ANNUAL MEETING

The M. W. The Grand Master delivered the following address:

**GRAND MASTER'S ADDRESS****BRETHREN OF GRAND LODGE:**

Once again we assemble in our annual communication and I extend a hearty welcome to all. It is my earnest hope that our deliberations may be of such a character that all matters engaging our attention "May be so ordered, and settled on the best and surest foundations" and that the opportunity which it affords for the exchange of friendly greetings and intercourse will inspire each of us to carry back to our respective lodges a fresher and brighter vision of Masonry.

As the world in which we live is the great workshop wherein we are taught to apply the lessons of the Lodge room, so I feel it proper to make some reference at the outset to world conditions and events which have passed on the screen since last we met. On May 6th last as citizens we joined in the general rejoicing throughout the British Empire occasioned by the celebration of the Silver Jubilee of his Most Gracious Majesty, King George V. Amid confusion and restlessness abroad among the nations— with Dictatorship and Autocracy replacing Democracy, and statesmen groping for light, the figure of our beloved king as the head of a constitutional Government stands unmoved, steadfast, firm in the affection of a devoted people. In these days of instability, and as an expression of our loyalty, it behooves this Grand Lodge of New Brunswick to place upon its record a profound sense of gratitude to Almighty God for the life and example of our most gracious sovereign.

We again meet under the shadow of depressed economic conditions with many of our fellow citizens still unable to find profitable employment and our industrial life far from

normal. There are, however, unmistakable signs of improvement but the convalescent period, I am afraid, will be a tedious one and will require much patience and perseverance. Economics has played a great part in history in shaping and moulding the character of races and nations and these periods of stress and strain which call for the best that is in a man should strengthen and improve the race. On the other hand there is no doubt that long periods of unchecked prosperity produce an artificial set of values in men's lives which sooner or later break down. Our forefathers in these Maritime Provinces, by indomitable courage and perseverance overcame obstacles, endured privations and produced a race of the stuff that has made leaders in fields of industry, science and learning all over the world. When we become impatient and disheartened let us "Look unto the rock from which we were hewn" and recalling the traditions of the past, may we too leave our marks behind us on the trail that the way may be clearer and the Goal surer for those who shall come after us.

Notwithstanding the tragedy of the Great War and its legacies of suffering and distress and in spite of the many movements looking towards International Peace, there are still threatening and rumblings of discord and unrest between Nations. We earnestly hope that the unceasing efforts of Great Britain and other Major Powers will be successful in arranging a peaceful solution of the present crisis and that the influence and Power of the League of Nations in promoting International Peace and Goodwill, will become greater and more firmly established as the years roll by.

#### IN MEMORIAM

The year as usual has brought its changes and many of our brethren have been called to a higher sphere of service. We mourn their loss. Included in the list of names I shall presently read are: R. W. George Ackman, Keith No. 23, Past Deputy Grand Master; R. W. James E. Masters,

Keith, No. 23, Past Deputy G. M., both Past Masters of Keith Lodge. They were ever ready and eager to encourage and promote the interests of the Craft and after a long and faithful service have laid down their working tools.

Past master James M. Troy of Northumberland No. 17 was a devoted and faithful Mason for sixty three years, during which time he made a very valuable contribution to the history of his mother lodge. On the occasion of the 60th anniversary of his being raised, Northumberland Lodge presented him with a congratulatory address and a silver tray suitably engraved. His faithful and regular attendance, with his counsel and advice, made him a most valuable member of the Craft and his example, both as a citizen and a Mason, will long remain with us. At the age of 92 he was called to the celestial lodge above.

With well over a hundred in attendance I was given a very warm greeting which was happily expressed and conveyed to me in the form of a beautifully inscribed address of congratulation and good wishes. which touched me greatly. The third degree was worked by W. M. C. D. Dickison and his officers in a most commendable fashion and a sumptuous banquet with rounds of speeches brought a most happy gathering to a close.

On November 6th accompanied by R. W. Past Grand Master Col. J. D. B. F. McKenzie, W. Grand Director of Ceremonies F. P. Heckbert and R. W. Senior Grand Warden W. P. Barnhill, W. Grand Steward Dickison, P. M. Geo. Iffe, I visited Campbellton Lodge No. 32, where the third degree was exemplified in its usual efficient manner. We were given a very warm welcome by the Campbellton Brethren and entertained with refreshments after work.

On November 7th the same officers accompanied me to Restigouche Lodge No. 25 where the Second degree was worked on a Candidate. There was a large attendance and I was given a most hearty welcome. The Brethren seemed keenly interested and I was much pleased with the work

of the Lodge. At the close of the proceedings we were guests at a most delicious banquet, and I came away with the assurance that Masonry in this Northern section of the jurisdiction was in a most healthy condition.

Past Grand Masters Wetmore, Wilson and other Grand Lodge Officers and had the pleasure of installing Worshipful Master elect Ralph H. Gale and his officers. It was my first visit to a lodge in the City of Saint John and the Brethren accorded me every possible kindness and attention.

On January 15th I installed Worshipful Master elect J. A. Little of The Union Lodge of Portland No. 10. Here I was again supported by R. W. Past Grand Masters Ellis, Wetmore and Wilson with a good attendance of Grand Lodge Officers. I was made to feel very welcome with the usual abundant hospitality and kindly fraternal spirit.

On March 7th accompanied by W. Grand Director of Ceremonies F. P. Heckbert, W. Grand Steward C. D. Dickison and several of the Brethren of Northumberland Lodge, I journeyed to Fredericton where with W. District Deputy Grand Master Maxwell and Past masters of Hiram Lodge I paid an official visit to Hiram Lodge No. 6. We were greeted with a warm welcome and the Lodge was our host at a delicious supper at 6.30. During the evening Worshipful Master McGibbon and his officers conferred the Second degree on a candidate. The work was extremely well done and I had no hesitation in complimenting the Worshipful Master and his officers on their splendid interpretation of the ritual.

On April 12th I visited Tweedie Lodge No. 41, Moncton. I was supported on this occasion by R. W. Past Grand Master Edgett, W. District Deputy Grand Master Leaman, W. Grand Director of Ceremonies Heckbert and W. Grand Steward Dickison and several Brethren of Northumberland Lodge. We were given a warm welcome and witnessed the E. A. degree worked on four candidates.

On June 23rd, accompanied by R. W. Past Grand Master J. D. B. F. McKenzie, R. W. Deputy Grand Master Irving and other Grand Lodge Officers, I was present at Miramichi Lodge No. 18 and attended Divine Service, and in company with the Brethren went in procession to St. Mary's Church, Chatham, where we all enjoyed an excellent sermon by the Very Worshipful Grand Chaplain Rev. W. P. Dunham. I was very much pleased with the attendance at this service, there being Brethren present from several Lodges in that section of the jurisdiction and I feel sure that the occasion cannot but bear good fruit.

On July 15th I had the pleasure of visiting Saint Andrew Lodge, Richibucto. R. W. Senior Grand Warden Barnhill joined me from Saint John and with W. Grand Director of Ceremonies Heckbert, Grand Steward Dickison, there was a large attendance from both Northumberland and Mirami-

chi Lodges, including many Past Grand Lodge Officers. W. M. Graham and his officers worked the third degree on two candidates in a most acceptable manner.

This Lodge shows vast improvement in its ritual and zeal, and those responsible are to be most highly commended. We were entertained with delicious refreshments at the close of the proceedings.

On June 2nd I held an informal conference with several of the Brethren of Blackville Lodge No. 43 in the hope that we might find a way to solve the difficulties of that Lodge and revive the Craft in that section. I am not in a position as yet to make any definite report as to whether our plans will succeed.

While I had planned to visit several other Lodges during the latter part of July and early August, unfortunately for various reasons, it was found impracticable on each occasion, so that my number of visitations is somewhat smaller than I would have otherwise desired.

I had the privilege of accepting the very kind invitation of the Grand Master of Nova Scotia to be the guest of the Grand Lodge at their Annual Communication which was held in Lunenburg on June 11th. I was given a very warm welcome by the Brethren of our Sister Province and learned much to interest me during my short sojourn. As your representative I was honored by being presented with the Erasmus James Phillips Jewel and entertained at luncheon, and I come away with the strong conviction that there should be a much greater bond of attachment between the members of the Craft in these two Maritime Provinces.

I regretted that I was obliged to decline invitations to be present at the Grand Lodge of P. E. I., at Charlotte-town on June 27th. At the Grand Lodge of Ontario at Hamilton on the 17th and 18th of July, and the Grand Lodge of Maine at Portland on May 6th.

I want to express my appreciation to the District Deputies in the various Districts for the very loyal and

efficient service they have performed. The practice of meeting the ritual committee each year and confirming the work is a splendid one and shows good results, and I hope will be continued.

My thanks to all those who have assisted me in carrying out the duties of my office. To Rt. Worshipful J. Twining Hartt, Grand Secretary who by his unflinching courtesy and attention was ever ready to help and guide. I owe much to the Past Grand Masters, and R. W. Deputy Grand Master Irving and to those Brethren who supported me on my meanderings through the jurisdiction I am most grateful.

Just one word more — We rejoice in the progress already made and the sound condition of the Craft throughout the jurisdiction, but I have been wondering if the time has not arrived when we might well consider the feasibility of going a step further. What I have in mind is some definite objective that Masonry in New Brunswick might work towards. I am thinking now especially of our younger Masons. There is a growing tendency at present to leave to the State, with its clumsiness and inefficiency, social services and obligations which were formerly discharged by volunteer effort. And in this connection let us remember that charity is the keystone of our Institution and that it is an active and not a passive virtue. My suggestion would be the appointment of a committee to survey our position, study our needs and report in due course what, if any, plans could be undertaken for the further extension and promotion of our beloved institution.

May the day come when all men shall rightly and adequately appreciate the mission of Masonry.

As to Masonic funerals — it is seldom that, on a Brother's death, application can be made for a Dispensation and the same received before the funeral. Moved by R.W. Bro. Stanley M. Wetmore, P.G.M., and duly seconded,

"That when Grand Lodge takes recess it take recess, until 7.30 o'clock this evening and that the order of business then be the election of Grand Lodge officers."—*Carried.*

R.W. Bro. George D. Ellis, P.G.M., on behalf of the Committee on Warrants, reported that the Committee had examined the records of Grand Lake Lodge while working under Dispensation since October 17th, 1934, at Minto, in the County of Sunbury. The Lodge had met regularly since that date and had conferred the Craft degrees on ten applicants, and has now a membership of thirty-three. The conditions and prospects of the Lodge were most satisfactory and the Committee had every confidence in recommending that a warrant of constitution be granted.

He moved, seconded by R.W. LeBaron Wilson, P.G.M.,

"That a warrant of Constitution do issue to the brethren who signed the original petition erecting them into a regular Lodge to be known as Grand Lake Lodge No. 47." — *So Resolved.*

"That an appropriation of five hundred dollars be made to the M.W. Grand Master to defray the expenses of visiting and instructing the private Lodges during the ensuing year."

Also Resolved,

"That the sum of fifty dollars be voted to the Library Committee to be expended in the Committee's discretion."

A grant of fifty dollars was made to the R.W. Grand Historian for his expenses — on motion of R.W. Bro. Ellis:

The M.W. Grand Master — "Grand Lodge will now take recess."

#### THURSDAY EVENING.

August 22nd, 1935.

Grand Lodge resumed labour at 8 o'clock, the M.W. Grand Master in the East, and proceeded to the election of Grand Officers.

The Credential Committee presented a further report as to the attendance of members and received the warm thanks of the Grand Master

The Sections of the Constitutions relating to elections were read and the M.W. Grand Master then appointed as Scrutineers, R.W. Bro. Horace A. Porter and W. Bros. Robert D. Magee, Warren J. Maxwell and Leonard T. Leeman, who were duly pledged to the faithful performance of their duty.

On written nomination and ballot cast, M.W. Brother George Percival Burchill was re-elected Most Worshipful Grand Master and was declared so elected amid most hearty applause.

To the Most Worshipful Grand Master: I have the honor to submit herewith my report as District Deputy Grand Master for District No. 2, for the year 1934-1935.
