- Gr. Chaplain O come, let us sing unto the Lord: let us heartily rejoice in the strength of our salvation.
- Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving, and show Gr. Lodge ourselves glad in him with psalms.
- Gr. Chaplain For the Lord is a great God, and a great King above all gods.
- In his hand are all the corners of the earth: and the strength of the Gr. Lodge hills is his also.
- Gr. Chaplain The sea is his and he made it: and his hands prepared the dry land.
- O come, let us worship and fall down: and kneel before the Lord, Gr. Lodge our maker.
- Gr. Chaplain For he is the Lord our God; and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheep of his hand.

THE MASON'S POWER SUPPLY

SCRIPTURE LESSON: Philippians 4: 4-9

1958 in the town of Springhill, N.S., twelve men were trapped at the 13,000-foot level of the old No. 2 Mine. For seven days the workmen dug their way through the debris hoping for more life to be found. On the seventh day, a pick pierced a fourinch compressed-air pipe, thereby establishing a line of communication between twelve men who were trapped in the bowels of the earth and the outside world that was anxiously awaiting word of their survival. In much the same way, we are to think of the measureless importance and necessity of prayer. Without prayer, man has no line of communication between himself and the outside world of God. Without prayer, man is utterly and completely alone on this little outpost of the universe called "Earth". Prayer is the line of communication with the most high. Prayer is the person-to-person call between God, the Father and man, the son. Prayer is the deepest thrust within ourselves and the furthest thrust outside ourselves in search for truth about life and destiny. Praver is the human soul in touch with the Lord of all being, the source of all power, the creator of all purpose and meaning in life. When a Mason kneels at the sacred altar, he is opening the door upon what is meant to be the most significant relationship and experience that is possible to know.

Understood from this point of view, it is small wonder that some have said that the greatest things in life are given to only those who pray. A number of years ago now, when Peter Wust,

one of the great philosophers of modern Europe, lay dying after a long illness, some of his students asked him to set down his final reflection on life. In answer, he wrote, "the magic key is not reflection as you might expect from a philosopher, but it is prayer. Prayer, as the most complete act of devotion, makes us quiet; makes us objective. A man grows in true humility in prayer; prayer is the final humility of the spirit. The greatest things in existence will only be given to those who pray. In suffering, one learns to pray best of all." When we pray, we link ourselves with the inexhaustible motive power of the universe. We ask that a part of this power be appropriated to our needs. Even in asking, our human deficencies are filled and we arise strengthened and repaired. Likewise, William Law declared, "He who has learned to pray, has learned the secret of a holy and happy life.

Of course, prayer means a variety of things to a variety of people. There are those who pray spasmodically and almost foolishly, somewhat as the little girl who wasn't feeling well and who swallowed a whole bottle of vitamin pills in one gulp, hoping for remarkable and immediate results, only to find the results somewhat different from what she had anticipated. Then there are those who pray only in an emergency as a person might use the escape door in an airplane. O God, Save me. Others use prayer as a person driving their car with the brakes on, hoping for an answer but holding back their own progress at the same time; burning up their own energy and unwilling to let go of their own sin. Still others, almost seem to believe that in prayer it is possible to twist God around the little finger or to get results in much the same way as when 35 cents is put into a Pop Machine. Our whole concept of prayer has suffered a great deal from human handling. At times, it has become as cheap and unworthy as trinkets and images of Christ in a Variety Store compared with the actual value and significance of Christ.

Let us go further and deeper. When you or I kneel at the sacred altar and want the power of prayer, the first thing to do is make ourselves aware of a presence. To be sure, all us of live in the presence of God all the time. We have no existence apart from God at any time. Yet just the same, we forget this fact and are not always thinking about it. This is not to say that we should be always thinking about it. I do not believe that God expects us to be thinking about Him all of the time any more than any human parent expects their son to be thinking about them all the time. There are occasions when the son needs to stop and think of the father. And there are also occasions when the

man needs to stop and think and be aware of the presence of the Great Architect. As someone has put it, "prayer is not to get something, but to be with someone". Prayer is not begging God to do something for us. Instead, prayer is permitting God to do something which in His boundless love and mercy He already wants to do for us and for others. Jesus made this truth clear about God and revealed it most vividly by His death upon the cross. Mankind can never ask God to love him more than He is loving, or care about what He is already caring. Through prayer, all of us are helped to understand how near, how great, how unfailing, how essential to everything else is this healing, forgiving, all-encompassing love. To pray is to be aware of a presence in order that this presence may in love and mercy be permitted to do what He already wants to do.

To this fundamental thought and concept of prayer, let us now add these suggestions. In the first place, the Mason's Power Supply comes in strength not our own. How often prayer is offered at a bedside or in a home where there is sorrow or a special need. On such occasions, one thing is plainly evident. The help that is to be seen and the new confidence and courage, the new sense of peace and hope, is not human help. It is man simply opening a door through which God is given a better chance to take over.

In the second place, the Mason's Power Supply comes in the assurance of sins forgiven. Often nothing stands in the way of the blessing of prayer more than our own sins. Prayer is power in our lives in direct proportion as we are honest with ourselves, and get the sins out of ourselves. "Forgive us our trespasses, when as we forgive those who trespass against us". There is no person who does not need help both in his own forgiveness of his own sins, and in the forgiveness of those who have sinned against him. And yet there is nothing in this world that is better than prayer to break down the old walls and cleanse the human heart. God can do tremendous things with us if we are willing to let him do things with us. Prayer helps us do things that we cannot do in any other way. Help from prayer comes in the assurance of sins forgiven.

Thirdly, the Mason's Power Supply comes in quietness in anxiety. Four years ago when I was doing some work on our cottage, especially in the little girls' bedroom, I found myself struggling on a very warm day in July with trying to put insulation in a 9-inch panel that would normally take 15 inches of insulation. It was warm. I was working hard and I was wanting to

get outside. Our little four-year old girl came into the bedroom. I completely ignored her. She saw my difficulty and I heard the little voice say, "God, will you help daddy?" I turned around, took the little girl on my lap, and gave her a kiss. Help from prayer does come in quietness in anxiety. In Lloyd C. Douglas' novel, "The Big Fisherman", a Roman officer prays for Peter's life but Peter is condemned to die. "I have prayed for you, Peter," exclaimed the Roman officer, "but it hasn't done you any good." "Oh yes, I am sure it has", replied Peter, "I haven't been afraid".

To pray may not always to be find that circumstances have changed, or problems and difficulties removed, but it can be to find a new calmness and peace in the midst of them. How many have discovered the wondrous and glorious meaning of the words of Christ in those moments when prayer has been the fervent spirit of their heart. "Peace I leave with you. My peace I give unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid."

Fourthly, the Mason's Power Supply comes in direction of action. By this we mean action that is twofold, that which is on the part of God, and that which is on the part of ourselves. For example. God's answers to prayer often comes in unexpected ways. We pray, for instance, for a certain virtue. But God seldom delivers Christian virtues all wrapped up in a package and ready for use. Rather. He puts us in situations whereby with His help we can deliver those virtues. Henry Ward Beecher told of an elderly woman who prayed for patience and God sent her a poor cook. Thus answers which God gives to prayer may be in ways which we are unaware of at the time. But beyond this let us be sure that we want our prayers answered enough to also make some effort on our own. While serving on the north shore of the Cabot Trail in Cape Breton, a story was told that years ago a father and his two sons were caught in a fishing boat off the rugged coast, a storm came up, and when it looked like all was over, the father put his arms around his sons and said, "over on the shore, there is a little Scottish woman praying for the safe return of her husband and sons. To the oars, boys, let's help her get that prayer answered."

And so it is for our prayers for our fraternity, for peace in the world, and justice, our prayers for right human relations and the overcoming of crime and delinquency. The power of prayer comes in the direction of action. And certainly the effect of prayer is not to inform God of something He does not already know. We may be sure that God knows all about what is going on in this world, understands it far better than we do, knows what the real needs are before we ever put in our call. Prayer is to help us discover that there is another pair of hands to join with hands in what needs to be done. Prayer is to help us discover that God's concern is even much more than our own concern. Prayer is to help us see that in our own strength, ways of righteousness and peace may be impossible but that in His strength nothing that is right or necessary is impossible.

And finally, the Mason's Power Supply comes at last and most of all through surrender. There are planes flying our airways today that are equipped with a radar system that locks the plane on the target in the dark. And one writer has described this as a million dollar description of prayer in fifteen cent front page words. Prayer is a spriritual radar system that locks the soul on to the target, which is God, and keeps it there even in the dark. Prayer helps the soul to surrender and to direct its course even when its course is uncertain. Notice how beautifully St. Paul says that in his letter to his favorite friends at Philippi. "My God shall supply all your needs according to His riches and glory by Christ Jesus. Be careful for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving, let your request be made known unto God and the peace of God which passes all understanding shall keep your hearts and mind, through Christ Jesus.

It is with my distinct pleasure, that I am able to report to you at this Communication that this Grand Jurisdiction has finally reached the turn-about point in our membership statistics. For

the first time in many years there is an increase in our membership. It is not a large increase but it is a start in the return of our Order to greater acceptance in our communities. I am indeed proud that the increase has occurred while I was your Grand Master.

However, this is not a time for anyone of us to cease our efforts to promote the well-being of our private Lodges. This is not a time to be resting on the oars but to keep pulling steadily, so that our ship Fraternity, will sail forward into the future. Let each brother strive to make his Lodge a better place to be so that others may wish to join our ranks.

The outlook for the next Masonic year seems to be very encouraging. The Lodge notices are indicating a steady flow of candidates applying for membership in our Fraternity. Now each Lodge must work to reduce the loss of members through suspensions, withdrawals and demits so that the Lodges continue to grow.

In the matter of Lodge notices, there was an improvement in many of the notices during the past year; in format as well as contents. However there are still some notices that require some thought and development. Those Lodges would benefit from a better notice being prepared to inform the brethren of what is taking place or will take place in the Lodge. An improved notice will be one step toward the betterment of your Lodge.

On occasion I have talked to a Lodge about "Freemasonry's Candles" and the allusion to "Masonic Light". We need to keep our light of Freemasonry so shining that men will be attracted to our Order, seeking the light, because they have seen our way of life. I challenge each Mason in this Grand Jurisdiction to send forth their light that no one may stumble because of the darkness.

During my time as your Grand Master, it was often that many days and nights were spent away from home. It was indeed fortunate that my wife, Irene, understood and supported my endeavours on behalf of our Grand Lodge. She has been patient and considerate when personal and sometimes home affairs have been set aside that I may carry out some Masonic duty.

A highlight of the Masonic year was the sixteenth Biennial Conference of Grand and District Grand Lodges, A. F. & A. M., of Canada which was convened at Saint John in mid-February. All of the Grand Masters, Deputy Grand Masters and Grand Secretaries along with the District Grand Masters were present on this occasion. As this was the first time that the Conference had been held east of Montreal since its founding, it was an historic event. Our Grand Jurisdiction was the host Grand Lodge

and has received many compliments on the excellent arrangements for the meetings, accomodations, reception and banquet. This was a very worth while conference and the topics selected for discussion were considered to be timely and appropriate. Chairman for the Program was Right Worshipful Brother I. Dale Steeves. Your Grand Master was President of the Conference.

Immediately following this Conference your Grand Master and Grand Secretary went to Colorado Springs to attend the Conference of Grand Masters and Grand Secretaries of North America. This Conference was largely attended with some excellent addresses presented. Again problems that beset the whole fraternity were considered.

FELLOWS'HIP

I must stress once again what I consider to be the essence of our brotherhood and that is Fellowship. It has been my privilege to be in all your Lodges twice and in some cases more than that. On all occasions I enjoyed your fellowship and an opportunity to break bread together.

Also I would encourage each of you to visit other Lodges. Exchange of freternal visits between Lodges is increasing and is an excellent manner of spreading fellowship. Any brother will be well rewarded by the warm reception received.

My appreciation is extended to the Officers and members of this Grand Lodge for your kind attention and support while I was with you. I value your friendship.

These lines of verse emphasize in a special way the value of fellowship. There is an appropriate title.

REPORT OF THE CULTURAL & INFORMATION COMMITTEE

May 12, 1979

Most Worshipful The Grand Master Distinguished East. Brethren All:

1979)

It is a pleasure for me to report to this Grand Lodge on the activitites of your Cultural and Information Committee for the past year.

As I reported to you last year the Senior and Junior Wardens had met with the Committee that previous summer in conjunction with the District Deputies. At that time they were instructed as to their responsibilities upon "Approaching the East". A similar meeting was not conducted during the summer of 1978. However your committee does recommend that similar instructions to the current wardens in the Craft Lodges be resumed this year. The District meetings have been attended by various members of this committee whenever possible. We recognize that the greater portion of time allocated at the District meetings is taken up with local issues and the maintaining of uniform standards as to the ritual of the various degrees. We do suggest for your consideration though that more emphasis on ritual be the responsibility of the District Deputy in the various craft lodges throughout the year. The instructions to the District Deputies would be given during the summer seminar; thus allowing for greater dissemination of Masonic material during the district meetings. During the year your committee was actually involved in establishing the program and assisting in the arrangements for the Biennial Grand Master Conference which was held in this city during the month of February. It was, I believe, a distinct honor to have such an august body of Masons assemble here in this room for the first time East of Montreal.

Five papers of Masonic interest were presented and discussed at the two day conference. It was gratifying to see the evidence of such interest in this conference by the attendance of large numbers of masons from the Jurisdiction. I am certain that everyone attending was enriched through this Masonic experience.

Activities on the establishment of the Quinn Library have progressed throughout the year and a Library committee was appointed by the Grand Master and the Board of General Purpose at its March meeting. Details of the Library Committee efforts will be reported to this Grand Lodge by that Committee. This committee would pay tribute on the death of one of its principle supporters throughout the years in the person of Most Worshipful Past Grand Master Albert Coleman Lemmon. At the time of the establishment of this Committee within our Grand Lodge, M.W. Bro. Lemmon was one of the king pins in its foundation and since that time he has always encouraged and provided materials whenever necessary for the smooth operation of the Committee. Our sympathy is extended to his widow and daughter.

Most Wor. The Grand Master this I believe is the tenth year of the operation of this committee and is therefore somewhat of a landmark. Hence it might be appropriate to remind the brethren of the availability through our Grand Lodge Office, of some of the materials which have been provided for the craft lodges, by this Committee. First we have the various monitor booklets for the candidate, four in all. I would hope that each lodge is using these and presenting each to the candidate at the appropriate time. "The Officers Manual" is an absolute must for every senior officer and an excellent starting point for information for each officer. Many lodges would have better officiated meetings if the master would thoroughly study the instructions contained therein. I am certain that our Grand Secretary would be pleased to suppy a copy of this book on request. "Approaching the East" is similar instruction to the officers manual and should be investigated particularly by those Senior Warden's who are looking at the East next year. The pamphlet "What is Freemasonry" has been widely distributed to and accepted by the general public. It is probably time that the information herein should be revised and updated.

The "Duties and Responsibilities of an Investigation Committee" has created considerable interest and should be carefully perused and available in each craft lodge for the use of members appointed to that committee.

Several Lodges continue to use an old issue of the memorial service, while it is not required that the new Funeral service be followed. It is however suggested that consideration be given to following that format. It was approved by this Body a few years ago.

And now M.W. since your current Chairman has been a member of this committee since its inception, seemingly so many many years ago, I would therefore request that the incoming Grand Master not appoint me to this committee for the ensuing year.

During the course of the next year each lodge will receive instructions through this Grand Lodge office on acquiring on a loan basis any of the books which are currently held in the Quinn Library. Listings of Books will periodically be distributed to each Craft Lodge.

During the next year it is the hope that the Quinn Library Committee will become actively involved in the activities of the Library. Probably next year the Committee will be in a better position to more fully report on and assess the Library requirements of this Grand Lodge.

The M:W. The Grand Master is very much aware that the Board of General Purposes has done a great deal of soul-searching and has had a great deal of discussion with regard to the very generous bequest of the late William G. Quinn.

The bequest principal is approximately \$312,000.00 of which \$45,000.00 is invested in Investors Syndicate with the interest accumulating, and the remaining \$267,000.00 is invested with an average interest rate of more than 9%.

As the Finance Committee appointed by the Grand Master and the Board of General Purposes, it is our strong recommenation that the following action be taken with regard to the Quinn Trust Fund:

1. The Capital Fund remain intact and the interest only, to be expended on Grand Lodge Projects as approved by the Board of General Purposes and Grand Lodge. This capital fund to be administered and invested by the Finance Committee appointed by the Grand Master and the Board. 2. No portion of the Capital or Interest to be utilized for the General Administration Expense of Grand Lodge.

- 3. That a Quinn Library be set up and financed with the interest from \$30,000.00 of the bequest, said Library to be established in the present Board Room of Grand Lodge quarters in Saint John. The Library Committee appointed by the Grand Master and Board of General Purposes would administer the Library functions and purchase publications for this Library, and for sending regular Masonic Publications to each Craft Lodge in the Jurisdiction.
- 4. That a grant of \$250.00 be made to each Lodge in the Jurisdiction, these grants coming from the interest on approximately \$127,000.00 of the bequest. Before another year a review would be made with a further recommendation forthcoming for the following year.
- 5. Recognizing that our late Brother Quinn was very interested in Scholarships it is also recommended by this Committee that income from \$110,000.00 be used for Scholarships to students in post-graduate training and in fields such as biochemistry, biology, medicine or other branches of the human sciences which would greatly benefit mankind. It is also recognized that the funds currently used to provide for Masonic Scholarships may soon be required to finance general expenses of Grand Lodge. It is therefore recommended that Scholarships and research be included and to be Administered by the Scholarship Committee.
