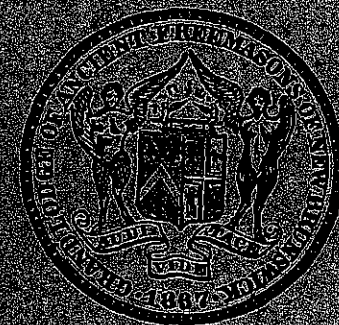

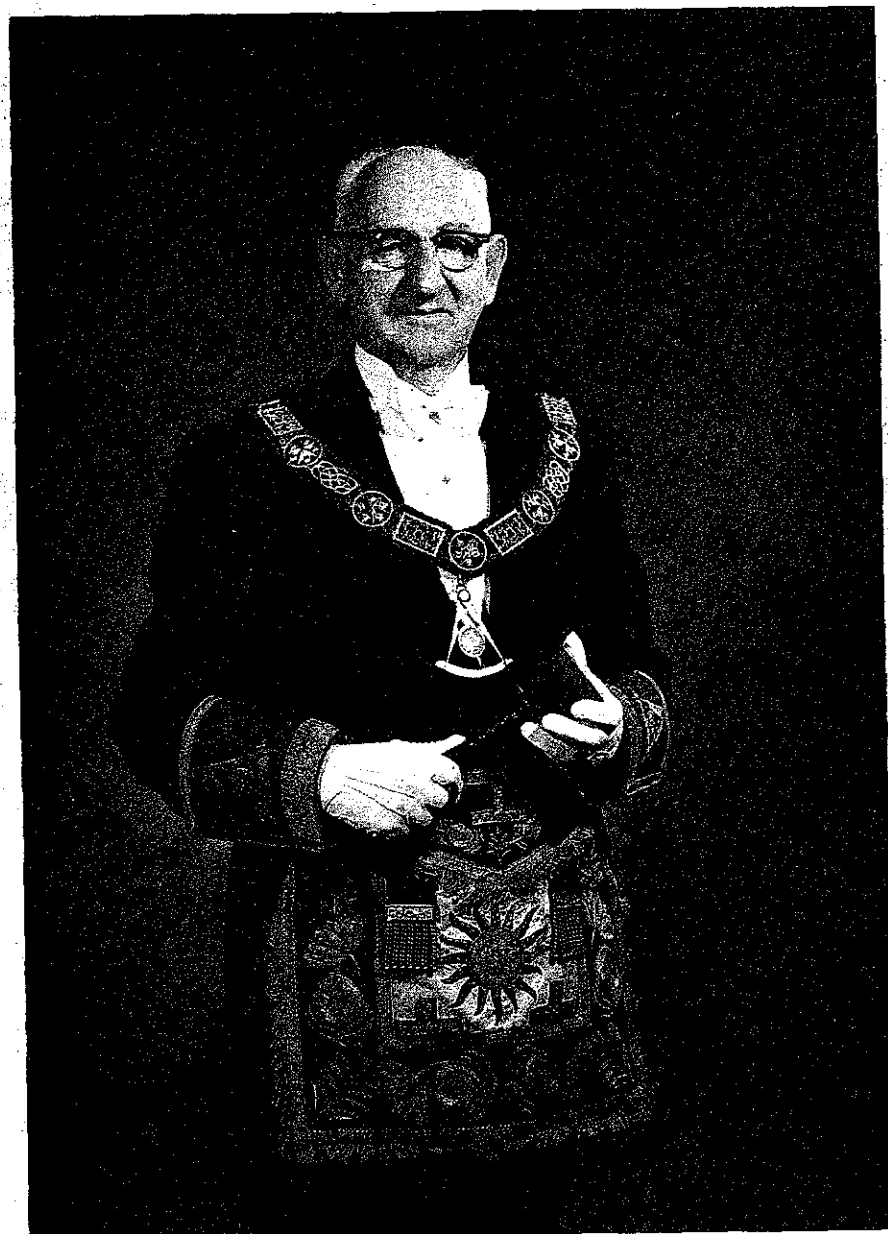

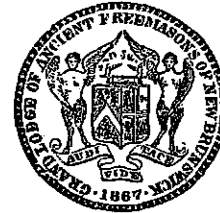

THE BENEDICTION

MASONIC SERVICE GRAND LODGE

May 19, 1972, St. John

In all thy ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct thy paths Proverbs: 3-6

One of the great objects of Solomon's life, and the one which most intimately connects him with the history of the Masonic institution was the erection of a Temple to Jehovah.

At the finish he received the worthy masons or builders as Most excellent Masters and he also acknowledged God at the dedication.

SAYING or PRAYING

"Lord God of Israel, there is no God like Thee, in heaven above, or on earth beneath, who keepest covenant and mercy with thy servants that walk before Thee with all their heart" 1K. 8-23

And he prayed for men and people and strangers that when they were in adverse circumstances if they prayed and turned toward this house

"Then hear thou in heaven thy dwelling place and forgive and do, and give to every man according to his ways, whose heart thou knowest"

It is because of his prayer of dedication asking people to turn to this place — East, why many Churches are built with altar facing East etc.

The Temple was a dwelling place for the Lord. It retained its original splendor for only 33 years. In yr. 3033 Shishak, King of Egypt, made war upon Rehoaboam, King of Jerusalem, taking Jerusalem and carrying away the treasures of Temple.

From that time until its final destruction the history of the Temple is but the history of alternate spoils and repairs, of profanations to idolatry and subsequent restoration to purity of worship. Truly a reflection of the life of a nation and also of personal life.

113 years after the conquest of Shishak, King Joash restored it to its former condition. In 3264 Ahaz robbed the Temple of its riches giving them to Tiglath-Pileser, king of Assyria. Nearly 400 years later. Ahaz also profaned the Temple by the worship of idols. In 3276 Hezekiah, Ahaz's son repaired and restored pure worship. But 15 years later he was compelled to give the treasures as a ransom to Sennacherib — Assyria.

It was in 3416 in the reign of Zedekiah that Nebuchadnezzar — Chaldean entirely destroyed the Temple. The 2nd Temple was destroyed.

The New Testament tells us that persons are the dwelling place of God. 1 Cor. 3-16 *"Know ye not that ye are the temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you."*

1 Cor. 6-19 *"What know ye not that your body is the temple of the H.G. which is in you, which ye have of God and ye are not your own"*

2 Cor. 6-16 *"... ye are the temple of the living God; as God hath said, I will dwell in them, and walk in them, and I will be their God, and they shall be my people."*

Solomon not only built the Temple but he was a great writer; being the wisest man that had lived, he wrote many wise sayings as in PROVERBS that cannot be destroyed.

"So as we are now temples of God it behooves us as Masons to instill in our minds some of Solomon's wise sayings. Pr. 3-6

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT — Writers

We often acknowledge persons because of the quality of their life, depth of character and qualities worthy of acknowledgement. As we recognize persons outstanding we should emulate their worthiness for we must make a contribution in society in which we live — a contribution of hope, love and action.

We must make an acknowledgement of self.

Take stock of ourselves, stock of society in which we live. Solomon failed in this. As an order we must have a relevance in Society in which we live; a concept of God worthy of Society.

Today we have to justify the purpose or aim for our existence as an organization. Many persons are not known or acknowledged until death.

Acknowledgement also means discernment and we so often miss the main points in life.

A class attending a private school was asked by the headmaster what passage of Scripture was read that morning. They were writing letters to their parents when asked.

Now we are quite with the passage which begins *"Remember now thy creator in the days of thy youth..."* The boys did not seem to remember but finally one of the youngest put up his hand and the countenance of the teacher brightened but not for long when the young lad said *"Much study is a weariness of the flesh."* from the latter part of Eccl. 12, which we do not use.

PROVERBS 3-6 An ancient Rabbi Bar Kappara once asked the question — *"What is the succinct text upon which all the essential principles of Judaism maybe considered to hinge."*

He answered that the first principle upon which all our hope and work may depend is the verse 3-6.

The answer can include not only Judiasm but the spiritual basis of the whole of humanity.

To acknowledge Him requires a fundamental humility. Acknowledging Him helps a man not to think more highly of himself than he ought to think.

Such an acknowledgement and humility results in the humble realization that no man has the final answer to all questions and that no person can equate his own opinions and his own judgments with those of God's.

One who follows this principle of living will be slow to inflict his views on others and equally slow in accepting the views of others as the last word from God.

How can we know that God is directing our lives. It can be only understood in the light of our trusting Him with all our heart and acknowledging Him in all our ways. The moral state of a man definitely influences his physical condition.

The body which is the temple of the H. G. should not be in any way defiled.

Acknowledging Him results in a trustful mind.

There are many human experiences beyond our capacity to explain.

Bitterness and cynicism could easily follow the tragedies and frustrations that attend the normal human life upon earth.

But one who acknowledges God trusts Him.

Time comes when the trust seems misplaced Mt. 27, 43 For one brief moment Jesus felt God had forsaken Him — "My God, My God"

Yet he could say at the last Lk. 23-46.

This is the ultimate trust of the religious mind. Acknowledging God produces **tranquility of mind**. There is comfort after one has done the best he can, to rest the case with one greater than Himself.

"A person can work as if everything depended upon him, and yet realize that finally he can commit everything to God in whom . . . Acts 17-28.

The storms of life may rock such a life but they can never or hardly upset it.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF GOD

Such a one was Hiram Abif — builder of the temple. At the opening of the day when the sun was rising in East, it was his constant custom before commencement of labor to go into the temple and offer up his prayers to Jehovah for a blessing on the work and in like manner when the sun was setting in the west.

Acknowledgement is a true concept of Jesus. We must justify our position not by size or sight, color of eyes or hair but by inward spirit. Jesus acknowledgement was responsive action, not only to see something in some other person but to appropriate that goodness and to extend it to others by example.

HE SHALL DIRECT THY PATHS. Paths so often lead to gates. Around Easter we speak of two gates: Good Friday — gate of death; Easter — Everlasting Life.

Surely these are the same gates — one seen from human point of view upon earth. The everlasting gate seen from the other side.

*Now with gladness, now with courage
Bear the burden on thee laid
That hereafter these thy labours
May with endless gifts be paid
And in everlasting glory
Thou with brightness be arrayed.*

*Let us join in the song of truth and love
Honor to her courts invites us
Worthy subjects let us prove
In our hearts enshrined and cherished
May these feelings ever bloom
Failing not when life has perished
Living still beyond the tomb.*

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF GENERAL PURPOSES

TO THE GRAND LODGE OF FREE AND ACCEPTED MASONS OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

Four Meetings of the Board have been held during the year. At the first meeting June 5, 1971, Right Worshipful Brother C. Norman Scott, Senior Grand Warden, was elected Vice President of the Board, Right Worshipful Brother Winston A. Steeves, Deputy Grand Master presiding.

The Board approved the selection of six Scholarship awards amounting to \$3,000.00 to be allotted by the Scholarship Committee.

A reprint of the Constitution and General Regulations has received the attention of the Board and subsequent to this session with proposed amendments, the matter will have immediate results.

During the year 7 sets of full dress regalia were provided for the District Deputy Grand Masters from the fund set aside in the accounts for this purpose and have been distributed.

At the request of the Estate of late Right Worshipful Brother A. G. Hoar the Grand Lodge Committee on Scholarships has been authorized to co-operate in an annual selection of a DeMolay Boy for a bursary amounting to \$100.00 to be obtained from the Albert G. Hoar Memorial Fund provided under trust.

The Committee on Masonic Culture and Information has been active and submitted extended briefs which were adopted. Accordingly 1500 copies of 4 books each have been printed for distribution. Primarily intended for initiates, the sub-ordinate lodges have been provided with 10 initial copies, extras to be supplied, on request to the Grand Secretary. Also, any Master Mason may purchase the set of 4 booklets at cost price (presently 50¢) from the local lodge secretary.

Two permanent members of the Board have been called to the Celestial Lodge in the persons of Past Grand Masters James Stanley Hoyt, August 28, 1971, and Arthur Sagar Robinson, March 3, 1972. Ever attentive to the progress of Freemasonry in this jurisdiction, their wise counsel and unswerving support was always available for the best interests of the fraternity.

Proposed amendments of the Constitution and General Regulations have been considered by the Board and recommended for the consideration of Grand Lodge.

REPORT OF THE RITUAL COMMITTEE

To The Most Worshipful The Grand Master
Officers and Members of
The Grand Lodge of New Brunswick

In making the first report as chairman of this committee, I am going to pay tribute to my predecessor who so ably filled the office from the year 1950 to August 28, 1971. He was a member of this committee from 1945 — 26 years service.

M.W. Bro. James Stanley Hoyt is and will be missed. He was an energetic and enthusiastic worker, always friendly and willing to help others. "Mr. Mason of New Brunswick" labored long and efficiently for the Craft in general and this Grand Jurisdiction in particular.

During the year five District Meetings were held and at all, representatives of this committee were present to assist with the work.

A meeting of the Ritual Committee was held on January 15th with 12 members present. The following corrections in the ritual were approved:

That there should be a Ritual Committee in every Subordinate Lodge and at least one member present at all rehearsals. He should correct all errors on spot.

The S.D. shall see that Cand's. hand is on Altar to assist in kneeling in all three degrees, also he shall assist Cand. to arise. W.M. should not go around Altar to assist.

Pages 13, 48 and 81. The W.M. should after saying "Y n o m a y f t e" show position of f by noticeably looking at them.

Pages 15, 51 and 82. S.D. should give direction in one sentence and then show Cand. how.

Page 36. Word "Intercourse" should be replaced in third line, second paragraph with the word "association" and in the ninth line with the word "conversation".

Page 51. Bro. (J) A a F c y w w y A w t r c "and Flap" turned up.

Page 71. 5th line from bottom of page T 5 G Geometry will be written in full in next printing of ritual.

Page 84. Following (Refreshment to Labor again) The W.M. shall read: "The Legend of Hiram is one of the Landmarks of our Fraternity and constitutes a most solemn and impressive portion of our ritualistic work. Nothing must be allowed to impair the deep impression which should be made upon the mind of the Cand. Accordingly there shall be no levity, horseplay, audible laughter or other noise in the room which might distract the attention of the Cand. As Master of this Lodge, it is my responsibility to see that this degree is so conferred. I sincerely ask your cooperation in carrying out this responsibility."

Page 92. S.W. should remain in his Station Chair as a way-faring man — if another brother is substituted, he may sit on the step or floor.

Page 96. At bottom of page (S.D.r hwk) "and then stands at right of Cand."

Page 98. (If only one or last Cand.) Y W N b c t t E a t b r n - w b s "Under the direction of the D. of C." (W.M. conducted to the East by D. of C. — Cand. by S.D., the D. of C. then says "face the left, forward", the Brethren will continue in procession and resume their seats)

Your committee welcomes suggestions from any of the brethren that will improve our work without encroaching on the Landmarks of the Fraternity.

Your Committee on Masonic culture and information, beg to report that following your authorization at our last annual communication, and, with the approval of the Board of General Purposes, we prepared, had printed and distributed to each Lodge in the jurisdiction ten (10) sets of four (4) Booklets each and although they were initially intended to impart knowledge and information to the candidate, yet by popular demand, it was found practical and advisable to make them available to Members of the Craft at the cost of .50¢. This brings to a conclusion this project except to impress in the strongest manner the necessity of keeping on hand in the various Lodges, a sufficient supply of Booklets that they may be distributed at the proper and appropriate time. They are readily available at the office of the Grand Secretary, free of charge for the candidates, .50¢ per set for the Members of the Craft.

The Committee attended four (4) District Meetings at which 5 of the 7 Districts were represented and it is reasonable to assume that they were able to make some contribution.

Your Committee has prepared a folder entitled "Freemasonry a way of Life." This folder has been approved by the Board of General Purposes. These folders are intended for all interested persons and are for general distribution at all gatherings where Masons and Non Masons are assembled, such as Church Services, Social events, etc. Your Committee has in hand, in script form, a regular and uniform Chapel or Memorial Service to be made use of in the Funeral Parlour or Home.

Your endorsement of the amendments to the Constitution will enable the completion of the preamble of suggested procedure before and during the Service.

If approved by the Board of General Purposes you are asked to authorize the printing in Booklet form of this Service, together with the folder entitled "Masonry a Way of Life."

REPORT OF GRAND HISTORIAN

TO THE MOST WORSHIPFUL THE GRAND MASTER,
OFFICERS AND MEMBERS OF THE GRAND LODGE
OF NEW BRUNSWICK, FREE AND ACCEPTED MASONS.

This is my first annual report, having assumed office in mid summer 1971 from our very capable grand historian, Bro. C. Alexander Pincombe, B.C., B.Ed., M.A. of Moncton, N.B.

The Fraternity and their immediate families have been severely stricken during the last year by death. To all who have sustained such a loss, we extend sympathy and understanding.

M.W. Bro. James Stanley Hoyt, Past Grand Master, passed to the Celestial Lodge, August 28th, 1971. His contribution to masonry has been tremendous and he will be remembered for many years for devoted and outstanding service to the Craft.

M.W. Bro. Arthur Sagar Robinson, Past Grand Master and an Honorary Life Member of a number of Lodges, passed to the Celestial Lodge March 3, 1972 at the age of 90. Dr. Robinson was well known for his work in the field of education, having been awarded the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws and was also well known for his contributions to numerous cultural and service organizations in his Community. He was one of the few men who have served as Grand Master of both the Masonic Order and the Independent Order of Oddfellows. He may well be best remembered for his outstanding service as Grand Historian of our Fraternity.

Immediate Past Grand Historian C. A. Pincombe in paying tribute to the late Dr. Robinson expressed most fittingly the following:

"Dr. Arthur Robinson in the course of his long and busy life was an outstanding educationist, an accomplished artist and avid naturalist and a zealous historian."

The writer notes from the archives of the Grand Historian, his many long years of research and correspondence in the interests of the Craft. Masonry is the richer for the many years of devoted and diversified public service so freely given by this outstanding citizen and Christian gentleman.

Two events of historical significance occurred during the past year:

Westmorland Lodge No. 44, F. & A.M. observed their 50th Anniversary on October 13, 1971 and on November 18, 1971 Lebanon Lodge No. 28 F. & A.M. observed their 100th Anniversary.

Westmorland Lodge No. 44 F. & A.M. located at Port Elgin first met on August 18, 1921 at the I.O.O.F Hall in the McGee building. The first official visit from the officers of Grand Lodge was on July 20, 1922 and on November 30 of the same year, the Charter was given by the Most Worshipful the Grand Master, the late LeBaron Wilson and the officers of Westmorland Lodge were installed. After some years the brethren decided the time had come for acquiring a Lodge of their own. A property was purchased by the Lodge and the work of the formation of a hall was proceeded with. Their new Masonic Hall was duly dedicated on July 17, 1930 by the late Most Worshipful G. M. Bro. Fred Edgett.

Only 18-days passed following the 50th anniversary when Westmorland Lodge sustained a severe blow by a destructive fire that occurred on Hallowe'en October 31, 1971. Fortunately, the brethren were able to save a considerable amount of regalia, furniture and lodge records and the lodge has continued to function by rental of other quarters. In the meantime, it is gratifying to learn Westmorland No. 44 have decided to erect another temple of their own. They are to be commended for their initiative and courage and we look forward to a dedication of their new quarters at some future date.

Lebanon Lodge No. 28, F. & A.M. at Sackville celebrated their 100th anniversary on Nov. 18, 1971. Ceremonies appropriate for the occasion marked this gala event at which time the Most Worshipful the Grand Master Maurice Wm. Dalton and Officers of Grand Lodge celebrated this important milestone in the history of Lebanon Lodge.

During the past year a considerable number of brethren were presented with bars, jewels or certificates marking their long service careers. This list of members is given in the Report of the Grand Master.

By the time this report is tabled, your historian will have reached the retiring age from the Public Service of Canada and it is hoped will have more time in the future to devote to the duties of this honourable office, a role that will be difficult indeed when following the footsteps of such illustrious Grand Historians as the late M. W. Bro. A. S. Robinson and my immediate predecessor and civic historian Bro. C. A. Pincombe.

REPORTS OF THE DISTRICT DEPUTY GRAND MASTERS DISTRICT NO. 1

St. Martins, New Brunswick, May 3, 1972

TO THE MOST WORSHIPFUL, THE GRAND MASTER,
FREE AND ACCEPTED MASONS OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

I beg leave to submit the following report for the past year 1971-72. I want first to thank you sir for the privilege of serving you as District Deputy Grand Master in District No. 1. I feel it a great honour to serve District No. 1 and Masonry in this capacity.

In my first year in office I visited all the lodges in District No. 1 four or five times and I have had the pleasure to enjoy true Masonic Hospitality in each lodge I have attended. It was my pleasure to accompany you Most Worshipful Sir on eight of your official visits in this District and also to take part in the installations of the officers for the year 1972.

During the past year I have witnessed 9 first degrees, 9 second degrees and 7 thirds in District No. 1, and I am pleased to say I found the work very well exemplified in all lodges.

On motion of R.W. Bro. Gaskin, seconded by R.W. Bro. Weston and adopted the sum of 75% of the unexpended balance of income of the Fund of Benevolence be transferred to the credit of Grand Lodge Account of General Fund.

NOTICES OF MOTION

The following notices of motion were introduced by M.W. Bro. Hopkins and seconded by R.W. Bro. Ingraham. Subsequent to separate presentation and discussion items 1 to 10 as noted herewith were formally adopted. Item No. 11 was an amendment referred to the Board of General Purposes for suggested corrections in wording and power of final action for inclusion in Constitution and General Regulations.

M.W. Bro. H. D. Hopkins will move or cause to be moved the following recommended amendments to the Constitution and General Regulations, approved by Board of General Purposes viz:

1. Amend S. 33, P. 58 by striking out the word "Province" in the fourth line and substituting the words "same Masonic District".
2. Repeal S. 34, P. 58.
3. Amend S. 37, P. 58 by striking out the word "Province" in the third line and substituting the words "same Masonic District".
4. Amend S. 10, P. 67 by striking out the punctuation after the word "writing" in the second line and inserting the words "and shall receive at the same time a copy of the booklet entitled 'Forward'".
5. Amend S. 16, P. 68 by striking out the word "Jurisdiction" in the second line and substituting the words "same Masonic District".
6. Amend S. 23, P. 70 by adding thereto the following sentences: "The ballot box shall have two separate compartments, clearly designated for the depositing of black and white balls. The ballot shall be distributed and taken up by the proper officers and each brother entitled to ballot shall be furnished with one black ball and one white ball."
7. Amend S. 4, P. 72 by striking out the words and punctuation "nor to Masonic burial," in the third line.

8. Amend S. 1, P. 73 by inserting after the word "own" in the second line the words "or his immediate families" and by striking out in the second and third lines the words "nor unless he has been advanced to the degree of Master Mason".
9. Amend S. 6, P. 74 by striking out the word "obtained" in the fourth line on P. 75 and inserting therefor the words "applied for, received and subsequently read at the next regular meeting of the Lodge".
10. Amend S. 7, P. 42 by striking out the words "one month" in the fifth line and substituting the words "two months" and by adding thereto the following sentence: "On receipt of any such notice of motion, the grand secretary shall forward immediately a copy thereof to the secretary of each lodge with instruction to submit same to his lodge at its next regular meeting."
11. R.W. Bro. W. J. Bambury gives notice that he will submit proposed standard worded forms for applications, investigating committees, demits, affiliations, suspensions for the approval of Grand Lodge to be included as an addenda to the General Regulations.
