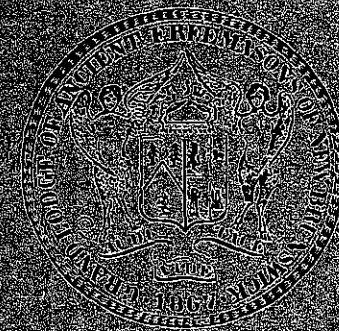

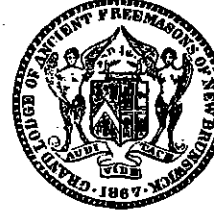

Rt. Wor. Bro. I. D. Steeves will move or cause to be moved that in the last paragraph under Fees on page 76 of the 1977 Edition of the Constitution and General Regulations of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick be amended to read Five Dollars (\$5.00) instead of Two Dollars (\$2.00).

September 29, 1979

An Especial Communication of the Grand Lodge of the Ancient and Honorable Fraternity of Free and Accepted Masons of New Brunswick was held on September 29th 1979 at 10.00 a.m. in the Masonic Temple, Saint John, New Brunswick with the Most Worshipful Brother Clarence Fleming Carter in the East and same was opened in ample form at 10.05 a.m.

Most Worshipful Brother Clarence F. Carter welcomed the brethren and advised them of the reason for calling this communication and asked each member of Grand Lodge to vote according to his conscience.

Rt. Wor. Bro. J. B. Flewelling then presented the motion to revise the Per Capita Tax from two dollars to five dollars after a preamble written by Rt. Wor. Bro. I. Dale Steeves who had to leave for Africa on September 24th and therefore the motion was made as follows:

Moved by Rt. Wor. Bro. J. B. Flewelling that the last paragraph under FEES AND DUES page 76 of the 1977 edition of the Constitutions and General Regulations be amended to read as follows:

For every member each Lodge shall pay towards the fund for Grand Lodge purposes, five dollars (\$5.00) per annum.

Motion was seconded by Rt. Wor. Bro. J. G. Girvan after recommending to the members of Grand Lodge the necessity of this increase.

On the question - three other members confirmed the thinking of the mover and seconder of the motion.

The Credential Committee was then requested to report, after which it was reported that 150 members were present and after the Most Worshipful Brother Carter thanked the Committee for their work proceeded to put the motion to the vote. Motion was carried by a vote of 131 to 19.

The business for which this especial communication was called being completed, the Most Worshipful the Grand Master closed the meeting in ample form 11.35 a.m.

**WHAT DOES THE LORD REQUIRE OF YOU?**

Old Testament Lesson: Micha 6: 6-8; New Testament Lesson 1st. Corinthians 13

Text: "He has showed you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord Require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God."

What does it mean to do justly, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God? Or to be more specific, What does this text have to say to us as Masons?

Some of our members would say: "It means to attend lodge, pay your dues and be a reasonably law abiding individual. These things are good, but I think it means more than that. The Lord Requires more than that.

Our Ancient and Honorable Fraternity is judged by those outside our fellowship by the way we conduct ourselves. We are judged by our honour or by our lack of this necessary virtue.

What does it mean "To do justly?" Every student of law knows how necessary yet how difficult the quest for justice has been and continues to be. If you were not born in the "right" place and if you do not have the "right" colour skin, your chances for success are very slim. This statement for the most part, is valid in our country. It is completely valid in the "Third World" out there where injustice is "the order of the day."

A few weeks ago the front page of our church bulletin showed the picture of a cave. On the back page was a title "How some people live" followed by a few words of explanation. Let me read them to you?

In a crude cave carved by hand out of a sand cliff lives a lesson in world development. Once upon a time this family had a small but relatively comfortable house on a coffee plantation in Brazil.

But now they are desperately needy. The husband is unemployed, and not likely to find a job, being untrained, unskilled and uneducated.

Without savings to buy a house, without income to pay rent, they settled in a squalid slum on the outskirts of the Brazilian city of Curitiba, beside a stinking little river black with sewage. And because they were late comers, all the packing cases, the smashed billboards, the wrecked trucks, the cardboard cartons, the sheet metal, had already been salvaged by their neighbours to build their shacks. So this family had to dig a cave in a cliff, to have a place to live.

It sounds like a classic case of need for development aid, and it is. But development doesn't just mean charity for someone else, "somewhere out there." We, too, had an unintentional hand in that family's move from house to cave.

Everyone knows Brazil grows lots of coffee. When the price of beef soared in North America, many Brazilian landowners discovered they could make bigger profits exporting beef rather than coffee - and improve their country's balance of trade at the same time. So they switched. But beef needs fewer employees - perhaps one person compared to 20 for coffee. Suddenly these extra people lost their jobs, and homes, and had no where to go but to the cities, to compete for the few available jobs.

Multiply this situation by thousands and you get a small vision of the misery that afflicts the majority of God's family, our brothers and sisters, on Planet Earth.

One of man's eternal questions is, "Why must the innocent suffer?" One answer is that in the eyes of big business, the Multi-Nationals, dollars are more important than people. The Multi-Nationals are greatly assisted by unscrupulous citizens of Third World countries who are ready and willing to sell their own people into economic slavery. I don't think the Good Lord will put all of the blame on our shoulders. Most of us will never see the board rooms where the big decisions regarding world trade are made. So what can we do to bring justice to a hurting world? We can't do it all, but, we can do a little. Every Church has special funds that are set up for the purpose of helping those who have no champion. If the greed of our system is causing misery to our brothers and sisters let's show these people that all Canadians are not "tarred with the same brush." Let's show them that the light of God's love is not completely ex-

tinguished. As someone has said: "It is better to light a candle than to curse the darkness."

As followers of the High and Eternal Father, as fraternal brothers, we are required to work toward justice for all men.

### **"What Does It Mean To Love Kindness?"**

Kindness and Justice are closely related. Did you ever see a true follower of God who was stingy, mean, as tight as the bark on a tree?

A true follower of God and of the teaching of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, simply cannot be mean.

Right Worshipful Brother John A. Rogers, read that beautiful portion of scripture, First Corinthians 13: that ends with the words: "So Faith, Hope, Love, abide these three, but the greatest of these is Love."

If we have this love of God in our hearts, kindness will flow forth from us like living water and we can be a blessing to all we meet.

### **What does it mean "To walk Humbly with your God.?"**

One bad habit we have is that we pay too much attention to the man who is a success and too little attention to the man who is not. In James 2 we are told the story of the man with gold rings and fine clothing coming into a place of meeting and been ushered to a good seat. A poor man in shabby clothing comes and he is told to sit on the floor. James tells us this is wrong. The poor man may have been a righteous person and the rich man a rogue. They were judged by outward appearances. God judges what is in a man's heart. Please do not misunderstand me. There is nothing wrong with making a success of your life. It would be great if we could all be successful in our respective fields. What is wrong is if success causes us to lose our humility. If we forget that it is God who gives us the power to get wealth.

Luke tells us of the two men who went up into the temple to pray, One a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee prayed "God I thank thee that I am not like other men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week, I give tithes of all that I get.

But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even lift up his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast saying, God be merciful to me a sinner.

Jesus tells us that the tax collector went down to his house justified.

The Pharisee, the pompus ass (and ass, means donkey, in case you think I am swearing), went home no better for his self-centered, self righteous prayer.

I have met many Masons and most of them were good men. I have met some Masons who were in the Order for what they could get out of it. Some Masons were men of humble means, others were well heeled.

The Mason who impressed me most was not rich, or famous, or was he an eloquent speaker. But he was a man who lived the kind of life a Mason should live. He was a loyal husband, a loving father, a good friend and neighbour. I am speaking of our late Brother, Frederick F. Bishop of Brookville, Past Master of St. Martins Lodge # 30.

Fred was a humble, gracious man who remembered his obligations as a husband, a father, a friend and as a Brother Mason.

Our Masonic Service at the funeral home was conducted by the present Worshipful Master of St. Martins Brother George R. Wilson. About one hundred Masons gathered to pay their final respects to a Brother who knew what the Lord required of him and who lived his life accordingly.

We all have been influenced by Godly persons. A Brother who is true to our Masonic principles can exert an influence that will outlive his earthly body.

In the same token a Brother who takes short-cuts with the Commandments of God can exert a negative influence that hurts not only himself but everyone associated with him, including his Masonic Brothers.

Let me close with my text: "He has showed you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God." Micah 6:8
