





DEVOTIONAL ADDRESS MAY 14, 1982

GRAND LODGE OF N. B., F. & A. M. ANNUAL MEETING

"FAITH FOR THESE DAYS"

It is a great privilege and honour for me to bring the message to this Annual Assembly. Tonight as we gather together we will be making plans for the future. But first of all it seems proper that we should offer thanksgiving for the past. Let us recall with pride and honour all the members of this Grand Masonic Lodge who have finished this life. Let us rejoice and express our gratitude for the heritage that is ours.

I am reminded of the famous words of Joseph Howe:

"A wise nation preserves its records, gathers up its muniments, decorates the tombs of its illustrious dead, repairs its great structures, and fosters national pride and love of country by perpetual reference to the sacrifice and glories of the past."

As we look to the past we all have many memories of special days and events that have enriched and blessed our lives. Let me recall my own entry into this distinguished order over 40 years ago. When I arrived at my first Pastoral Charge in Kingston, N. S., in 1939 I met the Rev. Theodore Ross who was leaving. We talked about many things, including the organizations and service clubs of the town, he casually said, "If you are interested in joining a lodge I would recommend the Masons." In less than a year I received my third degree, and have always been grateful for the advice of my good friend.

All of us can recall some words of advice, some act of kindness that have determined the direction of our lives. We should never forget these events, and give thanks for them.

Two passages from the degree work always impress me. In the first place where each new candidate proclaims his trust in God, and in the second place where the candidate finds himself penniless and recognizes the fact that we are our brother's keeper. These two principles are the foundation of all Masonic endeavours. And it is these same great truths that will give us faith for these times and faith for all times. King Solomon lived by these principles. Jesus Christ put these great rules of life in a new light. "Love God with all the heart, mind, soul, and strength. And love thy neighbour as thyself."

Tonight we look not only to the past but also to the present and future. From the Indian Sanskrit, the oldest of all known languages, we read these words.

"Look to this day!
For it is life, the very life of life.
In its brief course lie all the verities
And realities of your existence:
The bliss of growth,
The Glory of Action,
The Splendour of Beauty
For yesterday is but a Dream
And Tomorrow is only a Vision;
But today well-lived, makes
Every yesterday a Dream of Happiness,
And every tomorrow a Vision of Hope.
Look well therefore to this day."

What a wonderful and fulfilling life!

Dreams of happiness, Visions of hope.

As we look about us we see so many who seem to be living with just the opposite view of life, regret and remorse for the past and dread and fear for the future. So many spend their days pondering over their mistakes of the past, the folly of governments, the tragedy and wasted lives in wars, and fears for the future.

We see this in politics - nothing but debts, chaos and crisis, wars and rumors of wars. We see it in religious thinking: new sects springing up every day with messages of gloom and doom, and nothing to live for while awaiting for the final Armageddon when the world will be completely destroyed.

But we as Masons have hope. We rejoice in the past and give thanks for our heritage. We have a vision of hope for the future. We put our trust in God and believe in our fellow man. We are our brother's keeper.

This is our faith for these times.

Faith in God and Faith in our Brother-man gives us faith in ourselves.

In closing I want to speak directly to you and myself as Masons. We are Masons, a select group of the chosen Brotherhood. We have received the light. We are no longer in darkness. We have been led through the winding stairs upward to the Divine Mysteries of the Universe, which begins with our Trust in God.

As the light comes our minds are open and ready to accept more light. As we receive more light we have the responsibility to share that light with our brothers for the benefit of all mankind. He that receiveth much, much shall be required from him.

The God we trust in Gives us the light. Our God is the God of the whole universe. He is the God of our Fathers, not a Nationalistic God, not a Racial God, not a Tribal God, but the god of all mankind.

Our ritual describes our God well.

"Most Holy and Glorious Lord God, the great Architect of the Universe." The Bible is always open in our lodge room and is the foundation of our order. It says in the first chapter; "In the beginning God created the Heavens and the Earth. He made the sun, the moon and the stars, and the planets. He made all plants, trees, and flowers. He created the elements and all animals. He made man in his own image and gave him control of all animals and all life upon the earth. And God saw that it was good."

Our faith will depend on how well we know our Bible. I believe that we are re-discovering the Bible. More books are written today about the Bible than ever before.

Let me close with a reference to the latest Canadian book about the Bible. Dr. Northrup Frye is the author. The title is simple, one needing no explanation, "The Great Code". Dr. Frye is a professor of literature at Victoria University and has spent many years lecturing on The Bible as literature. MacLean's Magazine describes the author of this book as follows: "For 40 years Northrup Frye has presided as pre-eminent teacher, literary critic, and philosopher at Victoria College in the University of Toronto. With the publication this month of his masterpiece, "The Great Code", his position as one of the century's great thinkers is assured." Then the editor devotes six full pages in the April 5th edition of MacLean's in praising this man and reviewing his book.

The Bible is again becoming a popular book. We need to use it more as well as open it for our meetings.

Just one more quote directly from Dr. Frye on the Bible. "The Bible should be taught so early and so thoroughly that it sinks straight to the bottom of the mind where everything that comes along can settle on it."

As Masons we need a strong sure faith. We need to know, love, and serve our God. We need to love our neighbour and we need to know our Bible. This will give us the Faith we need for these times.

MORNING SESSION, SATURDAY MAY 15th, 1982

The Grand Lodge resumed Labor at 9.00 a.m. with The Most Worshipful The Grand Master presiding.

The Grand Secretary Most Worshipful Bro. M. W. Dalton presented the Nominations for the elective officers for the ensuing year.

THE GRAND MASTER'S ADDRESS

TO: THE MOST WORSHIPFUL GRAND LODGE OF
FREE & ACCEPTED MASONS OF NEW BRUNSWICK

Brethren:

When men are knit together by a love of society, not in a spirit of faction, and do not meet to censure or annoy those that are absent, but to enjoy one another - there may be something useful in these little institutions and establishments. It is in this spirit that I welcome each and every one to this 115 Annual Communication of Free and Accepted Masons of New Brunswick. A special welcome to the Master Masons who have this year been invited by the Grand Master to observe the proceedings of their Grand Lodge.

During the past year we have witnessed a general recession within our jurisdiction and many of our members have suffered loss of job opportunities and financial setback. To our members who find themselves in such circumstances, we offer encouragement and reiterate the fact that Masonry is a charitable institution and will assist wherever possible.

To the board of General Purposes, I express my appreciation and thanks for their faithful attendance and advice in the operation of this Grand Lodge while not in session.

Our Grand Secretary and Past Grand Master, Most Worshipful Brother Maurice W. Dalton was honored last evening by a banquet and dance in his honor. The salutations which were given at that time very appropriately express the respect which he and his lovely wife Ruby hold in this Grand Lodge.

Our Distinguished Visitors

I am particularly pleased to welcome the Grand Master and representatives of our sister jurisdiction. Although the Grand Lodge of New Hampshire is in annual session at this same time, I am very happy to welcome the representatives from the Grand Lodges of Maine and Rhode Island. We trust that all our distinguished visitors will enjoy their stay with us and that the sharing of Brotherhood among us will be a mutual affair and draw us ever closer in the spirit of fraternity.

It is also pleasing to note that we have representatives from so many of our concordant bodies. It is the first time that we have had the honor of the presence of the Grand Master of the Order of DeMolay. We welcome Bro. Stanley Cassidy in that capacity and also as a member of this Grand Jurisdiction.

District Deputy Grand Masters

A Grand Master cannot properly function within his jurisdiction without the assistance of dedicated District Deputies. This year I have been particularly fortunate in having Masons as District Deputies who were ever anxious to go that extra mile. Several of these dedicated men have accompanied me on visitations far in excess of their normal requirements. They have functioned within their respective districts to the point that practically every lodge is actively involved in conferring degrees and promoting Masonic education. To these dedicated men I express the appreciation of this Grand Lodge.

Necrology

It has been two years since this Grand Lodge has received a report of the call of the Great Architect on our membership.

In March, 1981 this Grand Jurisdiction in particular and many other Grand Jurisdictions in general were deeply saddened when it was learned that our beloved Grand Master Clarence Fleming Carter had passed to the celestial lodge above while attending Masonic functions in London, England. A memorial funeral service was held at his church in Moncton to which Masons from throughout this part of the continent filled the church to overflowing.

Just a few months earlier in January, 1981 one of our senior Past Grand Masters, Charles Daniel Dickinson, received the call from our Great Architect. Past Grand Master Dickinson had been in failing health for a number of years and had been unable to attend Masonic meetings. Although severe winter conditions prevailed during his funeral day, several Brethren were able to attend and bid our brother a long last farewell.

In February of the same year, 1981, Gerald Joseph O'Donnell, a Past Senior Grand Warden, passed to the Grand Lodge on High after several month's illness. Right Worshipful Brother O'Donnell had been District Deputy of District # 6 in 1969/70. Gerald will long be remembered as a man who practised the principles of Masonry in his every day life.

Several other members of this jurisdiction have passed away during the period of this report and their names are recorded as an appendix. To the families of each and every one of our departed Brethren, we express our sincere condolences.

Jurisdictional Visitations

At the suggestion of Past Grand Master Speight at our last Grand Communication, your Grand Master did not attempt to officially visit every lodge within the jurisdiction during the current Masonic year. The list of official visitations is recorded as an appendix to this report and one will note that approximately four lodges in each district were visited as well as each District Workshop. These will be addressed later in this report. I am in complete accord that the Grand Master should not attempt to officially visit each lodge every year. It is too cumbersome a task for a Grand Master and also has the effect of making an official visit of the Grand Master "common place". One official visit every two years by the Grand Master and an annual visit by the District Deputy should be ample supervision of subordinate lodges.

Visitations Outside Jurisdiction

Your Grand Master has made five official visitations to sister jurisdictions in the past year. These include: the Grand communications of Quebec, Ontario, British Columbia, Alberta and Saskatchewan, the latter three of which your Grand Master was accompanied by the Grand Secretary. In Saskatchewan your Grand Master and Grand Secretary were each honored with the rank of Honorary Past Grand Master and Honorary Past Grand Secretary respectively of that Grand Jurisdiction.

Your Grand Jurisdiction has been represented at the Grand Lodge of Nova Scotia and the Grand Lodge of Maine by Rt. Wor. Bro. William Sherrard, The Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island by Rt. Wor. Bro. William Murray. To each of the Brethren who have functioned in this capacity, I express our deep appreciation.

On February 19 and 20 of this year your Grand Master together with the Deputy District Grand Master, Rt. Wor. Bro. Gilbert Irving, and Past Deputy Grand Master, Rt. Wor. Bro. William Murray, represented this jurisdiction at an Especial Communication of the All Canada Conference in Toronto. This meeting was held for the specific purpose of determining whether or not that body should meet annually, if determined that the body should meet annually, then the method of financing should also be addressed.

It was agreed by all jurisdictions that an annual meeting would be more desirable than the Biennial meetings which had been held since the early 1950's. It was further agreed that each Canadian jurisdiction should be represented by three official delegates except the Provincial jurisdictions in Newfoundland, whereby each of those would be represented by two delegates. It was suggested that the Grand Master, the Deputy Grand Master and one other delegate attend the conference as the official delegates of each jurisdiction.

The financing of the Conference would be accomplished by establishing a registration fee for each delegate and the balance of the cost to be pro-rated to the craft membership on a Canadian basis. The registration fee for the next meeting in 1983 was set at \$175.00 per delegate. The amount of the registration fee will be reviewed annually or as required.

The proceedings of each conference will be made available through the respective Grand Lodges. Copies of the February, 1982 meeting are already printed and your Grand Lodge has provided each lodge with one copy. Whether or not this procedure will be followed in the future will be determined by your Board of General Purpose.

Workshops

At the conclusion of the Board of General Purpose meeting in June, 1981, a workshop as to the requirements of a District Deputy was held in Saint John. This workshop was of one-half day duration and was very effective in familiarizing the District Deputies with their responsibilities to Grand Lodge in their respective areas.

A Masonic Educational Workshop for District # 3 was held in Dalhousie in October, 1981 with the Chairman of the Culture & Information Committee, Rt. Wor. Bro. William Murray directing the program. The theme for this workshop was "Masonry in the Eighties". Attendance was satisfactory and many of the brethren together with their ladies enjoyed a banquet and social evening after the meeting. The workshop concluded with a Divine Service on Sunday morning at which Grand Lodge members in full regalia attended.

A similar workshop with the same theme was held in Bethel Lodge, Edmundston, for District # 4 during November. Rt. Wor. Bro. Gordon Prichard directed the afternoon's activities. Interesting and lively group discussions occurred after the theme address was presented by Past Grand Master Brooks. At the conclusion of the proceedings a Table Lodge was enjoyed by members and their ladies.

During the same period, District # 6 held a workshop in Fredericton under the direction of our Senior Grand Warden, Rt. Wor. Bro. Eldon Libby assisted by Rt. Wor. Bro. Charles Webber. While attendance at this workshop was less than satisfactory (three lodges had no representatives), the material presented was very appropriate and well received.

Also, during November a District Workshop in West Saint John was conducted by the ritual committee under the direction of Most Worshipful Past Grand Master Speight and Rt. Wor. Guy Mercer. Portions of various degrees were portrayed and comments by the ritual committee were well received.

In March, 1982, District # 3 under the direction of Rt. Wor. Bro. Edmond Williams held a ritual workshop in Bathurst where different parts of the various degrees were portrayed and appropriate comments were made by the committee members.

In April, 1982 Districts 2 & 7 held a combined ritualistic workshop in Coverdale Lodge under the direction of Rt. Wor. Bro. Edmund Williams and Rt. Wor. Bro. Garth Elliott. Again the degrees were portrayed by various degree teams and procedures discussed by the members present. It has been noted by your Grand Master that Masonic Visitation is extremely well practised in these two districts and several of the other districts within this jurisdiction should follow this example. On one occasion your Grand Master was accompanied by sixty-five Grand Lodge members on an official visit to a lodge within these two districts. On that occasion thirteen of the fourteen lodges within these two districts were represented by their presiding Master. This type of participation is great encouragement to all Masons.

In each of these workshops the preparatory work was provided by the District Deputies and a sincere appreciation is expressed to each for their efforts.

Officer's Training Workshops

The inadequacies in planning and abilities in conducting meetings had been observed by Grand Lodge officers. In an attempt to assist the newly installed officers of craft lodges in preparing their lodge program, a series of one-half day seminars was inaugurated in January and February, 1982.

Three such seminars were held wherein the first three officers; i.e., Master and Two Wardens together with the Secretary of each lodge was summonsed to attend an afternoon session for that purpose. The first such seminar was held for the officers of lodges in District # 4 at Benjamin Lodge quarters in Perth-Andover. Attendance was nearly 100%. Imitation programs for the whole Masonic Year were prepared by the officers and many worthwhile ideas were exchanged by the officers. The members of Benjamin Lodge have a unique manner of raising funds for charity. Once a month the members provide an after-church brunch which has been operating for several years and is very successful.

The second seminar was held in Lodge St. John at Bathurst for District # 3 and was equally as successful as the previous one in Perth-Andover. The invaluable assistance of Past Grand Master Oulton is hereby acknowledged in the success of this seminar.

The third officer's seminar was held in Saint John in early March and covered Districts # 1, 2, 5, 6 and 7. This seminar was

under the direction of the Culture & Information Committee. Although winter road conditions prevented some members in District # 7 from attending, the attendance was satisfactory and all members benefited from the instructions. Appreciation is expressed to Wor. Bro. Donald Gruchy for his excellent portrayal of how he increased attendance in Hiram Lodge when he was Master of that lodge. Appreciation is also expressed to each of those Grand Lodge officers who assisted in making these seminars informative and successful.

Awards

One of the many privileges of being a Grand Master of his jurisdiction is the honor of recognizing and presenting the highest award that this Grand Jurisdiction can bestow upon any Grand Lodge member. The Beardsley Medallion is presented in recognition of outstanding and unselfish service to the Masonic fraternity. Three such medallions may be presented annually. The Grand Master has sole jurisdiction as to who shall be the recipient of one such medallion and the Awards Committee through the Board of General Purpose designates the recipients of the other two. It is with pride and pleasure that I now direct the Grand Director of Ceremonies to conduct Rt. Wor. Bro. J. William Murray to the East as recipient of the Grand Master's Beardsley Award.

It is with similar pleasure that I now direct the Grand Director of Ceremonies to conduct Wor. Bros. Phillip B. Stratton, Past Master, Northumberland Lodge # 17, and Vernon Steeves, Past Master, Tweedie Lodge # 41, to the East to receive the coveted Beardsley Medallions.

Another of the privileges of a Grand Master is the authority to confer Honorary Rank on Grand Lodge members. This is an authority that must not be taken lightly and honor is to be given only to those who have served Masonry well and for long and continued periods. It is in this attitude and respect that I now propose to recognize two outstanding members of this Grand Lodge with the rank of Honorary Past Grand Master with all privileges, powers and prerogatives appertaining to that office. Wor. Brother Grand Director of Ceremonies, you will now present Rt. Wor. Brother Ralph Victor Limerick and Rt. Wor. Brother Fred S. P. Haycox to the East.

Two years ago this Grand Lodge in its wisdom in recognizing any member of this jurisdiction for outstanding masonic service struck a medallion to be known as the Quinn Medallion. The recipients of this award are to be few and worthy. In fact, only one such award is to be given in each Masonic district for the first three years of the award and thereafter only three within the jurisdiction. We are now in our second year of presentations of this award hence one such award will be presented on behalf on each masonic district.

The Grand Director of Ceremonies will present these Brethren to the East and the appropriate District Deputies will give the citations and make the presentations.

Grand Representatives

The Grand Master in his official duties has the honor of recommending appointments as Grand Representatives of this Grand Jurisdiction near other Grand Jurisdictions with whom we are in amity. It has been my privilege this year to become the Grand Representative near the Grand Lodge of Canada in the Province of Ontario. Other such appointments include:

- Rt. Wor. Brother Leslie J. Brewer, Alexandria # 33, near the Grand Lodge of Saskatchewan
- Wor. Bro. Ralph Bard, Past Master, Hartland # 46, near the Grand Lodge of Equador.
- Rt. Wor. Bro. J. William Murray, Past Master, Tweedie # 41, near the Grand Lodge of Virginia.

At a later period in this communication you will be requested to give your assent to join in fraternal relations with the newly formed Grand Lodge of Alaska and authorize your Grand Master to exchange representatives with that Grand Jurisdiction.

New Lodges

It is my distinct pleasure to report to this Grand Lodge Communication that we currently have two lodges operating under dispensation within this jurisdiction. These are "Granite Lodge" whose meeting place is the Recreational Centre, Temperance Vale, York County. The scheduled meeting date is the third Wednesday of each month. The presiding Master is Wor. Bro. David Young, Past Master, Cherry Mountain Lodge # 50. The appointed wardens are Bros. Robert Wilson and Donald Robart. Wor. Brother Douglas D. Larlee ALEXANDRIA Lodge # 33 has been appointed Mentor of Granite Lodge during its formative development stage.

The second Lodge operating under dispensation is Abenaki Lodge and meets at the Orange Lodge quarters in Lambertville, Deer Island, Charlotte County. The date of meeting is also the third Wednesday of each month. Wor. Bro. Stuart Fountain, Past Master, St. Marks Lodge # 5, is the presiding master and Bros. Michael Silvaggio and Roy Pendleton are the appointed wardens. Rt. Wor. Bro. Frank Langley is appointed as mentor of Abenaki Lodge during the formation period.

Each of these lodges has been granted a dispensation until this communication of Grand Lodge. You will be requested to either grant a charter or continue those dispensations later in these proceedings.

Special Committees

Three special committees were appointed to report to the Board of General Purposes. These were:—

- (1) Dress for Grand Lodge Officers
- (2) Methods of electing and appointing Grand Lodge officers
- (3) Jurisdictional Building & Insurance Committee

(1) Dress for Grand Lodge Officers

Since it is deemed inadvisable that any well qualified member of Grand Lodge should refrain from seeking office in Grand Lodge because of the extreme cost of required formal dress, a committee was appointed to present recommendations for a compromise.

This committee was under the chairmanship of Rt. Wor. Bro. Gordon Coffey.

The committee reported to the Board of General Purpose with the following recommendations:

- (1) The Grand Master should wear appropriate formal attire on all occasions.
- (2) Other officers may wear appropriate formal attire on all occasions.
- (3) Tuxedos and black tie are acceptable dress for all other Grand Lodge officers during Grand Lodge functions.

(2) Committee on Grand Lodge Election and Appointments

This committee was chaired by Rt. Wor. J. William Murray. Considerable investigative work was done by the committee through correspondence. Specific meetings on this purpose were not held and no conclusive decisions were accomplished.

(3) Building Committee

This committee was chaired by Rt. Wor. Bro. Gilbert Irvine and assisted by each District Deputy. This has been an ongoing committee for some years with the original objective of determin-

ing the feasibility of obtaining a blanket insurance policy for all lodge structures within the jurisdiction. While there appears to be some interest in such a project, it is difficult to obtain a commitment from sufficient of the lodges at the present time to properly formulate a progressive program.

State of the Order

Within this jurisdiction one is able to observe every extreme of masonic perfection and imperfection. Many lodges are practising the purest form of Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth.

I am very concerned when I believe that some members are resorting to unmasonic use of the ballot box.

Several lodges are changing their By-Laws to facilitate - (1) an increased dues structure, (2) change of months of meeting; i.e., closing in January and February and remaining open in July and August, (3) provision to include on one notice more than one monthly meeting for any one mailing.

The eighth printing of our ritual is currently at press and will be available for distribution within a very short period of time.

The Constitution and General Regulations of the craft as revised by this session of Grand Lodge will be placed with the printers as soon as conveniently possible.

We are very pleased to have within this jurisdiction two additional Grand Masters of other concordant bodies. I refer specifically to the Grand Master of the Canadian Jurisdiction of the Order of DeMolay in the person of the Senior Warden of Hiram Lodge, Bro. Stanley Cassidy. Rt. Wor. Bro. Ralph Limerick is Grand Master of the New Brunswick Jurisdiction of the Royal Order of Scotland.

We may well be advised to take a leaf from the notice of motion which emanated from one of the chapters of DeMolay from Alberta. I quote, "No formal meeting of a DeMolay Chapter or Club shall continue past the hour of ten o'clock p.m. without the previous written consent of the Grand Master or his representative in that jurisdiction. Any business transacted subsequent to 10:00 p.m. without dispensation shall be declared null & void" end of quotation.

It is particularly encouraging to observe the various methods of lodges in their observance of church parades. I commend the Corinthian Lodge in the use of an interdenominational divine service conducted in their temple to which families are invited to share.

The temple of Woodstock Lodge # 12 has been sold to the Provincial Government where a community college will be erected.

Mananook Lodge is regaining activity under the wise counsel of Wor. Bro. David Gray as Worshipful Master. This lodge can be a model for other members who think there is no other choice than forfeiting their charter. We do encourage the members of Mananook in their resurgence of activity and wish them continued success.

During the month of March your Grand Master and Grand Secretary provided an interview on Masonry for the local T.V. station. Although the telecast area was limited, the station did provide similar services to other fraternities and clubs.

Lodge St. John # 27 is congratulated and other lodges are encouraged to follow their example in completing lodge histories. Such has been the case for Lodge St. John during the current year.

An unexpected archive donation was offered to Alexandria Lodge # 33 when a letter from an ancestor of James A. Boone, the Charter Master of Alexandria Lodge, offered for the archives an apron which was owned by the late Wor. Bro. Boone. Actual possession of the apron will take place in the near future.

Recognition is also made to the fact that Supreme Council members of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite are meeting in Fredericton in September 1982. This is the second time in five years that this body of masons has met within the boundaries of this jurisdiction. We wish them well in their deliberations.

Decisions

(1) Due to an extreme increase in postal rates during the year (17¢ to 30¢ for a first class mailing) your Grand Master authorized that one mailing could contain lodge notices for two or three meetings. A minimum of four mailings must be provided each year.

(2) Notices of masonic meetings may be placed in local papers as to the time and place of meetings only. The contents of meetings shall not be published.

(3) Grand Lodge 50-year certificates and pins will be provided only to those who have an accumulated total of 50 years of paid membership. Periods of Suspension cannot be calculated in determining the accumulated total of 50 years.

Recommendations

(1) That a "Task Force" be appointed by the Board of General Purposes to investigate and program a five-year-plan of operation for masonry in New Brunswick.

(2) That the office of Grand Master become a one-year appointment, not normally subject to reappointment, and that the Deputy Grand Master become a progressive appointment to that of "The Grand Master".

(3) That this Grand Lodge commit its members to participate in the All Canada Conference on an annual basis.

(4) That the Lodges currently operating under dispensation; i.e., Granite and Abenaki, be authorized to continue in that capacity until our next communication or until the committee on "Warrants for New Lodges" recommend to the Grand Master that a lodge be constituted and a charter granted.

(5) That a Grand Lodge Bulletin be provided for all Craft Masons within this jurisdiction. Such bulletin would update all masons on the activities of the Grand Lodge.

(6) That the Grand Master is not invited by individual lodges to provide the installation ceremonies more often than once in every five years.

(7) That consideration be given by the Finance Committee and the Board of General Purpose to provide \$10,000.00 in 1982 for masonic scholarship awards.

(8) That this Grand Lodge formally recognize the formation of the Grand Lodge of Alaska and exchange representatives with that Grand Body.

Conclusion

I believe most of us have read or heard Dr. Joseph Fort Newton's description of "When is a man a mason". Recently I read another with the same title and it is written by Ralph H. Head, the editor of the California Freemason, and I would quote it to you, "A man knows himself to be a mason when he learns the principles and precepts upon which the craft was founded. As its history unfolds before him, he begins to feel a kinship with the multitude of men who have gone before. There is no emotional stimulation in recognizing the influence masonry has had in the founding of his country, in the formation of its government and in the writing of its Constitution. Evidence that a man knows he is a mason is not found in the recitation of the ritual or in the recognition of signs and emblems. It is found in the heart, because from there comes charity, tolerance, generosity, kindness and goodwill. As these become a part of his beliefs and his conduct, then he knows he is a Mason".

CULTURE AND INFORMATION REPORT TO GRAND LODGE

Your CULTURE AND INFORMATION COMMITTEE has spent a busy 12 months since our last Report to Grand Lodge. With direction from the Grand Master, requesting more emphasis on Culture and Information and with Workshops devoted entirely to these subjects, your committee had an opportunity to meet many of the Craft Lodge officers, and this gave us a chance to let them know what is available from Grand Lodge to assist them.

The first District Workshop that served as the pilot project for the others, took place on Saturday October 17th in Dalhousie. Organized by DDGM Hugh McLean, its format consisted of a keynote speaker, group division for discussion of five questions, then we ended the afternoon with a General discussion when the findings of each group was given. Other Workshops of a similar type took place in Fredericton and Edmundston, and in Saint John, we participated in a joint effort, with the Grand Lodge Ritual Committee.

In all Districts we received a very positive feedback from those who took part. We listened with interest to the comments on the five questions. We hope to make these available to Craft Lodges sometime in the future.

Another new approach by your committee this year was a Seminar devoted to Lodge programming. This took place at the Temple in Saint John on February 6th.

The highlight of this meeting was our keynote speaker Past Master Donald Gruchy from Hiram Lodge Fredericton. He outlined how he was able during his term as Worshipful Master to increase attendance at Hiram Lodge, and he did it with interesting programming. As a project of this Seminar in Saint John, we divided into groups and set about developing a ten month Program list. These lists were given by the various group leaders at the end of the Seminar. Your committee also made literature available to assist Lodges in developing more interesting programs in their own lodge.

This year marked the beginning of what must be a continuing thrust by Grand Lodge to assist the Craft Lodges in our jurisdiction with more program information. As a next step I would advance

this suggestion, that if possible each lodge establish a standing committee of Culture and Information. That if such a committee set up, the name of the Chairman be sent to the Grand Lodge Secretary, so that any future information on Lodge Programs can be passed along.

Now to conclude this brief report, a few words of thanks to those who assisted this committee this past year. Past Grand Master Blake Oulton for the Dalhousie Workshop and Past Grand Master Stuart Brooks for the Edmundston Workshop. Their participation added much to the success of these events. Also thanks to this year's committee, Right Worshipful Brothers Gordon Jeffrey, Gordon Pritchard, Charles Webber and Eldon Libby. With their support and interest the Workshops and the Program Seminar would not have been as successful as they were.

To the members of the Board of General Purposes we extend a vote of thanks, for your advice and guidance this past year, trust that the findings of this year will prove useful to the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick.

ANCIENT, HONOURABLE AND . . . ?

I am deeply conscious of the honour conferred upon me this afternoon, but I am also aware of the responsibility thrust upon me as I prepared this address which is intended as a challenge to that Ancient and Honourable Fraternity, of which we are, or should be, justly proud.

We are the heirs of a craft which has existed from ancient times. Our operative brethren have erected majestic cathedrals and other noble edifices, many of which still inspire the worshipper and the admiration of the visitor. Our Fraternity is honourable in that its philosophic precepts teach an ethical standard of conduct based upon a universal brotherhood under one Almighty Parent. It tends to raise men above the commonplace, to contemplate the wonders of the past, to labour for good in the present, in order to prepare for the future.

So it has been throughout the ages, but suddenly, in the last half of this turbulent century, as one writer has described it, "the human race appears to be on a gigantic rollercoaster that cannot stop or even slowdown, without a convulsion, which would maim, if not kill, most of the riders". Every facet of our civilization, as we know it, is under stress and subject to variation and deviation unthought of prior to the First World War. Our way-of-life seems on the verge of collapse, without any viable alternatives. Our governments, federal, provincial and municipal, give the impression almost without exception, that they are more concerned with semantics than facts - theories than solutions. Indeed, there is a malaise loose in this world, and many are losing hope; their faith in existing institutions has been badly shaken, and, in some cases, utterly lost. Even in this age of space shuttles, the noted space scientist, Dr. Carl Sagan, tells us that "we cannot look out into space without looking back into time." Thus we are reminded of another time in our history when conditions were so similar that a comparison may be made.

The last century of the Roman Empire showed a thoroughly corrupt system of government, exorbitant taxes and unscrupulous collectors, debauched Emperors and courtiers, who were both incompetent and dangerous, the gladiators who demanded and received ever increasing sums for their prowess in the arenas - (my,

that has a familiar ring) broken family ties, immortality at all levels, a breakdown in discipline which finally saw the once great legions of Rome fall before the barbaric hordes, until Rome, itself, fell. Barbarians ushered in an era lasting several centuries, but known as "the Dark Ages." The parallel is, to say the least, ominous.

Now many present will say, "Yes, I agree with all or almost all of what you have said, but where do we as Masons fit into this picture of impending gloom and despair?" Does our Ancient and Honourable Fraternity have a part to play in the crisis which confronts us and, if so, what is it? Yes, we do have a part to play. If we simply sidestep these problems both in Canada and elsewhere, then we curtail our usefulness to our fellowmen and so diminish our influence in the world in which we live. We should therefore face this challenge as our brethren have faced other difficulties throughout the ages. The response to the second part of the question should also be positive. To accomplish this goal, we would do well to emulate businessmen by taking an inventory of our assets and liabilities. Our greatest liability is not, for example, the "drift culture", but rather complacency or total indifference, a failure to recognize the serious situation which lies before us, the feeling that we can carry on in the same way as we have in the past and all will be well. Our assets or resources are both human and natural. Let us consider the latter first. Canadians have been somewhat slow to fully comprehend the extent and promise of our natural resources and have been quite content to allow other countries to make the necessary investments. We have also permitted our human resources to be exploited. The Masonic Order represents a great cross section of the Canadian mosaic, as our members come from nearly every vocation and almost every community from the largest to the smallest. It follows then we do have our obligations to God, our country, our neighbour and ourselves. We must strive at all times to "live" our faith, irrespective of denomination, and stand publicly for that which is acceptable to our standard of morality and put to rest the idea of anyone "doing his own thing" and being "permissive" as to permit anything and everything to happen in the name of "personal" or "human rights". We must nourish, with all the resources at our command, the Quality of Life in Canada, as far insofar as possible, throughout the world.

The Masonic Fraternity should realize, at long last, that public relations must play an ever increasing role in our activities (other than ritualistic work) and the need for proper publicity is vital and necessary. The need for a qualified public relations person for our Grand Lodge was never greater and perhaps this should be the first step in our positive thinking. Private lodges should also give the

media, pertinent details of anniversaries, installations and visitations. A word of caution is in order, your Secretary has enough to do, this should be the responsibility of a member of the lodge, who is qualified to do such work. Above all, do not leave it to the media or a photographer. The Craft is known in only the slightest degree to the younger generation, through two sources: (1) through the family, where there may be one or more members, (2) our Scholarship programme.

I believe our Lodges should endeavour to make their presence known in a favourable light. Here are some suggestions: a prize at the local high school, an essay contest, a debate, a public speaking contest, an athletic competition, etc. Perhaps such an idea could become a project for our provincial Bicentennial in 1984, in which case, preliminary planning should begin as soon as possible.

Incidentally, on the first day of September 1984, our Fraternity will mark the Bicentennial of the Installation of Officers in Hiram Lodge No. 17 at Parr-town (now the city in which we meet today). This was the first non-military or permanent lodge in what is now New Brunswick, and the Worshipful Master was none other than our revered Brother of Blessed Memory, Reverend John Beardsley, late Junior Grand Warden of the Provincial Grand Lodge of New York. I sincerely hope this most significant occasion will not pass unnoticed by our Grand Lodge and the lodges in the City of Saint John. A short biography of Brother Beardsley will appear in Volume V, DICTIONARY OF CANADIAN BIOGRAPHY, scheduled for publication in 1984. A copy was sent to the Grand Secretary in 1976 when I had completed the final draft.

Finally brethren, we must ever remember that, outside the lodge room, it is for us to so act that we are a credit to ourselves and the Fraternity, at all times. By so doing, we shall fulfill our obligations as Masons to the Great Architect of the Universe and all persons in Canada and elsewhere. This is our task and the hour is at hand, for if we fail, another Dark Age, more sinister than the first, shall surely engulf the world. It is for Masons to move forward together, building on a solid foundation for those who come after us, to meet the crisis with confidence, to triumph over apathy by showing goodwill to all, compassion to those in need, resolution in facing the threat of those who would destroy our way-of-life, whether within or without Canada, and good works that all may see that we labour not in vain. Then may it be said of us: "They were faithful Masons, Ancient, Honourable and - TRULY A BLESSING TO ALL MANKIND."
