemasonry comes to us from an age when men were trained through long apprenticeship to give faithful service. Its beautiful and wonderful philosophy grew out of the constant application of such exact instruments as builders must use in their occupation. Great changes have come, it is true, great improvements and reforms since the days when men were obliged to hide the fact that they were bound to each other by secret ties of friendship and love. But the square and the level and the plumb are just as indispensable now as they ever were. Not one of them can be disregarded in the erection of even the humblest dwelling. And the great truths of life that we have received from the ancient builders, and which we must hand on unchanged to those who succeed us in this honourable Fraternity, are also indispensable to good citizenship and true manhood. As builders of character who serve a heavenly Master we must not be seduced by the ease-loving carelessness of the age. We must not become slaves to the spirit of haste. We have before us a sublime ideal and there rests upon us a great responsibility. To keep ourselves worthy of the honourable duty entrusted to us we must adhere to the plumb in our several stations before God and man. May He who set the task provide the Light. Amen.

GRAND MASTER'S ADDRESS.

To the Officers and Members of Grand Lodge:

BRETHREN:

It is with the greatest satisfaction that I welcome you to this Fifty-Eighth Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, and congratulate you on the prosperous condition of the Fraternity over the entire jurisdiction.

It has not been my privilege to visit many of the Lodges during my term of office, but the District Deputy Grand Masters are taking an ever increasing interest in their work, and I am pleased to be informed that every, or nearly every Lodge has had an official visit from these officers during the year.

Since last we assembled here, we have been called upon to mourn the loss of many of our brethren who in the past have played an important part in the Masonic life of this province. They have been called from this Grand Jurisdiction to the Supreme Lodge above, there to continue their services in the land beyond the doubts and shadows of time.

There has been much of Masonic interest in other parts of the world for those who keep in touch with current events, and I notice with pleasure a greater appreciation every year of our Masonic library and a greater interest in the magazines supplied by the Library Committee.

The most notable event in England is the completion of a fund of more than £850,000, for the erection of a great Masonic Temple in London which is to be a centre for the activities of the Grand Lodge of England and a memorial to the English Masons who fell in the Great War. This great fund has been raised by voluntary contribution without calling upon the funds of Grand Lodge for assistance, and without interfering in any way with the very generous contributions which our English brethren make to Masonic charities.

The Grand Lodge of Ireland has this year celebrated with fitting ceremonies the two hundredth anniversary of its organization. I regret that I was unable to accept the invitation to witness these ceremonies. Freemasonry in New Brunswick is deeply indebted to Irish Masonry.

I am credibly informed that the Grand Orient of Belgium has abandoned the requirement of a belief in God and has removed the Bible from its altars, thus placing itself beyond the bounds of Masonic recognition. We cannot ignore the Fatherhood of God and yet assert the Brotherhood of man.

Several Lodges of the Eastern Star exist in this province and each of them, I believe, meets in the local Lodge room. This Order is favourably received in Scotland, but has been sternly banned by the United Grand Lodge of England and the Grand Lodge of Ireland. The Sister Jurisdiction of Nova Scotia has likewise discouraged it. Grand Lodge

may feel inclined to deal with this subject. The use of our Private Lodge rooms is greatly to be deprecated.

Pursuant to the order of Grand Lodge at its last communication, a warrant issued in due form for the erection of Hartland Lodge, No. 46. Subsequently I installed W. Bro. J. Edward MacCollum as the first Worshipful Master of Hartland Lodge, No. 46, and, at his request, I then installed the wardens and other officers of the Lodge. In this work I was ably assisted by Past Grand Master Wilson. At the conclusion of the ceremonies, we were entertained by the brethren of Hartland. The addresses made by R. W. Bros. LeB. Wilson, Donald Munro, W. H. Smith and E. H. Cairns, were very interesting and much appreciated by the brethren.

On December 27, Saint John's Day, I visited Carleton Union Lodge, No. 8, accompanied by R. W. S. M. Wetmore, S.G.W., R. W. John Thornton, V. W. the Rev. C. Gordon Lawrence, the Grand Treasurer, the Grand Secretary, the Grand Director of Ceremonies, W. Bros. J. R. Haycock, Clive Dickason, Bayard Stilwell and other members of Grand Lodge. I installed Bro. C. H. B. Wright as Worshipful Master and also the wardens and other officers. We were entertained with the old time hospitality of this good Lodge.

On January the 6th, in company with W. Bros. E. H. Cameron, A. H. Stanton, J. R. Warner, M. L. McPhail, G. E. Jones, Frederick Green, Clive Dickason, N. E. Shaw, R. R. Cummings, R. L. Hunter and the Grand Director of Ceremonies, I visited Saint John's Lodge, No. 2, and installed the Master elect W. Bro. John C. Earle, his wardens and other officers.

On my visit to The New Brunswick Lodge, No. 22, January the 8th, the brethren supporting me were R. W. Bros. LeB. Wilson, Charles D. Jones, S. M. Wetmore, S.G.W., W. S. Clawson, E. H. Cairns, the V. W. Grand Chaplain, V. W. H. R. Sturdee, the Grand Secretary and W. Bros. W. L. Ellis, F. S. Sawaya, the Grand Director of Ceremonies, and other members of Grand Lodge. The work of the evening was again the installation of Master, wardens and officers, the Master being W. Bro. LeRoi A. M. King. On this occasion I was presented by the members of the Lodge with a beautiful basket of flowers which was greatly appreciated by Mrs. Ellis and myself.

On January the 9th, I drove to Hampton with the V. W. Grand Chaplain, the Grand Director of Ceremonies, and V. W. H. R. Sturdee, and installed the Master, wardens and officers of The Corinthian Lodge, No. 13.

January 13, together with R. W. LeB. Wilson, R. W. C. D. Jones, R. W. S. M. Wetmore, R. W. R. E. Crawford, Bro. the Rev. J. H. A. Holmes, W. Bros. Enoch Thompson,

A. H. Stanton, P. R. Hunter, A. G. Hoar, C. D. Strong, W. Nonnenman and many others, I visited Hibernia Lodge, No. 3, and installed Bro. Albert C. Lemmon as Worshipful Master. I also installed the wardens and officers of this Lodge.

On January the 17th, with Past Grand Master Wilson, W. Bro. A. M. Rowan, R. W. John Thornton, W. A. H. Stanton and the Grand Director of Ceremonies, I went to Fredericton Junction and installed the Worshipful Master, wardens and officers of Sunbury Lodge, No. 42.

On May 7, accompanied by P. G. M. Hedley V. B. Bridges, P. G. M. LeBaron Wilson, R. W. Charles D. Jones, R. W. Stanley M. Wetmore, R. W. R. S. Barker, R. W. James Hawthorne, R. W. John Thornton, W. John R. Haycock, W. F. S. Sawaya, W. Carl G. Fraser, Grand Director of Ceremonies, and a number of the brethren from Fredericton and Devon, I visited Hiram Lodge, No. 6, and witnessed the Third degree conferred on two candidates in a manner that reflects great credit on the Worshipful Master and his officers.

On July 2, accompanied by R. W. Jas. Vroom, R. W. Wm. H. Smith, the Grand Treasurer, V. W. A. Ernest Everett, R. W. John Thornton, V. W. Russell H. Sturdee, and the Grand Director of Ceremonies, I visited St. Marks Lodge, No. 5, where I witnessed the Third degree. Thirteen Past Masters of the Lodge were present to greet us.

On July 7, I visited St. George Lodge, No. 12, with Past Grand Master Wilson, V. W. the Rev. C. Gordon Lawrence and several members of Grand Lodge. The Third degree was worked on this occasion in a manner that deeply impressed the visitors. The lectures in particular were very well delivered and the whole degree was greatly enjoyed.

On August the 3rd, I visited Campbellton Lodge, No. 32, in company with R. W. Dugald Firth, R. W. Edward H.

Cairns and W. Bernard J. Collier. The night was very warm and the attendance was not as large as the Master would have liked, but the First degree was conferred in a manner that would do credit to any Lodge. Campbellton Lodge is to be highly commended for the excellent work they are doing, both in the Lodge and as citizens. They have a beautiful Lodge room and have taxed themselves heavily to carpet and furnish it. This they have done by special assessment, and have not impaired the funds of the Lodge.

August the 4th, accompanied by several brethren of Campbellton Lodge, we drove to Dalhousie and visited Restigouche Lodge, No. 25. There they exemplified the Second degree in a splendid manner. The improvement in the work of this Lodge in the last few years reflects great credit on W. Bro. A. B. McKinnon, and those brethren who have assisted him. We were well entertained by the members after the Lodge closed and motored back to Campbellton well pleased with Restigouche Lodge.

August the 6th, with R. W. Edward H. Cairns, and W. Bro. Collier, I motored to Bathurst and was there met by R. W. R. A. Snowball and Bros. Mallay and Jack of Miramichi Lodge, also by the Grand Director of Ceremonies who had come up from Saint John to join me. Here we visited Lodge Saint John, No. 27, and again witnessed the Second degree. I was agreeably surprised at the work Lodge Saint John is doing, but it bears out the good reports given to me from time to time by the District Deputy Grand Master. The members of this Lodge were untiring in their attention to the Grand Master and those who accompanied him. The visit to these three northern Lodges was very delightful.

The members of Grand Lodge were called in special communication on Sunday, May 17, for the purpose of attending divine service in Trinity Church, conducted by

the Grand Chaplain. The weather was disappointing, heavy rain falling all day. Notwithstanding there was a splendid turn-out of the Craft, members coming from Hampton and Fredericton. The service was very impressive. The Grand Chaplain's message will be presented to you in the printed Proceedings. Past Grand Master Walker, Past Grand Master Clark and Past Grand Master Wilson were present on this occasion.

The Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island celebrated its Semicentennial in June of this year, and it was my privilege and pleasure to be present and represent you on that occasion. Together with the Grand Master of Nova Scotia and M. W. the Rev. Canon Shatford, Past Grand Master of Quebec, I was presented and introduced to the Grand Master of Prince Edward Island in open Lodge at their morning session June 24. In the afternoon there was a commemoration service in St. Paul's Anglican Church with a sermon by M. W. Rev. Canon Shatford. In the evening we were entertained at a banquet in the Victoria Hotel. This visit to Prince Edward Island was of particular interest and pleasure to me and I am sure to you as well, from the fact that when the Lodges on Prince Edward Island decided to form a Grand Lodge they invited the Grand Master and Grand Officers of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick to install their Grand Master and officers. The invitation was readily accepted by the then Grand Master, John V. Ellis, who, with eleven members of this Grand Lodge, and an escort from the Encampment of Saint John, proceeded to Charlottetown and installed M. W. Bro. John Yeo as Grand Master. The acquaintance formed at that time between these two Grand Masters grew with the years into a very deep and enduring friendship.

The usual number of inquiries as to Masonic practice have been received, to which the Grand Secretary has given careful attention. I cannot but feel that a more careful

study of the Constitution and greater familiarity with the Lodge By-Laws, would enable the Master or the Secretary to decide for himself many questions submitted to the Grand Secretary. It has come to my attention that some of the Lodges are not complying with the Constitution in the matter of proposing members, and I would recommend to your careful attention paragraph 2 under this heading, which clearly states that "No person shall be made a Mason, until his name, age, addition or profession shall have been sent to all the members in the summons for the next regular meeting." It should also be borne in mind that a candidate at the time of his initiation should be known to be in reputable circumstances.

Changes in the By-Laws of at least two Lodges have been submitted for approval and in each case action has been taken.

The reports of the Grand Treasurer and Grand Secretary will be presented to you. They show a very satisfactory condition of the affairs of Grand Lodge and a reasonable increase in the number of the Craft.

The Grand Secretary's report will show the number of dispensations issued and the reasons therefor. The Board of General Purposes and the Directors in their reports will deal with the business of the year in more detail than I have attempted. They will inform you as to the condition of the building, the work that has been done upon it and other matters of importance that have come before them. The reports of the District Deputy Grand Masters will, I am sure, be interesting to you.

The Worshipful Master, on behalf of the members of Carleton Union Lodge will present to Grand Lodge a portrait of R. W. Daniel C. Clark, Past Grand Master. The portrait, now hanging on our walls will be unveiled at this communication.

The Master Mason degree will be conferred for your benefit at a special communication of Hibernia Lodge this evening at 7.30. The regular officers of the Lodge will perform the work.

I wish to thank the Grand Lodge officers for their very great kindness to me at all times, and especially do I wish to refer to the Grand Director of Ceremonies and the Grand Secretary, who have been untiring in their efforts to make light for me the duties of this important office.

Though wars and rumours of wars are rife, and industrial and political disturbances are threatening, yet there are quiet movements in the world at large that are of good omen for the future; and may be remembered as important events in history when our present troubles are past and forgotten. One of these is the increasing usefulness of the League of Nations, which is making itself felt as a world influence more quickly and more surely than could have been expected. Its principles are so much in harmony with Masonic principles that they must command our sympathy and support. Another is the movement for the abolition of the caste system in India, which is meeting with remarkable success. Another is seen in the many signs of a nearer approach in the historic churches of Christendom, the most spectacular instance of which is the recent visit to England of great dignitaries of the Eastern Church. For the first time in history, two patriarchs of the Greek Church, the Patriarch of Jerusalem and the Patriarch of Alexandria, attended by other ecclesiastics of high rank and dignity, have been cordially received and welcomed in the principal cities of England and have taken part in the ceremonies of the English cathedrals. Only those of anti-Christian sympathies can fail to see in this a promise of greater things to come. The attitude of the members of our Fraternity towards all these movements can be well expressed by a recent saying of Sir Oliver Lodge:

"Depend upon it, nothing is haphazard. Things are not left to chance. Everything is amenable to law and order. Everything points to a rational Plan, of which we know neither the beginning nor the end, but toward which we can help. In face of all that, shall we allow ourselves to squabble about trivialities! Or shall we realize that we are the heirs of all the ages, that the destiny of mankind is being partly entrusted to us, and that humanity has a future, a potential future, beyond our wildest dreams!"

Referring to the presence of the M.W. Grand Master at the recent Fiftieth Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island, Past Grand Master Forbes said that he had very pleasant memories of the visit to the Island June, 1875, when the Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island was formally erected and when its officers were installed by the then Grand Master of New Brunswick, M.W. Bro. John V. Ellis.

The motion was seconded by R.W. Bro. Donald Munro, P.D.G.M., and was declared *Carried*.

R.W. Bros. J. G. Forbes, P.G.M., H. V. B. Bridges, P.G.M., and D. C. Clark, P.G.M., were named as the Committee.

In his address to Grand Lodge on September 22, 1875, M.W. John V. Ellis, Grand Master, mentions, in some detail, the proceedings of the first Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island and gives the names of the brethren who accompanied him from New Brunswick, viz.:

There was also an escort from the "Encampment of Saint John" of the Order of the Temple.

The annual report of the V.W. Grand Secretary was submitted and read, and on motion it was received and adopted.

GRAND SECRETARY'S REPORT.

To the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of New Brunswick:

The Grand Secretary has to report, in the first place, that the receipts of his office during the past twelve months have been quite abnormal by reason of the Special Assessment and the sale of Master Mason and Past Grand aprons. And indeed the Lodge payments of fees and dues have been exceeded, hitherto, but once, viz., in the year 1921-1922.

These Lodge payments amounted to \$6,208.29 under the following headings:

The result of the first year's Special Assessment for the Sinking Fund wherewith to meet the \$32,000.00 of bonds maturing in 1929 will surely be regarded with satisfaction. Up to July 23rd when the books of Grand Lodge were closed thirty-five Lodges had paid the Assessment for 1924 to the amount of \$4,879.00. Two other Lodges have since remitted, as no doubt will the remaining six, carrying the total to well over \$5,000.00.

As to the apron account let me state that a year ago there were on hand 65 M. M. aprons and cases. These were all disposed of and last April a further supply of 120 was obtained from Spencer & Co. and of these 41 have been sold. Further by the Board's direction, 20 undress Past Grand aprons were imported at a cost of \$10.00 each and 14 of these have been taken by members of Grand Lodge.

The receipts as shown in the Grand Treasurer's accounts were \$642.00 and there are balances outstanding of \$293.00.

The supplies now on hand are: M. M. aprons and cases 80, Past Grand aprons 6, Past Master emblems 8 sets; and the value, at cost, is \$636.00.

It may be well to add a definite reminder that these aprons are being sold at their actual cost price and that no profit is sought by Grand Lodge.

With perhaps two exceptions, the Lodges have had a year of prosperity and of active work, with a resulting increase in membership.

The Dispensations granted by the M. W. Grand Master, thirty-three in number, were for the usual purposes, as many as sixteen authorizing the wearing of regalia at Divine Service. Since the last Annual Communication 320 Grand Lodge Certificates, bearing the Grand Master's name, have been issued to Lodge secretaries. This is the full number called for by the returns so that at date there are no arrears. Of the recent supply of 500 Certificates received from The British American Bank Note Company, Ottawa, some 350 are on hand, sufficient, in all likelihood, for the needs of the coming year. The present Certificates on heavy imitation parchment with sales tax, cost of sealing and printing the Grand Master's name cost as near as may be sixty cents each.

No fewer than twenty-one of our Lodges, by their By-Laws, provide that the Festival of Saint John the Evangelist, December 27, shall be a regular Communication for the purpose of installing officers. Such a By-Law is authorized by section 3 "of Private Lodges." The use of the word *regular* is perhaps unhappy for in some instances it is taken to mean that ordinary business may be brought up. Such a view is, however, incorrect. The only business which the Lodge can do, apart from the installation, is to confirm that part of the December minutes which relates to the election of Master, Treasurer and Tyler.

R.W. James E. Masters, D.G.M., President of the Board of General Purposes, presented the Board's report for the year; and, on motion of W. Bros. M. L. McPhail and H. M. Ferguson, the report was received and adopted.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF GENERAL PURPOSES.

To the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of New Brunswick:

Five meetings of the Board have been held during the year. At the first meeting, shortly after the Annual Communication, R. W. Bro. Stanley M. Wetmore, S.G.W., was elected Vice-President.

The five sets of undress regalia for District Deputy Grand Masters, referred to in the Board's report last August, were received from Spencer & Co. in time for the Annual Meeting and have been in service through the year. They are very neat and attractive and have been much admired.

Two matters touched upon by the Grand Master were, on the recommendation of the Committee on his address, referred to this Board, viz., a Masonic Home or some such work and the appointment of a Grand Lecturer.

As to the first the Board agreed that it could not do otherwise than lay the proposal on the table for the present as the financial engagements of the ensuing five years precluded any effective action.

Instruction in the Ritual was seriously considered but the Board was not favourable to the selection of an official instructor; also for financial reasons. But with the Grand Master's approval the Lodges were all notified by printed circular that on application by any Lodge, a competent instructor, if available at the time, would be sent subject to this understanding that the hotel expenses were to be met

by the Lodge and that travelling and other expenses would be defrayed by Grand Lodge.

We rejoice in the continuing increase of the Fund of Benevolence. The transfer last year of \$3,000.00 from the general balance and excess of income over the sum granted for relief, place the assets of the fund, as already made known to Grand Lodge, at \$24,862.18. Of the cash balance the Board has directed the immediate investment of \$500.00. The M. W. Grand Master and Past Grand Masters Forbes and Wilson were the Committee which dealt with the applications for relief.

The Board has adopted a standing resolution that when members residing elsewhere than in Saint John attend Board meetings, their necessary expenses shall be refunded to them. This is a long delayed action but is warranted by the present finances of Grand Lodge and the very great advantage of having these representative members in attendance.

At its meeting in March last, R. W. R. Percy Dickson, Treasurer of Keith Lodge, and R. W. George Ackman, P.D.G.M., explained to the Board the heavy obligations which Keith and Tweedie Lodges were labouring under because of the unexpectedly high cost of their new Masonic Temple.

In substance, R. W. Bro. Dickson stated:

That the brethren of Moncton had just completed the building of a new Temple to be used for Masonic purposes;

That the said Temple was up to date in every respect, and a credit to the fraternity;

That the cost of said Temple as often happens exceeded the estimates, and further that a large number of Masons had moved away from the jurisdiction;

That as a consequence the Directors were compelled to charge a heavy rental to the tenant Lodges;

That the two Lodges, Keith and Tweedie, feeling the burden of this heavy charge, were compelled to lay the matter before the Board of General Purposes requesting said Board to ask Grand Lodge that the said Lodges be relieved of the payment of the special assessment for the year 1925.

The Board complies with the request and lays these facts before Grand Lodge.

REPORT OF DIRECTORS.

August 27, 1925.

To the Masonic Grand Lodge Corporation:

The clear presentation, by the V. W. Grand Treasurer, of the past year's accounts and the very full report of the Audit Committee, render it unnecessary for the Directors to refer, in any detail, to the financial position of the Corporation. The substantial balances make that position very satisfactory indeed, and the members and, we would add, the Craft generally have good reason to be gratified at the all round prosperity which is shown by to-day's statements.

The Hall Committee report the Masonic Building as fully tenanted, but we have lost the Saint John Municipality which since 1919 has occupied the rooms on the main floor as Court Rooms and Sheriff's offices. The lease expired May 1st. At a special meeting, the Directors approved of a three years lease to the Saint John Lodge of Elks at a rental of \$1,200.00. This is quite a decrease but it was felt that no likelihood existed of leasing at anything near the former figure.

The following survey of the repair work during the year is submitted to you:

The Managing Committee of Masonic Hall beg to submit the following Report:

During the year there has been a large amount of repairs made on and in the building. The rooms occupied by the Order of Elks have been painted, whitened and repaired and are now in a first class condition.

In September and October the ceiling in the Armoury was repaired. The windows in the building were taken out

and cemented in the wall and frames fitted all over the building. The galvanized iron work was also repaired and tarred.

March.—The plaster was repaired in Blake's store.

April.—The W. C. in the Hall was renovated and a tile floor was laid in the toilet on the first floor, which was also renovated. Repairs were also made to the toilet in Potts' store and soil pipe extended to the roof.

May to July.—The vestibule and doors were painted; the window sashes and frames were painted outside and in, glass was replaced, sash cords were replaced where broken and the windows in the Blue Room were retouched and varnished. The rooms occupied by Messrs. Tooke and H. E. Ellis were repaired, whitewashed, kalsomined and the woodwork painted.

The roof of the building was repaired and patched. We also had a new light placed at the entrance of the building.

At the present time the building is in first class repair and will not require a great expenditure for some time. Your Committee has had three meetings during the year.

PRESENTATION OF PORTRAIT.

W. Bro. Charles H. B. Wright, Master of Carleton Union Lodge, No. 8, West Saint John, addressed the M.W. Grand Master as follows:

"It is a privilege for me, at this Fifty-Eighth Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, to present, on behalf of the officers and members of Carleton Union Lodge, No. 8, as a token of their esteem and regard for him, this portrait of Right Worshipful Past Grand Master D. C. Clark. On June 6, 1878, Daniel C. Clark was received as an apprentice in the Masonic Order, and on August 1 of the same year he received the degree of Master Mason. Bro. Clark's grandfather was a charter member of the Carleton Union Lodge, joining it in 1846, while his son, Bro. Clark's father, was a life-long member and for many years held the office of Junior Warden. Bro. Clark was elected Worshipful Master for the years 1895-96. During the years 1917, 18 and 19 he was Grand Master of this Grand Lodge, and to the excellent performance of his duties all present can testify. He represented the Grand

Lodge at the peace celebration of The United Grand Lodge of England in London in 1919. This portrait will be a reminder of him and his excellent record for future ages, and I know that I express the thoughts of all members of not only Carleton Union Lodge, but all the Masonic Orders in the city and province, when I wish that he be spared to be with us for many years to come, to give us the benefit of his sage advice and counsel."

The portrait was then unveiled.

R.W. Bro. J. Gordon Forbes, at the Grand Master's request, accepted the gift on behalf of Grand Lodge. In his remarks he spoke of the zealous service which R.W. Bro. Clark had rendered to the well being of Carleton Union Lodge all through the years of his membership in it. Also he spoke of how efficiently the duties of Grand Master had been discharged during his three years tenure of that foremost office. Grand Lodge was most happy to be possessed of the portrait and to have it on the walls of this central Lodge room which, in company with the ones already there, it would worthily adorn.

With Section 5 was taken up the latter portion of the Committee's report of last year, including the resolution then recommended for adoption; and the section, with the resolution as part of it, was formally adopted.

Thereupon on motion of R.W. Bro. Vroom, the report of the Committee was adopted as a whole.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON FOREIGN RELATIONS.

To the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of New Brunswick:

The Committee on Relations with Foreign Grand Bodies beg leave to submit their report.

1. Peace and prosperity continue among the members of the Fraternity in the British Empire; and we are still in friendly correspondence with all English-speaking Grand Lodges throughout the world that are recognized by us as regular.

2. This does not include the several Grand Lodges of Prince Hall Masons in the United States, which are unrecognized by us, not because this Grand Lodge has decided that they are illegitimate in origin, but because we must defer to the American doctrine of territorial jurisdiction that forbids us to recognize two Grand Lodges in one state. If it should come to pass, in the course of events, that our white brothers and our black brothers agree to let each group have an organization of its own — and there are signs of an approach between them — we who know no distinction of caste might then be able to recognize both.

3. Freemasonry as it exists in southern Europe is cut off from us by its political activities, and still more so by its rejection of one of the three Great Lights; nevertheless we may regret to see that it is now more than usually disturbed by political unrest, notably in Italy and Portugal, where it is in open conflict with the national authorities. Elsewhere, among those who claim to be members of the Craft the outlook generally is reassuring.

4. The readiness among Masons in Spanish America to conform to the standards of English-speaking Masons, which was mentioned in the last report of your Committee,

is still in evidence; and it should be possible to present at our next session a brief list of South and Central American Grand Lodges with whom this Grand Lodge can establish fraternal intercourse. As our commercial dealings with South America increase, such fraternal intercourse will be more and more desirable.

5. The Resolution submitted by your Committee last year, in reference to the Masonic situation in Mexico, comes up at this session as unfinished business. Friends of Masonic institutions in that country have seen with regret the failure of every effort to bring about conciliation and union between rival Grand Lodges. Your Committee, unable to recommend the equal recognition of both, and unwilling to choose between them, presents for the consideration of Grand Lodge the following Resolution, and begs leave to recommend its adoption:

Whereas, the harmony which existed between York Grand Lodge of Mexico, working in the English language, and the Grand Lodge Valle de Mexico, working in the language of the country, is and has been for years disturbed by a bitter controversy as to their respective claims to regularity and jurisdiction;

And Whereas, this Grand Lodge of New Brunswick does not wish to support the claims of either of the parties as against the other, or to appear to do so:

Therefore Resolved, that the recognition accorded by this Grand Lodge to York Grand Lodge of Mexico be withdrawn, and that this Grand Lodge do not for the present extend fraternal intercourse to any of the Grand Lodges in the United States of Mexico.

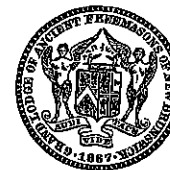

REPORTS OF DISTRICT DEPUTY GRAND MASTERS.

DISTRICT No. 2.

MOST WORSHIPFUL GRAND MASTER: In making my report for this part of the jurisdiction, I wish to express my hearty appreciation of the most excellent service rendered by a large number of the members of Keith and Tweedie Lodges. On every occasion I have been accompanied by a large number of the brethren, enabling us not only to make the visit a pleasant one, but supplying a lot of capable material for good work when required.

My official visit to St. George Lodge, No. 12, was made on Thursday, the fourth of June, when I was accompanied by Past Masters Vroom, Mitchell, Beek and Carter and Worshipful Master Odell, of Sussex Lodge, St. Stephen,

Past Masters Hiltz and Dewar of Victoria Lodge, Milltown, and Past Master Field of St. Mark's Lodge, St. Andrews. A number of other members of these Lodges were present. The Fellow Craft degree was worked by St. George Lodge in a manner reflecting credit upon the Master and his officers; after which, at the request of the officers, I had the pleasure of taking the Chair and working the Third degree with each of the stations filled by a Past Master. After work we repaired to the banquet room, where the tables were bountifully spread. During and after the banquet we greatly enjoyed listening to the singing by a Masonic quartette, consisting of members of Sussex and Victoria Lodges, who have accompanied me on several visits, and to whom I am deeply indebted. I must not forget to mention, too, songs by the newly made Master Mason, Rev. Brother Beckett, which were also well rendered and highly appreciated by the listeners.

On the second of July, I made my formal official visit to the Lodge in Grand Manan, Mananook Lodge, No. 38, and saw the Fellow Craft degree worked on two candidates by Past Master Kiscadden, acting for Worshipful Master Mann, who was unable to be present because of a death in his family. I am glad to report that the work was creditable. Mananook Lodge is working under difficulties. I have been able, with the assistance of Past Master Orchard, to visit this Lodge from time to time for the instruction of its officers; and it is satisfactory to find that our efforts have been beneficial. The meeting closed with an enjoyable banquet.

Sussex Lodge, No. 7, St. Stephen, was again visited by the officers and members of St. George Lodge, at a special meeting on the twenty-second of July; the visitors working the Third degree in a splendidly efficient manner. I took advantage of this opportunity to make my last official visit. Over two hundred brethren were present, from

Lodges in New Brunswick and Maine, thirty-two of whom were Past Masters. After work was over, a fine banquet was served. Sussex being my mother Lodge, I have visited it frequently during the year, and find that the ritual is followed very closely.

In closing this report, Most Worshipful Grand Master, I wish to express my thanks to you for entrusting the work to me a second year, and I hope I have done it in such a way as to meet your expectations. I wish also to express my appreciation to those who have assisted me; especially to the Past Masters of Sussex and Victoria Lodges, and to Past Master Orchard of Albion Lodge, the latter of whom, as above mentioned, gave me great help in my visits to Mananook Lodge. I hope and trust that my successor in office will have the same assistance that has been so freely accorded to me.
