The M. W. The Grand Master delivered the following address :

**GRAND MASTER'S ADDRESS.**

Brethren of Grand Lodge:

I bid you welcome to the Sixty-ninth Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge Ancient and Honourable Fraternity of Free and Accepted Masons of New Brunswick, and I trust that the proceedings may be of interest and profit to you all.

This communication brings to a close what seems to me, an incredibly short year. In the midst of the pressure of one's personal duties and obligations, the time seemed all too short to take full advantage of the opportunities for service to the Craft which lie within the compass of this high office. However, the time has now arrived when I must render an account of my stewardship.

In my address one year ago, I made reference to the spontaneous outburst of loyal affection from the various peoples of the British Commonwealth of Nations, which marked the celebration of the Twenty-fifth anniversary of the accession to the throne of His Majesty King George V. A little more than six months later, we were shocked to

learn that his brave and generous spirit had passed from this earthly sphere to the life beyond. The profound sorrow of his millions of subjects was shared by peoples of other nations and world-wide messages of sympathy expressed the great loss the Empire had sustained in his death. In his kingly and private life, he was the personification of all the manly virtues and the memory of his life as King and Emperor, husband and father, will recall him as one of the greatest rulers of History. We all unite in sincere feelings of loyalty and affection towards His Majesty, King Edward VIII on his accession to the throne, to whom we are bound by the double ties of Monarch and Brother.

#### VISITATIONS.

You will be interested to hear of my journeyings through the jurisdiction, but first let me bear tribute to the memory of those of my predecessors in office, who in earlier days taught the outlying districts of the jurisdiction their first lessons in Free Masonry. With the modern motor-car it is a comparatively simple task to make contact with the Brethren in practically every corner of the province, but lest we forget — in these days of happier conditions — let us pause and give thanks for the men who were willing to make the sacrifice of time and effort which such journeyings in those days involved. Masonry is ancient and honourable because it has given service to humanity and contributed to human happiness. These Noblemen laid the foundation — the trust is passed to us — let us keep faith.

On September 12th, accompanied by W. Bro. Heckbert, G. D. of C., W. Bro. Dickison, G. S. D. and with a group of brethren from Northumberland, Miramichi, Keith, Tweedie, Lebanon and Zetland Lodges, I visited Westmorland Lodge No. 44 at Port Elgin. The second degree was worked by Worshipful Master Oulton and his Officers in a very creditable manner. There was a large attendance of brethren and following the Degree work, we were most hospitably entertained.

On September 16th, I set out with several brethren from Northumberland and Miramichi Lodges to visit the Lodges in District No. 5, our ultimate destination being Mananook Lodge No. 38 at Grand Manan. On the first evening we were joined at St. Marks Lodge, St. Andrews, by R.W. Bro. Barnhill, D.G.M., W. Bro. Budd, D.D.G.M., and several brethren from Saint John, St. George and St. Stephen. The Worshipful Master and his Officers worked the second Degree in a very satisfactory manner. Reaching Grand Manan on the 17th, we had the pleasure of meeting with the Brethren there at Mananook Lodge in the evening. Unfortunately, the Worshipful Master and some of his

Officers were not present, but the season of the year was not the most convenient for Masonic attendance. The third degree was exemplified by the Officers of Grand Lodge. Here, as at all other Lodges we were most hospitably entertained by the brethren following the close of the Lodge and the social hour spent at Mananook afforded a splendid opportunity of getting better acquainted with our brethren on the Island. The situation of Grand Manan makes it difficult at some seasons of the year to maintain that Masonic contact with our brethren there which is so desirable, and I suggested to them that they would do well to send representatives to the annual meeting of the D. D. G. Masters with the Ritual Committee in Saint John where they would receive and carry back to their lodge, proper instructions as to correct Ritual.

On the following day we arrived at St. Stephen and made an official visitation to Sussex Lodge that evening. A candidate received the first Degree and I congratulated Worshipful Master Poole and his Officers on the excellent work. This Lodge possesses a splendid history and noble tradition in having given three Grand Masters to the Craft. At Victoria Lodge No. 26, Milltown, where we were welcomed on the 19th, the second Degree was exemplified most acceptably and following delicious refreshments we bade farewell to our brethren in Charlotte County from whom we had received the kindest welcome and true Masonic hospitality. The next day we motored to Keith Lodge, Moncton, where we found between two and three hundred Masons in attendance representing thirteen Lodges. The first Degree was worked and this occasion was a particularly happy one as the Grand Secretary was present with me and discussed the work in his inimitable manner. A sumptuous banquet brought the evening and a busy week to a happy conclusion.

On Sunday, September 22nd, by invitation of St. John Lodge, Bathurst, I joined with the Brethren there in Divine Worship at St. John's Church. The Rev. Brother J. A. Cooper preached a particularly able sermon. Upon this occasion, several members of Northumberland and Miramichi Lodges were also present.

On Thursday, September 26th, in company with R.W. Bro. Barnhill, D.G.M., W. Bro. Humphreys, D.D.G.M., and several Grand Lodge officers, I had the pleasure of meeting the brethren at Zion Lodge, Sussex. Two candidates received the second Degree and we enjoyed a most interesting and happy evening with our Sussex brethren, who proved excellent hosts.

On October 7th, with the District Deputy Grand Master and others, I was present at Alexandria Lodge, South Devon and was much impressed with the work of the Lodge in the third Degree. The attendance was large and a deep interest was very much in evidence.

On October 17th, I had the great pleasure of consecrating Grand Lake Lodge No. 47. Accompanied by the Deputy Grand Master, the District Deputy Grand Master and other Grand Lodge officers, I was greeted by a very large gathering of the Brethren, amongst whom were representatives from the various Lodges in Saint John, also from Hiram, Alexandria, Northumberland, Miramichi and St. Andrew. After enjoying an excellent banquet, we proceeded to the Lodge Room where the Ancient Ritual of Consecration was carried out in proper order and decorum and Grand Lake Lodge duly consecrated and constituted. The Worshipful Master, Alan D. King, and his officers were then installed into their respective offices following which the first Degree was worked in a manner which made us feel that Grand Lake Lodge had begun its history under most happy prospects.

On Sunday, October 13th, I motored to Zetland Lodge Shediak, where I joined with the Brethren there, reinforced by many from Moncton and Newcastle, in divine worship at the church of St. Martin-in-the-Wood. An excellent sermon was delivered by Rev. Brother J. J. Alexander, Rector of Moncton.

° On St. John's night, December 27th, I installed Worshipful Brother Ernest J. Simpson and his officers in Northumberland No. 17. On January 6th, I was present at St. John's Lodge No. 2, and had the pleasure of installing Worshipful Brother Charles H. Dearborn and his slate of officers, and on January 14th, at Hibernia Lodge No. 3, I installed Worshipful Master Gordon King Kelly and his officers. On January 21st, I visited Lebanon Lodge No. 28, Sackville, and installed Worshipful Brother Spencer Hamer and officers. At all of these installations there was large attendance and I was the recipient of bountiful hospitality.

On May 6th, I visited Carleton Union Lodge No. 8, and witnessed the third Degree worked on a candidate by Worshipful Master Pendrigh and his staff of officers. The work was excellent in every respect.

On June 9th, I visited Albert Lodge No. 34, where I was supported by Grand Lodge Officers from Saint John and Moncton. The first degree was exemplified and we were very kindly entertained after the ceremony.

On June 11th, I was present at Zetland Lodge No. 24, Shediak, to commemorate the seventy-fifth anniversary of the consecration of that Lodge. I was much impressed by the large attendance which included brethren from every Lodge in the district and from many Lodges in other sections of the jurisdiction. The business of the evening followed a banquet served in the Shediak Yacht Club, when a most interesting programme was carried out.

On June 19th, with a staff of Grand Lodge officers and brethren, I visited Hartland No. 46, where the second degree was worked in creditable form and afterwards enjoyed a social hour with the brethren. On the following evening, we witnessed Colebrook Lodge No. 39, Grand Falls, exemplify the first degree. I was much impressed with the beautifully furnished and commodious building which the brethren in this community possess. On June 21st, we attended divine service with Bethel Lodge No. 40, Edmundston, in the United Church there. The Rev. Brother J. W. Forth of Newcastle was the special preacher for the occasion and delivered a most inspiring address. There was a large attendance of brethren present.

On June 26th, I was interested in seeing Fownes Lodge No. 45, Havelock, work the second degree. Here I was again accompanied by the R.W. Deputy Grand Master, the W. District Deputy Grand Master and other Grand Lodge Officers and we were greeted by a large gathering of Brethren from Moncton, Petitcodiac and other points. The work was well done.

On July 1st, I visited St. George Lodge No. 12, with the R.W. Deputy Grand Master, where the third degree was worked. There was a good attendance of Grand Lodge officers from Saint John and Charlotte County points. We enjoyed generous hospitality from our Brethren in St. George and spent a most pleasant evening.

Stevens Lodge No. 37, Petitcodiac, was visited on July 14th. We had the pleasure of witnessing the third degree and I made special comment on the excellence of the work of Worshipful Master Lockhart and his staff of officers. There were a large number present.

On Sunday, July 26th, I attended divine worship at Dalhousie with the brethren there. The service was held in the Presbyterian Church and the preacher was the Rev.

Brother Thomas Roy, Worshipful Master of Montacute Lodge, Worcester, Massachusetts, who delivered an excellent sermon.

On August 1, I was present at Sunbury Lodge, Fred-erickton Junction, where the third degree was worked on a candidate. I was accompanied by R.W. Bro. Irving, P.D.G.M., W. Bro. Maxwell, D.D.G.M. and other Grand Lodge officers. We were given a hearty greeting and as usual were well entertained.

On August 10th, I concluded my visitations at St. John's Lodge No. 27, Bathurst. A brother was raised to the third degree and I complimented the Worshipful Master and the Brethren on the excellent character of the work. There was a very large attendance of brethren and I came away much impressed.

While this rather detailed account of my activities may seem tedious, it serves to endorse my report to you that the Craft throughout the jurisdiction is in a generally healthy condition. The mental attitude and general spirit of the brethren is eager and alert, and appreciative of the contribution which Masonry offers to humanity. There is tangible evidence of real progress in many directions, in increased number of desirable candidates and good attendance at regular communications. In saying this I am not forgetting the local problems which handicap some of our faithful brethren in other sections. As some of these difficulties have been born of the economic depression, let us hope that the more favourable prospects of recovery, at present indicated, may justify the hope that ways and means may soon be found which will lead to a happy solution.

#### HOME FOR AGED MASONS.

In my address to Grand Lodge one year ago, I took occasion to suggest that some thought should be given by you to the need for a demonstration of practical Masonry,

and asked if the time had not arrived when some action should be considered. That suggestion was referred to the Board of General Purposes who appointed a Committee to study a proposal for the establishment of an Aged Masons Home. While the committee is not yet in possession of sufficient information from the subordinate Lodges to make a report, I commend their efforts to you and ask the brethren to respond with all required information and data in order that the proposal may receive intelligent consideration.

#### PLACE OF HOLDING GRAND LODGE.

Our constitution directs that the place of holding the annual communication of Grand Lodge shall be fixed by Grand Lodge, failing which, the annual session will be held in Saint John. In view of the great changes in transportation and travelling facilities, since our constitution was framed and the fact that many of our Lodges in various sections are in a position to adequately accommodate Grand Lodge, it seems proper to me that we might well consider the advisability of an amendment to this section of the constitution, which would afford a little more elasticity by permitting the Board of General Purposes, should occasion warrant and they deem it desirable, to accept an invitation from any Lodge wishing to entertain Grand Lodge. The amendment to the constitution embodying this change, I regret to say, was not included in the proclamation and therefore cannot be properly put before you for your consideration at this annual session. I should be happy however, to have the comments of the brethren on such proposed change.

Due to the extraordinary economic situation which has prevailed and which has resulted in many of our younger people being idle at the formative period of their character, there is evidence of a growth of unsound thinking conducive to the spread of various "isms" subservient to the well being of our ordered democracy and British institutions.

I feel that Masons should avail themselves of any opportunity of combatting such modes of thought and use their influence to aid in correcting the conditions which beget them. If we are to make any impression upon the mind of today, it must be by means of education and I have wondered if it would be feasible for the Craft to issue periodically to the Brethren a publication containing articles dealing with the Mission of Masonry. Such a proposal may seem to many to be rather ambitious, but I feel that the suggestion merits consideration.

For two years you have honoured me with this high office. It has been a most happy experience and I have endeavoured to give of my best in its service. Whilst the demands have been many, I have been more than repaid by the valuable lessons of service I have learned in the fulfillment of my task. Before relinquishing the chair, I desire to thank most gratefully all those who have assisted me in my endeavours. I received nothing but the utmost kindness and co-operation from my officers and the brethren generally throughout the jurisdiction. I should like especially to mention R.W. Bro. Barnhill, who gave me most splendid support and loyalty, and W. Bro. Dickison, of my Mother Lodge, who at any time has been ready and willing to answer every demand I made upon him. To the Grand Secretary, whose unfortunate accident, which we all regret, has deprived us of his presence this afternoon, my grateful acknowledgement of many courtesies. And now the time has come to pass the gavel to my successor. May he share the same happy fellowship and find the same enjoyment in the discharge of the duties of this high office that I have.

## REPORT OF BOARD OF GENERAL PURPOSES

*To the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of New Brunswick:*

The customary meetings of the above Board, five in number, were held during the past year, and at the first meeting of the Board, held on September 26, 1935, Right Worshipful Brother Frank A. Godsoe, Senior Grand Warden, was elected Vice-President.

Right Worshipful Brothers LeBaron Wilson and George D. Ellis were requested to continue as members of the Committee of the Fund of Benevolence, and Right Worshipful Brother Stanley M. Wetmore was requested to act, as last year, for the Most Worshipful Grand Master.

Applications received by this Committee for contributions from the Fund of Benevolence numbered twenty-six and in each case, the aid asked for, after consideration, was granted. The list follows:

It has been decided by the Board that a meeting be held this year of the District Deputy Grand Masters and the Ritual Committee for instruction purposes.

In the address of the Most Worshipful Grand Master in August, 1935, a suggestion was made that this Grand Lodge Jurisdiction should create some definite objective that masonry in New Brunswick might strive toward; and when this matter was brought up at the Board meeting, Assistance to Aged Masons was suggested, and a committee was appointed to inquire into the matter and confer with the Grand Lodge of Nova Scotia.

On April 2, 1936, on behalf of the Committee appointed for the purpose of securing information relative to the proposal of establishing an Aged Masons' Home, the Most Worshipful Grand Master, G. P. Burchill, reported that the Committee on appointment, had met a Committee appointed by the Grand Master of Nova Scotia in Halifax, with a view to investigating the possibility of joining with Nova Scotia in a Maritime Home. The Committee received a very warm welcome and were given ample opportunity of discussing thoroughly all features of the proposal with the Nova Scotia Brethren.

From information obtained, it was found that the Nova Scotia Brethren had built up an Endowment Fund of upwards of \$75,000, interest upon which, together with a \$5.00 levy on every initiation throughout the Jurisdiction

and an annual assessment of \$2.00 per member, gave them sufficient revenue to support their Institution. It was found that there were twenty-eight guests in residence at the time, and that the cost on an average per annum per guest was \$600.00. A short time ago, a new fire-proof wing was erected at a cost of \$80,000 so that from a very humble start, the Home had grown and developed until now it was a most creditable achievement and a lasting work of great pride to our sister Jurisdiction. Our Committee was unanimous in their recommendation that union with Nova Scotia at the present time was too late and not now feasible as, in the first place, it would be necessary to erect a wing comparable to the one recently built, which would cost a substantial capital sum, and in addition, the Committee felt very strongly that a Home so far removed from our Jurisdiction would rob the enterprise of that local interest which means so much to the success of such an undertaking. Consequently, the Committee felt that if the project could be carried out, it would have to begin in a small way within ourselves, in our own Jurisdiction.

In view of the above report, the Committee was requested to continue and make a survey of the Lodges as to present needs and as to what the individual Lodges would be prepared to undertake, and make any recommendations to the Board which they might think desirable. In consequence of this resolution, a circular, bearing date of April 30, 1936, was forwarded to the subordinate lodges.

At the June meeting of the Board, it was suggested that the section of the Constitutions relating to seafaring men be broadened so as to include others, having in mind officials serving in various branches of His Majesty's service. An amendment to the Constitutions in connection with the above change will, in all probability, be submitted at the 1937 Communication of Grand Lodge.

them, on motion duly seconded, referred to Grand Lodge for direction and advice was, on motion by R.W. Bro. LeB. Wilson, P.G.M., seconded by R.W. Bro. Geo. D. Ellis, P.G.M., referred back to the Board of General Purposes for disposition.—*Carried.*

The Grand Historian, R.W. Bro. Albert E. Pearson, stated that, while he had no written report to offer to Grand Lodge at this time, he did report verbally that he had data on eight Lodges and work on seventeen Lodges.

#### THURSDAY EVENING.

August 27th, 1936.

Grand Lodge resumed labour at 7.30 o'clock, the M.W. Grand Master in the East, and proceeded to election of Grand Officers.

The sections of the Constitutions relating to elections were read and the M.W. Grand Master then appointed as Scrutineers, R.W. Bros. R. A. Snowball, A. H. Campbell and W. Bros. Luke S. Morrison and J. C. G. Cook, who were duly pledged to the faithful performance of their duty.

On written nomination and ballots cast, W. Bro. Guy Heston Humphrey was elected Most Worshipful Grand Master, and was declared so elected amid general applause.

Also, on written nomination and ballot cast in each case, the Scrutineers reported that the following Brethren
