
Figure 1. A photograph of the surface of a sample of Fe_3O_4 .



On March 28th 1981 an emergent communication of the Board of General Purposes of the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of New Brunswick was held due to the death of our Most Worshipful Grand Master Clarence Fleming Carter March 24, 1981. At that meeting a resolution was passed as follows:

Moved by M:W: M. S. Speight PGM seconded by M: W: B. A. Oulton PGM -

1. That due to the untimely passing of our Grand Master this Board of General Purposes shall declare the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, F. & A.M. to be in a period of mourning until a new Grand Master has been elected and installed at the next regular communication of Grand Lodge.

2. That in accordance with Section 3, Page 43 of the 1977 Edition of the Constitutions and General Regulations that this Board confirm that the Deputy Grand Master, R:W: Brother Gordon W. Coffey shall be the Acting Grand Master until a new Grand Master has been elected and installed, and

3. That each Lodge in this Grand Jurisdiction shall be officially advised of the passing of our Grand Master and of the action taken by the Board in this regard and that they also be informed that it will be in order, if they so desire, to consider the draping of their Charter for the period of official mourning.

The Masons of this jurisdiction have lost a dedicated and valuable member of the Fraternity of Free and Accepted Masons of New Brunswick. As Grand Master Most Worshipful Brother Clarence Fleming Carter showed great concern for the Craft and possessed energetic plans for the future and his passing will be a great loss to our Fraternity.

From the Masonic Brethren of this Grand Jurisdiction and the members of the sister jurisdictions may we extend sincere sympathy to the family on their unexpected loss.

BLESSED ARE THE PURE IN HEART — Matthew 5; 3 f

"Blessed are the pure in heart." That is what Christianity is about, that is its message.

We begin of course with the "heart". The gospel of Jesus Christ is concerned about the heart: all its emphasis is upon the heart. Read the accounts which we have in the Gospels of the teaching of our blessed Lord, and you will find that all along He is talking about the heart. The same is true in the Old Testament. Our Lord undoubtedly put this emphasis here because of the Pharisees. It was His great charge against them always that they were interested in the outside of the pots and platters and ignored the inside. Looked at externally, they were without spot. But their inward parts were full of ravening and wickedness. They were most concerned about the external injunctions of religion; but they forgot the weightier matters of the law, namely, love to God and the love of one's neighbour. So here our Lord puts this great emphasis upon it again. The heart is the whole centre of His teaching.

Our Lord put the emphasis upon the heart and not upon the head. "Blessed are the pure in heart", he does not command those who are intellectual, His interest is in the heart. In other words we have to remind ourselves again that the Christian faith is ultimately not only a matter of doctrine or understanding or of intellect, it is a condition of the heart. The Pharisees you remember were always ready to reduce the way of life and righteousness to a mere matter of conduct, ethics and behaviour. How this gospel of Christ finds us all out!

What is meant by this term, "the heart"? According to general scriptural usage of the term, the heart means the centre of the personality. It does not merely mean the seat of the affections and the emotions. It includes these two but it is also the centre of man's being and personality; it is the fountain out of which everything else comes. It includes the mind, will and heart. It is the total man; and that is the thing which our Lord emphasizes.

Then, secondly it emphasizes that out of the heart comes most of our problems. You remember how our Lord put it, "Out of the heart proceed evil thoughts, murders, adulteries, fornications,

thefts, false witness, blasphemies". The terrible fallacy of the last hundred years has been to think that all man's troubles are due to his environment, and that to change the man you have nothing to do but to change his environment. To put it another way, take any problem in life, anything that leads to wretchedness; find out its cause, and you will always discover that it comes from the heart somewhere, from some unworthy desire in somebody, in an individual, in a group or in a nation. All our troubles arise out of this human heart which, we are told by Jeremiah, is "deceitful above all things; and desperately wicked: who can know it?" We need to be aware that education alone does not make a good man. A man may be highly educated and yet be a wicked person. The trouble is the heart and the heart is desperately wicked and deceitful.

We now come to the second term. "Blessed" are the pure in heart. We have just been looking at the human heart but man cannot make himself a Christian, you can see God only when you are pure in heart and we have seen what we are by nature. What the gospel of Christ proposes to do is to bring us out of the terrible pit and raise us up to the heavens.

What does our Lord mean by a pure heart? The psalmist says, "Unite my heart to fear thy name". Later on in the sermon on the Mount Jesus says, "If therefore thine eyes be single, thy whole body shall be full of light. But if thine eye be evil, thy whole body shall be full of darkness." The trouble with us is our divided heart. One part of us wants to know God, to worship Him and please Him but another part wants something entirely different. Paul the apostle expresses it this way, "For I delight in the law of God after the inward man: but I see another law in my members, warring against the law of my mind, and bringing me into captivity to the law of sin which is in my members." Romans 8. The psalmist seems to say, "Unite my heart to fear thy name". "Make it one", he seems to say; "make it single, take out the pleats and the folds, let it be whole, let it be one, let it be sincere, let it be entirely free from any hypocrisy."

Perhaps we can say that having a pure heart is to be like Jesus Christ Himself, who did no sin, neither was guile found in his mouth, perfect and spotless, pure and entire.

To be pure in heart means to keep the first and great commandment, which is, "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind." We should live to the glory of God in every respect.

To know God is to desire God - to desire Him is to love Him and serve Him.

But how can I see God? "God is light and in Him is no darkness at all." Only those who are like Him can see God and be in His presence. That is why we must be pure in heart before we can see God. You remember what happened to Moses, on one occasion God took him aside and placed him in a cleft of a rock and said He was going to give Moses a vision of Himself but he could see only his hinder parts.

Jesus said, "He that hath seen me hath seen the father, and I and my father are one." Scripture itself does not attempt to give us an adequate conception of the being of God. Why? Because of the glory of God. Our terms are so inadequate, and our minds are so small and finite, that there is a danger in any attempt at a description of God and His glory. All we know is that there is this glorious promise that, in some way or other, the pure in heart shall see God. The promise is partly fulfilled here and now. Christian people can see God in a sense that nobody else can. Now we see through a glass darkly, but then we shall see face to face. "Beloved, now are we the sons of God," John says, "and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is."

We need a clean heart to join with David in the prayer, "Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me."

God alone can cleanse our hearts - the holy spirit can enter into us and cleanse it for us. We must be born again after the Spirit.

Paul's confidence was this, that "he which hath begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ".

God is at work, He is dealing with me, and my heart is being cleansed. God has set His hand to the task and He is doing it. James says, "Draw nigh to God and He will draw nigh to you."

**REPORT OF THE BOARD
OF GENERAL PURPOSES**

TO THE GRAND LODGE OF FREE AND ACCEPTED MASONS OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

The Board of General Purposes held four regular meetings and one emergency meeting during the year.

On July 5th the S.G.W. William Sherrard was elected Vice-President with the D.G.M. G. W. Coffey presiding as President. It was agreed that special travelling regalia should be provided for the Deputy Grand Master and new cases for the regalia of the District Deputies. It was agreed that this Grand Lodge should withdraw support of the Old Grand Lodge of Belgium and lend support to the new Grand Lodge of Belgium. A committee of the D.G.M. and R.W. Bros. Haley and Flewelling was appointed to consider and bring in recommendations as to design and awarding of a medallion to be known as the William G. Quinn Memorial Medallion.

On October 4th it was decided that Grand Lodge in 1981 would be held in the Keddy Hotel, Moncton, on May 8th and 9th. The Quinn Medallion Committee presented suggestions regarding the design and awarding of same and the Grand Secretary was instructed to obtain quotations on the price of such medallions.

On January 3rd plans were discussed for Grand Lodge. An auditing committee was appointed. The design for the Quinn Medallion and the method of awarding were approved as follows: One per district on the recommendation of the District Deputy for the next three years. Then three per year for the jurisdiction. Recommendations are to be made to the Grand Secretary by March 1st each year with the final decision as to awards to be made by the Awards Committee of Grand Lodge.

On Feb. 28th plans for Grand Lodge were discussed at length and finalized. The purchase of a new adding machine for use in Grand Lodge office was approved. The Grand Master informed that he would be visiting the Grand Lodge of Ireland and Grand Lodge of England during the following week.

On March 28th an Emergent meeting was held in Saint John to weigh the situation following the death of our Grand Master and to consider action to be taken. R.W. Bro. William Murray was appointed chairman of a committee with power to add to contact the Keddy Hotel and finalize Grand Lodge plans there. It was agreed

the planned Saturday night May 9th dinner and dance should be cancelled and that the special invited speaker for that occasion should address Grand Lodge immediately after the Saturday lunch break. A delegation of Grand Lodge members are to attend the unveiling of a plaque on April 9th at 7.30 p.m. in the new Royal Bank building commemorating the site of the first Masonic Hall in the City of Saint John.

Moved by Rt. Wor. Bro. G. Coffey seconded by Wor. Bro. S. MacDonald that the reports of the Board of General Purposes and Directors Meetings be adopted and received, and presented in full in the minutes. Motion carried.

To the Acting Grand Master, therefore, I wish to express my sincere thanks and appreciation for the opportunity of occupying this office for the past two years. During my second year in office, as might be expected, it became much easier to organize and get things done.

A district meeting, held on November 15, 1980, and hosted by St. George No. 12, proved most successful, with all Lodges in District No. 5 represented. A team comprised of officers from several Lodges presented a program covering various sections of the ritual work providing many areas for discussion and instruction. The late Grand Master, and other Grand Lodge officers were in attendance at this meeting, including the Grand Lodge Ritual Committee, demonstrating, as usual, their keen ability to detect errors, and diplomacy in making corrections.

It has been my pleasure to accompany the late Grand Master on all his visitations to Lodges in this district during the past year, and also to represent him at several memorial services, and the annual church service. On behalf of Grand Lodge, I also presented a 60 year bar, and three 50 year pins and certificates.

I have been able to visit all Lodges in my district on more than one occasion, and all except one are maintaining an active schedule, with degree work going on as required, and some efforts are being directed toward providing Masonic education for members as time permits. The culmination of these efforts was reached on November 8, 1980, when our late Grand Master, accompanied by the Grand Masters of Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island, plus several Past Grand Masters, led the Keltic Degree Team, and a party of Masons and their wives, totalling approximately one hundred people, to Grand Manan where the Master Mason Degree was exemplified on two candidates by this colorful group. The Masons joined with the Royal Canadian Legion in a large Remembrance Day parade and church service before returning home. The impact of this demonstration of Masonry will be felt by many and will live in the memory of those who took part, for many years to come.

During the year, several visits to Lodges outside my district added interest and meaning to Masonry, especially the dedication of the new temple by Landmark Lodge No. 51 in Boiestown. It is at events such as this that real fraternal fellowship is found.

In conclusion, I would like to express my sincere thanks to all who have assisted me throughout my term of office; also for the courtesies and encouragement which have been extended to me. I shall be forever grateful to our late Grand Master for my appointment, and the opportunity it has given me to serve and broaden my knowledge in Masonry.

NOTICES OF MOTION

Rt. Wor. Bro. C. Jarvis approached the Grand East and withdrew his motion to delete Section 3 Page 40 of the 1977 Constitutions and General Regulations of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick.

Moved by Right Worshipful Bro. B. G. Boutilier and seconded:

(1) That Section 6A, page 37 and Section 18, page 39 of the Constitutions and General Regulations of the Grand Lodge be deleted, and the following new Section 18 be adopted:- 18. (a) Every brother who has been regularly installed and served at least one (1) year as Master of a Lodge within this Grand Lodge jurisdiction shall be eligible for every elective office in Grand Lodge. Any brother of the jurisdiction may be elected as Grand Chaplain or Grand Tyler.

(b) That any qualifying brother who considers offering for the office of Grand Master may become familiar with the current business of Grand Lodge should, not less than one (1) year prior to his candidacy, make application to the Board of General Purposes for permission to attend Board Meetings. The Board should satisfy itself of the sincerity of such application before granting permission.

(2) That Section 1, page 50 of the same regulations be amended by adding, as a third sentence, the following:-

A brother who is a member of Grand Lodge and not a member of the Board by reason of office or appointment may apply for permission to attend Board meetings. The Board should satisfy itself as to the validity of the underlying reasons for such application before approving it.

Right Worshipful I. Dale Steeves moved an amendment to this motion which changed paragraph 18-A to read as follows:

"Every member who has been regularly installed and served at least one (1) year as Master of a Lodge in amity with this Grand Lodge shall be eligible for every elective office in this Grand Lodge. Any brother of this jurisdiction may be elected as Grand Chaplain or Grand Tyler".

Considerable discussion was heard from members of Grand Lodge and the amendment as moved by Right Worshipful I. Dale Steeves was put to the vote. Motion carried.

The motion as made by Right Worshipful Bro. Boutilier was then put to the vote, not having 2/3 majority motion defeated.

MONEY GRANTS

Moved by Rt. Wor. Bro. F. Haycox seconded by Wor. Bro. W. Trent that the sum of Two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) be granted Most Worshipful The Grand Master for travelling expenses during the ensuing term of one year. On the question it was amended to increase the amount to \$5000.00 per year.

An amendment was moved by Rt. Wor. Bro. R. Limerick and seconded that the finance committee be given authority to act on the expenses of the Grand Master. Motion carried.

RECESS

Moved by Rt. Wor. Bro. Haycox & seconded that Grand Lodge take recess until 2.00 p.m. Motion carried.

Grand Lodge resumed labor at 2.00 p.m. and the final report of the Credential Committee being submitted, Grand Lodge proceeded to the election of Grand Lodge Officers, resulting as follows:


