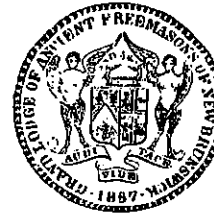

THE CONTROL TOWER OF ACTION

TEXT: HEBREWS CHAPTER 11 - VERSES 1 to 13.

"There is no more important word in the language of life, indeed our life, than the single word Faith, says Charles Sardison, "when you set it to music, you get the sound of trumpets, and the roll of drums, the clash of armour and the

rhythm of marching feet. You get a whole symphony of voices marking out the real cadence of history, breaking in now and again across the din of the world in that strong, clear way which seems to put a hush to all other sounds". Faith is the root that produces good works, the artistry of the soul that paints the dimension of heavenly things.

When you run across the word faith in the scriptures, you will find that you are being lead to a place where things are coming to pass. A sense of eagerness and expectancy is in the air, and the voice of confidence is upon the lips. By faith, the seemingly impossible is accomplished; mountains of difficulty are brought low; rough places become plain, and the glory of God is revealed. So many scenes of the unconquerable nature of faith are to be found if the life and teachings of Jesus. Said Jesus, "Have faith in God". "If ye have faith as a grain of mustard seed". "According to your faith be it unto you". "Thy faith has saved thee, go in peace". A striking example of such faith is to be found in the scene of the Centurian, who was a leader of a company of 100 men in the Roman Army. The Centurian comes to Jesus voicing his concern and affection for his servant at home who was terribly ill, so ill in fact that he cannot be moved. But great is this man's faith in the power of Jesus to bring about this servant's healing, "I am not worthy that Thou shouldn't come under my roof", Says the Roman Officer, "but speak the word only and my servant shall be healed. I am a man of authority having soldiers under me, and I say to this man, go, and he goeth, and to another, come, and he cometh, and to my servant come and do this and he doeth it". This officer was confident that the word and spirit of Jesus could do the healing. When Jesus heard what the Centurian had to say and realized the faith of the man, he marvelled and said unto the others, "Varily I say unto you I have not found so great faith, no not in Israel".

In coming to the Grand Lodge this evening was indeed an act of faith. We were one half hour late in leaving Moncton as my friend, Wor. Bro. Garth Elliott was in jail. He was taken from work and placed in jail in the Moncton Mall by the Little League Football Association. I had to wait, as we were driving to Saint John in his '67 Pontiac, and to show that I put my faith in action, to drive a car of that age I wanted Wor. Bro. Elliott along and he is the Service Manager of Lounsbury's Motor Division in Moncton.

Why then is faith so important? It is important because without it everything stands in the way of recovery in life. Faith is

the Control Tower of Action. Faith is the heart-beat, the nerve-centre, the spiritual blood-transfusion of the soul.

Where does faith begin? Well, Faith begins where all the best part of the Christian vocabulary begins with confidence and conviction about God. There are many people in our world today who are anxious and afraid because the story of their lives is played against the background music of the newspapers, the television, the radio, or the endless fears, tensions and insecurities, and superficialities of this twentieth century. Many of these people come to believe in the evil but not in the good. To them fears are more substantial than faith, and doubts more to be relied upon than convictions and beliefs. And what a negative and self-defeating and finally disastrous philosophy of life this can be. On my first pastoral charge on the Cabot Trail, Cape Breton I lived on what I called God's Little Green Acre and every now and again from my study window I could look up on the mountain from where the water came that we used for drinking in our home and I would also every now and again take a walk to the top of that mountain when problems seemed to be too large and I wanted time to think. And then I would look around and beyond the little place from whence I came, and how small my problems seemed now in the higher and wider perspective. And this is exactly what takes place when confidence and conviction about God are mountain-tops from whence you look down upon life. But then secondly, faith is a quality which is to be cultivated. Faith is a tender plant. The ground in which it is to be planted is to be cared for and the roots are to be watered. Faith is like an ear for music or a taste for literature, it is an instinct that depends upon development. It grows by contagious contact with fellow-believers; it is increased by richer and fuller experiences with God: it is enlarged by private and social worhsip in prayer and song. It is here brethren, that I want to say a word about the Mason and his Church. In my seventeen years as a Master Mason I have met many a good Mason, but I have never met one who wasn't also a church-man too. While a member of St. Andrew's Lodge No. 7 in Sydney, Cape Breton, one of the Masters always had placed on his notices, "Brethren, attend the church of your choice on Sunday". Would to God, that every Masonic Lodge notice in the Province of New Brunswick, and indeed throughout the world of Masonry, would contain the same word of advice. Do not disgrace our fraternity by neglecting your church. Your comittment as a churchman will never fail to increase your obligation as a Mason. A little book that was given to me early in my ministry was written by Henry Sloan Coffin entitled "The Joy of Believing". Dr. Coffin in this book says, "That an unexpressed faith will die of suffication, while utterance intensifies experience and leads to a fresh expression. The instinct for the unseen is developed by exercise".

We do not believe today that faith or confession of God are unessential, or that faith is ever made strong through neglect or indifference. Faith is alive only as it is cultivated. Some one has said, "You can never know the sea if you just take a cottage on the shore, you have to get out into the deep where the waves are born. And you can never really know the meaning of faith until you get into those deep places of life where God is, where you count on him alone to give the meaning, to show the way, to set the step. Thank God for faith that is articulate, that stands up and is willing to be counted; that does not forget its heritage of prophets and saints and martyrs. One day the wife of Robert Lewis Stephenson went into his bedroom, when he'd been forced to put aside his writing materials so that she might check the flow of blood he was coughing away through pain. "I suppose you will tell me that it is a glorious day", said his wife. "Yes", he replied, "Strange comment isn't it, but I was just going to say that". Then looking into the sunlight streaming in through the window, Stephenson continued, "I refuse to let a row of medicine bottles be the circumference of my horizon".

It is good to ask ourselves every now and again the question, What is the circumference of my horizon? Has anything notable or worthy happened to my faith? Faith is a quality to be cultivated. Is it deeper and stronger today than it was ten, twenty or even thirty years ago?

Who are the people who do not want to see our fraternity dominant and strong, powerful and all embracing? Who are the people who are hesitant about the Christian Church and who act as if though they are afraid that too much might be done for it and for the cause of Christ in the world? Who are the people who would be indifferent to human need and to the defeat of evil? Who are the people torn apart by inner conflict and judgements, people who dig in their heels and who refuse to tap into the Control Tower of Action. Faith? Well, who ever they are, at least the holy writings in which our fraternity believes so strongly, leaves these persons behind and will move ahead under the power of those who are willing to look at the future with faith. What a noble company they are, Christ, and Peter and Paul and the others. "Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen", and then the writer of the epistle to the Hebrews goes on to call the roll of the heroes of faith, "By faith Abel offered unto God a more excellent sacrifice: by faith

Enoch was taken up that he should not see death: by faith Noah was warned of God: by faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out not knowing where he was to go: by faith Moses endured in seeing him who was invisible.

It is a great thing to see people really using and living by this faith. The historian, Samuel Elliott Morrison, tells us, "That at the end of 1492, most men in Western Europe felt exceedingly gloomy about the future. Christian civilization appeared to be shrinking in area and dividing into hostile units. Institutions were decaying, and many intelligent men, for the want of something better to do, were endeavoring to escape the present through studying the pagan past. The Nuernburg Chronicle, dated July 12th, 1492 figured that the world would come to an end in 1493. And yet even as these gloomy fears were being circulated, a sailing vessel named "Nina" scudded before a winter's gale into Lisbon with the news of a discovery that was to give older Europe another chance. Christopher Columbus not only made a new discovery, he rescued Europe from the dark moods of defeat and pessimism. In a few years the whole mental picture changed, new hopes and dreams came to life. And the change over Europe was complete and astounding. It is impossible to estimate how great the world is indebted to the faith of Christopher Columbus.

In any reading of history, one thing appears plainly to be true, the man of faith is served best the agent which he has lived and not the man of doubt or defeat. The man of faith does not know all the answers and no one is better aware of it than himself, but the man of faith has this advantage and it is great. He knows that in God an answer exists and that it can be found. Do not ask faith in the living God to stand still. Do not ask our fraternity to be content with its self. For this fraternity will move ahead only as we zero in on The Control Tower of Action.

On completion of the service the Most Worshipful The Grand Master expressed the appreciation of the brethren for the courtesy extended to them by V: W: The Grand Chaplain. Moved by R: W: I. D. Steeves and seconded that V: W: Rev. W. A. McCarther's address be printed in full in the proceedings. Carried.

THE STATE OF THE ORDER

It was my earnest hope that at this Communication I could report to you that this jurisdiction had finally reached the turn-around point in our membership statistics. It is not to be. However, some satisfaction may be derived from the fact that this year we have the smallest decline in membership for some number of years. Of particular note is the drop in the number of suspensions.

In the matter of suspensions, this has always been a most melancholy part of the business of a lodge for me to listen to. It is regrettable that we should spend so much time and

energy in the making of a Mason and then have it all come to naught by reason of suspension. Before a member is suspended, all efforts must be directed toward retaining his membership. The Master, Secretary and a brother closely associated in private life with the brother under consideration for suspension, should make a determined effort to keep the member in good standing.

The outlook for our next Masonic year appears to be very promising. The Lodge notices are reflecting a good number of candidates coming forward to join in our fraternity. Some Lodges that have not had any candidates for a number of years now have not one but several candidates under instruction. Let each one of us say: "I will do something to make Free-masonry attractive to men". No one Mason can do it all alone; together we may achieve many things.

Now let us consider Lodge Notices. Let us think firstly of the matter of cost; the time required by the Master and the Secretary to write up the contents, the time that the Secretary spends in having the notices printed, folded, placed in envelopes, addressed, stamped and mailed; the cost of printing, envelopes and stamps.

And secondly, think about your own Lodge notice and ask yourself this question: "Is my Lodge Notice giving me my money's worth?" Quite frankly, some notices leave much to be desired. Notices have been sent out with the time and place shown, the Lodge name and by whose authority; that is all! From that low, the quality rises until the notices are miniature news letters of past, present and future happenings in the Lodge, past masters are listed, committees are shown, when degree work is to take place the candidates' names are shown. That point alone shows that the Master knows what has to be done. I have gone to Lodges in which programs were carried out that were interesting to me. Nothing about these programs was included in the notices. Think about the number of members that might have attended had they known about the work of the evening.

There is some good news though; since the start of 1978 several lodges have upgraded the standard of their notices and this must be reflected in the attendance and interest in the Lodge.

In going around the Lodges, I have been impressed with the leadership in the Craft Lodges, not only in our own Lodges but in the part played in community life. This leadership in public affairs is most beneficial to our Order. Every Lodge should carefully consider the selection of the officer who will one day be the Master of that Lodge.

In going around the Lodges, it has been my intention to bring Grand Lodge closer to the Lodges and thus effect better communications. Communications are most effective when information and ideas are flowing in both directions between Grand Lodge and the Lodges. We, the members of this Grand Lodge are the ones that must open and keep open the channels of communications with the Craft Lodges.

FELLOWSHIP

During my visits to the Craft Lodges, I have nearly always mentioned fellowship. To me, fellowship is the essence of our fraternity. It is necessary that we have a business meeting, carry out degree work and some programs. For the most part this involves the officers of the Lodge, and the brethren sit around the sides with little to do. Nothing gives me greater pleasure in the Lodge than to sit around the table at lunch and listen to the sounds of men's voices enjoying each other's companionship. Masters of Lodges should arrange their meetings so that ample time is made available to the brethren for fellowship.

To the Officers of this Grand Lodge and to you, the members of this Grand Lodge, I have always appreciated the support and attention you have given to me when I have been amongst you. Your friendship is most esteemed by me.

Let me urge you to widen your fraternal circles by visiting other lodges. The warm reception that you will receive will far surpass the time and effort taken by you.

Here is a poem by Leigh Hunt that comes back from school days past:

ABOU BEN ADHEM

About Ben Adhem (may his tribe increase!)
Awoke one night from a deep dream of peace,
And saw within the moonlight in his room,
Making it rich, and like a lily in bloom,
An angel, writing in a book of gold;
Exceeding peace had made Ben Adhem bold,
And to the presence in the room he said,
"What writest thou?" — The vision raised its head,
And with a look made of all sweet accord,
Answered, "The names of those who love the Lord".
"And is mine one?" Said Abou, "Nay, not so",
Replied the angel, Abou spoke more low,
But cheerily still; and said, "I pray thee, then,
Write me as one that loves his fellowmen".

The angel wrote and vanish'd. The next night
 It came again, with a great wakening light,
 And show'd the names whom love of God had bless'd
 And, lo! Ben Adhem's name led all the rest.

May the Supreme Architect of the universe be with you
 all, my brethren, and guide your paths to the temple of
 Happiness.

REPORT OF THE RITUAL COMMITTEE

TO THE MOST WORSHIPFUL THE GRAND MASTER,
OFFICERS AND MEMBERS OF
THE GRAND LODGE OF NEW BRUNSWICK, F. & A. M.

The Ritual Committee in bringing their report for the year 1977-1978 to this Grand Lodge wish to report as follows:

1. That no particular subject has been presented for the consideration of the Committee.
2. That we are presently attempting to find and correct all mistakes in the Ritual so that necessary corrections can be made in future editions. Your Committee would very much appreciate any help the members can give in this regard and ask that any mistake noted be drawn to their attention.
3. For the last two years this Grand Lodge has given consent and approval for the holding of Semi-Public Installation of Officers in Craft Lodges under certain conditions. The Board of General Purposes meeting on March 11, 1978 has again, by motion, recommended that Semi-Public Installation of Craft Lodge Officers be permitted for a further period of one year provided they be conducted by the Grand Master or a Past Grand Master delegated by the Grand Master and that the work must be done entirely from memory. Your Committee concurs with this resolution and would recommend that it receive the approval of this Grand Lodge.
4. Only three of the seven Districts have held District meetings during the year.

District No. 3 Campbellton September 24th.
District No. 5 St. Stephen November 1st.
District No. 1 Saint John November 23rd.

These three Districts were also the only ones to hold meetings in the previous year. No District meetings have been held in Districts 2, 4, 6 or 7 for the last two years. Each year the Ritual Committee stresses the importance of holding these meetings in every District; it is emphasized at the District Deputies meetings held each year and, as well, the Grand Secretary in a letter to the District Deputies dated June 14, 1977 stated in the first paragraph of his letter in part as follows:

"You are aware you are expected to hold a District meeting in your District each year". May we again urge the D.D.G.M.'s to recognize the importance of holding these meetings and assure them again that the Ritual Committee stands ready at all times to assist them in any way possible. We ask only that we be consulted in advance as to time and place and the type of meeting you wish to hold in order to arrange suitable times and to avoid other conflicting engagements.

5. I would not wish to close this report without paying tribute to a member of this Committee who served with dignity, devotion and distinction from 1959 until September 1977 when he passed to the Grand Lodge above. Most Worshipful Past Grand Master William John Summerville was a mainstay of this Committee and his dedicated service will be most difficult, if not impossible, to duplicate. To his wife Gladys we extend our heartfelt sympathy and share deeply in her loss.

CULTURE AND INFORMATION REPORT TO GRAND LODGE MAY 13, 1978

Most Worshipful The Grand Master
Distinguished East,
Members of this Grand Jurisdiction and Brethren all;

It is indeed a pleasure for me to have the privilege of reporting to this body on behalf of your Culture and Information Committee. For each of us it has been an honor to have had a part of the activities of this Committee.

It is with regret that we too take cognisance of the passing during the past year of the original Chairman of this Committee M.W. Bro. William J. Summerville, P.G.M. It was through his foresight and efforts that the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick commenced activities in the distribution of Masonic information other than from a ritualistic nature. We respectfully pay tribute to this great Mason.

The structure of this committee was altered during the past year and we appreciate the talents of each of the members added in the persons of M.W. Bro. B. Earle Ross and Wor. Bro. David D. Dalzell.

During the year in review your committee members have been active at each District Meeting in disseminating instructions and information to the Craft Officers and leaders at the district level. Due to long distances of travel it is not possible for each committee member to be present at every District Meeting. However we do attempt to have representation at every District Meeting and to contribute to the benefit of the study session.

In August 1977 your full committee met in Boiestown at Landmark Lodge with the Wardens and presiding officers of the Craft Bodies in this jurisdiction and gave instructions on lodge programming and planning as well as the proper conduct of meetings. This activity appears to be favorably accepted and it is our opinion that lodge meetings are better planned and confidence is evidenced in the conduct of debate at the lodge meetings.

Instructions to the members in recommending prospective candidates for initiation and the subsequent investigation of petitioners was prepared and distributed to each lodge through the Grand Lodge Secretariat. These instructions were ap-

preciated by the Investigating Committees and thus provides for some assemblance of uniformity for this lodge activity.

Assistance was given Alexandria Lodge in the preparation for their Centennial Anniversary in February. This took the form of a review of the Degree Examinations of Craft Masonry as presented in the original exposures of Masonry in the early eighteenth century.

Your committee has also been active in having the material in this Grand Lodge Library catalogued and preparations inaugurated for the purchase of new material and the establishment of the Quinn Circulating Library. Consideration has been given to the method in which books will be released to members in the jurisdiction and recommendations for staffing will be in direct proportion to the demand for literature. Until such need indicates additional staff is required no recommendation is herewith subscribed. We do realize that most of the literature available in the library at the present time is quite ancient and that we have fallen behind in the purchase of current Masonic books and publications. It is therefore recommended that this committee be authorized to inaugurate a purchase plan for literature of a Masonic nature. It is further recommended that a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars be allocated in the current years budget for this purpose.

We again recommend that this Grand Body become a member of Correspondence Circle of Quatuor Coronati Lodge No. 2076 in London England.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE GRAND HISTORIAN

TO THE MOST WORSHIPFUL, THE GRAND MASTER,
OFFICERS AND BRETHREN OF THE GRAND LODGE OF
FREE AND
ACCEPTED MASONS OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

While presenting my report last year, the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of New Brunswick was writing a page in it's own history.

The one hundred and tenth annual communication of our Grand Lodge was in itself, a milestone in our Masonic History. Campbellton Lodge No. 32 was in its 100th year, and this communication was a part of their celebration.

What a way to commemorate a centennial anniversary!

What a marvelous way to celebrate a birthday!

At the invitation of Campbellton Lodge, the Grand Lodge moved to Campbellton on this occasion. After all, it was no farther to travel from Saint John to Campbellton than it was to travel from Campbellton to Saint John. M.W. Bro. Ross taught us that point the preceding year when the change in venue was considered.

Despite the inhospitable weather, with it's chill and drizzle interspersed with heavy rain and thunder showers and the copious amounts of snow still visible on the hills, the reception that we received in Campbellton radiated the warmth and friendliness that is so typical of this northern New Brunswick community.

The Grand Lodge communication opened on Friday evening, May 6th and recessed after the Service of Worship to a reception at the Sugar Loaf Ski Lodge at Atholville on the outskirts of Campbellton to which our wives had all been invited. Then we spent the next few hours mingling and getting to know one another, renewing old acquaintances and meeting new friends.

Following the morning session Saturday, we again returned to the Sugar Loaf Ski Lodge where the Grand Master's luncheon was served. All enjoyed a superb meal and listened to our guest speaker, M.W. Bro. W. E. Moseley, past Grand Master of Nova Scotia and Honorary Past Grand Master of New Brunswick.

In all, the communication must be considered a spectacular success and praise should be heaped upon R.Wor. Bro. Gordon Prichard and his committee for their endeavor.

Later in the year, again as a part of their centennial year celebration, Campbellton Lodge No. 32 hosted the annual District No. 3 meeting after which the brethren and their ladies assembled for a banquet and dance at the Campbellton Junior High school.

To further enrich the year with historic events, Alexandria Lodge No. 33 in Fredericton commemorated it's centennial year on February 25, 1978 at an emergent communication. The Grand Master M. Wor. Bro. Blake A. Oulton, accompanied by the officers and members of Grand Lodge were in attendance. The Lodge room was crowded with many of the brethren having to sit on the steps in the east.

The program at Alexandria Lodge included the rereading of the minutes of the communication of the Lodge of February 28, 1878; the rededication of the Lodge by V.Wor. Bro. Rev. Alvin Hawkes, Past Grand Chaplain; the dedication of new gold officer's regalia; the presentation of a new Masonic Altar Bible (the gift of Devon Chapter Order of Eastern Star); and the presentation of a pair of new ashlar. A most unusual performance was observed when Rt. Wor. Bro. Dale Steeves directed a demonstration of ancient ritual drawn from one of the earliest written Masonic exposes on record. Bro. James Hemlin acted as a candidate for examination on all three degrees.

Following the communication, the assembled brethren retired to the Masonic Temple on Prospect Street for a banquet, during which R. Wor. Bro. Leslie J. Brewer presented an outline of the history of Alexandria Lodge.

And finally, on April 22, 1978, Keith Lodge No. 23 in Moncton commemorated its 125th year during an emergent communication at the New Brunswick Community College. On this occasion a degree team from Caribou, Maine returned a visit by the Keltic degree team the previous year. Keith Lodge received the gift of a trowel from Caribou Lodge and also a set of working tools to be held in trust for the Keltic degree team. The communication was followed by a banquet at the Moncton Lion's Senior Citizens Centre at which the ladies were in attendance and still later by a dance.

During the year our Grand Lodge was deeply saddened by the death of three distinguished Grand Lodge officers, namely, Most Wor. Bro. G. Percival Burchill, the most senior of our past Grand Masters, Most Wor. Bro. Wm. J. Summerville, Grand Master in 1967-68 and Rt. Wor. Bro. T. Giles Allow, our most recent Grand Secretary, whose early retirement was precipitated by ill health.

Into my hands have come additional copies of the Bunting Diaries, part of a daily account of the events in the life of our first Grand Secretary and later Grand Master. There are still more volumes being copied and they will, in due time, come into our possession. These diaries are a rich treasure, not only in the Masonic life of this distinguished brother, but also in the day to day life of a vigorous citizen of his time, covering a period of over 30 years during the last half of the nineteenth century. Hopefully, these diaries will be properly indexed in the months to come so that their material may be easily referenced by both scholars and general readers alike.

I had the pleasure of representing you, Most Worshipful Bro. Oulton and this Grand Lodge at the emergent communication of Albion Lodge No. 2, Quebec City, in which they celebrated their 225th anniversary. Originally constituted as a military lodge under the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of New York in 1783, they subsequently returned to Woolwich, England following the settlement of the terms of independence for the United States. While in England, they obtained a charter under the Grand Lodge of England (Ancients) and later still, took advantage of the opportunity to purchase an earlier warrant which had become vacant, thus dating their history back to 1752 (a practice which was not uncommon at that time). Eventually the regiment was reposted to the garrison at Quebec City and the Lodge has remained in that city since that time.

The Lodge was rededicated by M. Wor. Bro. Green, Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Quebec, who was accompanied by his Grand Wardens and Grand Director of Ceremonies. Among those in attendance whom you might know, was Wor. Bro. A. M. Libbey now resident in Fredericton, and the most senior past Master of Albion Lodge No. 2 present on that occasion.

In a different view, as I have been reading through our historical material available, generally speaking, I have found many references to minutes and official records of meetings of

our Lodges. There appears to be little material available that tells us about the people who have held the important Grand Lodge offices let alone the past master of our Lodges in general. No doubt the researching for material regarding some of our earlier brethren may be extremely difficult but hopefully, not impossible. This is a demanding task and certainly too ambitious to be accomplished by one historian. But it is noteworthy that, of the 49 Lodges in the jurisdiction, only 3 of these Lodges have taken the opportunity to appoint an official Lodge historian. This comment is not intended to suggest that none of the other Lodges are concerned. To the contrary, I note with interest, that, for instance, Howard Lodge and Hiram Lodge have both featured presentations of historical material as part of their Lodge programs, during the past year. I know too, that Campbellton Lodge and Alexandria Lodge have made a great effort during their centennial year to document their respective histories. It is with interest too, that I note that there are some Lodges which have made great efforts to assemble a collection of the photographs of their past Masters. This too, is highly commendable, but I come back to the importance of having on record an account of who these men were, what they have done in Masonry and for Masonry, and also in their own communities. For some more recently chartered Lodges this should be extremely easy - after all, most of their past masters are still living. For others, it may be harder since many of these men have passed away; but among many of your senior members are Masons who still remember those who have gone before them. Now, then is the time to start accumulating this information if it has not already been done. Possibly a means of co-ordinating such an endeavour could be accomplished at the District level. I encourage the lodges to consider the possibility and to organize a history committee, if one does not already exist.

In my first report to you, I listed a number of publications of historical articles made available by the Canadian Masonic Research Association, which have been lost from our Grand Lodge collection. I requested that any brother who may have or know the whereabouts of copies of papers numbered 1, 12, 16, 49, 50, 55, 67, 71, 74, 75, 77, 108, 113 and 114 and who no longer wishes to keep them in his possession to forward them to me so that the collection may be completed and bound. As yet, I have received no reply and I am quite anxious to complete this project.

Finally, Most Wor. Bro. Oulton, I call your attention to two important events forthcoming in the very near future.

Firstly, I recently had the great pleasure to visit V. Wor. Bro. N. Franchetti, a past Grand Chaplain (1938) who is living in a Senior Citizens complex in Edmundston in which city he was Rector for 43 years. He is now 99 years old and will be celebrating his 100th birthday in December. He is very bright and alert and would appreciate a visit from any brethren passing through Edmundston. Secondly, in the not too distant future, the Royal Bank of Canada will be erecting a new building at the head of King Street in Saint John, N. B. on the site of the earliest Masonic Temple in Saint John. I request your direction to approach the Bank to request them to permit this Grand Lodge to erect a plaque to commemorate the historical significance of that site to us.

Motion to recess until the hour of 2:00 p.m. was adopted. First order of business - The election of Grand Lodge Officers. During the noon luncheon Most Worshipful R. E. Davies of the Grand Lodge of Canada in the Province of Ontario was the special speaker and delivered a most inspiring address.

Baird that this Grand Lodge Communication direct the Board of General Purposes to investigate the possibilities of suitable recognition of V: W: Cannon Franchetti of this Grand Lodge on occasion of his 100th birthday in December of this year. Motion carried.

Moved by R: W: I. D. Steeves seconded by V: W: J. D. McKenna that allocation of funds for the Grand Master's - All Canada Conference be left with the Board of General Purposes - Carried.
