



Business - (as referred by motion from Grand Lodge of May 10 1986) - "To deal with a committment to build" - "Masonic Assisted Senior Citizens Housing"

An Especial Communication of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick A.F. & A.M. was opened in ample form at 2 p.m., October 25, 1986 with the M:W: The Grand Master, John William Murray presiding in the east.

M:W: Bro. Murray welcomed the brethren, expressed his pleasure at such a large turnout, and explained the the only subject to be dealt with at this communication was Masonic Housing as outlined in a motion introduced and passed under New Business at the May 10 communication of Grand Lodge. He noted that at the Board of General Purposes in June, 1986 the Special Committee appointed by him was authorized to continue its studies and bring sufficient information and recommendations to this Especial Communication of Grand Lodge to enable the members to deal with and vote on the matter:

The Grand Master also noted that the Committee had been working diligently on the subject of Masonic Housing for some eighteen (18) months. He urged all to consider its findings and recommendations carefully, to enter the discussions and debate in a democratic and harmonious manner, and render decisions based on Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth.

Prior to the presentation of his report, R:W: Bro. Gruchy introduced the following motion:

"That after due examination and discussion of the recommendations of our committee, a two thirds majority of votes cast be required to pass any motion dealing with Senior Citizens Housing at this Grand Lodge Session. Seconded by M:W: J. S. Brooks. Carried.

After a considerable preamble and further explanations of the Committees findings, R:W: Bro. Gruchy presented the following:

Whereas we believe: "We are building Masonry for the future!"

That the Masons of New Brunswick should demonstrate to the world that we, not only as individuals but as a body, endeavor to aid our fellow man.

That our studies show that there is need for senior citizen's housing.

That our own members, especially those not able to attend Lodge, may, in the foreseeable future, require senior citizen's housing to which subsidized rent is available.

That one central body must provide the leadership and driving force necessary to operate this project and protect the interest of the Craft.

That there will be no financial liability to Grand Lodge or the individual Craft Lodges.

That guarantees are available from government agencies to insure that this project will not lose money and will have income sufficient to pay all its indebtedness on a monthly basis.

That all members of the Craft will benefit from this project with renewed pride of the Fraternity that they love and have an answer to the question "What do Masons do?"

That all lodges will benefit from renewed enthusiasm within the Craft and pride amongst its members.

That Grand Lodge will benefit from the renewed interest in the lodges and possibly show a steady increase in membership as a result of increased public awareness of the fraternity and its teachings.

That the Craft in general will benefit from the increased publicity of the Masonic Fraternity and its teachings, and remove some of the secrecy surrounding our ancient institution.

On behalf of the Committee, I therefore move:

1. That Grand Lodge endorse the erection of a senior citizen's apartment complex and authorize the steps necessary to insure the project will see fruition, keeping in mind that there is to be no liability to Grand Lodge and that guarantees are to be in place to provide for non-deficit operation of the complex.
2. That a corporation be set up to administer the operation of the senior citizen's apartment complex, and construction of the complex is to occur at such time and place as the directors of that corporation deem best.

Seconded by W:B: Myles Chown and carried by a two-thirds majority vote.

Notes - By order of The Most Worshipful the Grand Master, the vote was taken by secret (written) ballot. Scrutineers appointed were:

No. of votes cast were 167 with 125 voting in favor of the motion.

A hearty vote of thanks by R:W: O. F. Walton was extended to the members of the Special Committee for their work which was acknowledged by the unanimous standing applause of the brethren.

Brother Douglas Ellsworth, Attorney at law, then briefly outlined the requirements and procedures for setting up the necessary Charitable Foundation.

The M:W: the Grand Master thanked all for their attendance, interest, and participation and R:W: Brother Gruchy, his committee. R:W: Gruchy also extended his thanks to all for their assistance.

The Most Worshipful the Grand Master closed the meeting in ample form at 4:30 p.m.

M:W: I. Dale Steeves in responding for the representatives thanked the M:W: The Grand Master for their recognition, expressed their pleasure at serving this Grand Lodge and stated that they would be pleased to convey the fraternal greetings of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick to their respective Jurisdictions.

Under the direction of R:W: Bro Simon MacDonald and the Grand and Assistant Directors of Ceremonies, the brethren of Grand Lodge paraded to Trinity Anglican Church for the Annual Service of Worship and Thanksgiving conducted by V:W: Bro. Gerald Gray assisted by Rev. Christopher Pratt, Rector, W: Bro. Michael Saunders, Grand Organist and Bro. N. E. Williams as soloist.

DEVOTIONAL ADDRESS MASONIC SERVICE

This evening we heard read the 13th Chapter of St. Paul's Letter to the Corinthians.

To thoroughly understand the reason for this lesson, we realize that the Christians in Corinth were in trouble. They were in turmoil of jealousy amongst themselves and, consequently, going nowhere as far as Christian living was concerned.

My text for the evening is taken from the last verse of the lesson and is as follows - "FAITH, HOPE and CHARITY but the greatest of these is "CHARITY."

As we read this Lesson we find the people of Corinth had many gifts. There were some who had the gift of tongues, some the gift of prophecy, some the gift of understanding, some knowledge, some had great faith and some have given all their possessions to be sold and the money given to aid the poor. What wonderful gifts had been bestowed on this city of Corinth! But, the main missing link was "LOVE." Love for God and Love for the fellowman.

To explain further—Those who had the gift of tongues, if they could speak in a language which was not common to the people. The lesson says - "the tongues of men and of angels. What profit is there to anyone if he has this gift but does not love his neighbor and we all know who our neighbor is, everyone in the world. They were not using this gift as God intended so Paul says you might as well ring a brass bell or strike a cymbal because without "love" it is but a noise and is useless.

The second verse takes us into another realm of gifts. The gift of prophecy and the gift of understanding, all mysteries of knowledge, and though you have faith to remove mountains - what good are they if they are not used with "love", love for God and your fellowman.

Verse three goes a little further. Here Paul talks of bestowing all goods to aid the poor and have not "Charity" there is no profit for that man.

You have heard me use the words "charity" and "love" in the foregoing. The Bible, the King James Version, which many scholars tell us is the closest translation to the original Hebrew and Greek uses the word "charity". Webster's Dictionary defines the word "charity" as (1) the love of God for man or the love of man for his fellowman (2) an act of goodwill (3) Benevolence (4) kindness in judging others (5) a voluntary giving to those in need. This explanation gives us a very good meaning for our purposes in this Lesson.

These people in Corinth were missing the point altogether. Those who could speak in tongues claimed to be closer to God and Christ than the others but they were doing nothing to help the others. They were using the gift, so they thought, to further their own ends. They were actually very jealous of the rest and tended to put them down. It was the same story with the rest of the gifts. The people were divided into groups according to their gifts—they were not concerned really with the true following of Christ.

As we come to the next four verses we see the positive aspects of "charity" which Paul tends to give the Corinthians. Charity suffers long and is kind tells how patient we should be with our fellowman. We should not abuse people just because they cannot understand our viewpoint as we see happening in our world today. Violence has been a part of man's history from the very beginning. Oppression, injustice, dishonesty, hatred, deceit, crime, tyranny have been with us for generations. Until man can learn to live with "love" in his heart so it will be. This is not expected to be until our Lord and Saviour comes to reign again on this earth leading each and everyone of us in the way of "love". Isaiah tells us that one of Jesus titles when He returns will be the "Prince of Peace." He goes on to tell us that of the increase of His government and peace there will be no end. That is the way it was in Corinth. Divisions and more divisions just because all men were not equally gifted.

With the coming of Jesus Christ into this world the ancient theories, both of good government and of lasting civilization, were radically altered. Not that Christ came to destroy. His mission was to perfect. Not that He was a radical who advocated the abandonment of a necessary virtue without which no civilization could endure. He came to preach a more perfect doctrine which was designed to fill out the shortcomings, to sustain the foundations, and to supplement the strength of justice.

This doctrine which is known amongst Christians as "charity" is Christ's greatest contribution to the spiritual and intellectual advancement of the world.

After twenty centuries have elapsed since the founding of Christianity we are forced to admit that a great percentage of so-called Christians and Christian nations while clinging on Sunday to the teachings of Christ on this subject of charity, are anxious on Monday to disregard it. In practice the greater portion of the world refuses to accept Christ's interpretation of this basic virtue because it appears to conflict too keenly with the law of self-preservation,

with personal advancement and individual greed. In its stead we discover that the ancient philosophy of individualism, of unremitting justice still holds sway especially in the industrial life of the world.

In vain has Christ preached that our fellowman is actually our brother. In vain has He insisted that we shall love this brother as ourselves.

St. Paul tells us in his 13th chapter of Corinthians is most explicit in telling us that if he should give all his goods to feed the poor and have not charity, he is nothing. If I were asked to translate this borrowed word of charity into a simpler word, I would use the single term of "love." Charity is "love." First of all, it is loving our God with our whole heart, with our whole mind, with our whole strength. It dares not compromise His principles. It is loving our neighbor as ourselves. Not less than ourselves. The man who would possess real Christian charity must acquire a new concept of his fellowman. He must regard him not merely as a piece of flesh and blood born either to a slave or a master, a competitor or protector. He looks beneath the accidental conditions of wealth, of social prestige, of nationality and catches a glimpse of a real brother. He is closer in one sense to his fellowman than he is to his brother of his flesh for the simple reason that Jesus Christ, the Elder Member of our family, died for all of us without exception and introduced all of us into His common brotherhood by which we can cry: "Abba, Father," to Him Who created us.

Behold, the maid servant in your kitchen is your sister, the laborer in your factory is your brother. Your attitude towards these persons must be one of "love." We must accept the instruction of our Divine Redeemer that "whatsoever we do unto the least of His little ones we do unto Him."

Again I repeat Charity is "Love." Christ's love will make our lives redemptive, as His life was redemptive, so that in caring for one another we bear one another's burdens. His love will make our lives holy, in that our love for one another will continually bless and strengthen us in our common dependence on Him. Christian love is found in many phases of life—Christian love is alive in those whom life has hurt grievously but who nevertheless live joyfully, because they know that in sharing the burden of the cross they share also in its victory; Christian love is alive in mothers and fathers who work and struggle and deny themselves the ordinary pleasures of life for the sake of their children; Christian love is alive in all who give lovingly of themselves to make the Church and their community more

truly what is meant to be—an outpost of the kingdom of heaven; Christian love is alive in those who have the imagination to work and pray and give for the sake of the world beyond their own church parish knowing that God's love has no boundaries. The Creator of our great universe has such a great interest in our affairs. He can be described as a laborer when we consider how precisely He manouvers, season upon season, how He causes the day to chase the night, how correctly He places the blossom on the stem; how faithfully He brings it to bear fruit. He tends His garden with sunshine and showers. If He makes His creation His concern, then how much more does He plan for us. He made us for Himself! He has formed us in His own image — we are His temples — he built us for His occupancy. — He has done so very much for us — are we returning this concern and giving of ourselves to Him? A good question to think about.

Is our faith strong? Speaking of faith brings to mind the story of the good woman who was well known among her circle for her simple faith, and her great calmness in the midst of many trials. Another woman, living at a distance, hearing of her, said, "I must go and see that woman, and learn the secret of her holy, happy life." She went; and accosting the woman, said, "Are you the woman with the great faith?" "No," replied she, "I am not the woman with the great faith; **but** I am the women with a little faith in the great God."

O help us, through the prayer of faith,
More firmly to believe;
For still the more Thy servant hath,
The more shall he receive.

Faith is the work of God and He bestows it in such measure as He wills and judges right. Come to Jesus with any case and in every case. Come with your little faith and with your great unbelief, for in this matter also He can help as none other can. We need the winds and storms to exercise our faith, to tear off the decayed bough of self-dependence and to root us more firmly in Christ. If Christ were here, we say, we would do many things for Him. We all say we would be delighted to serve Him if only He would come again to our world and visit our homes. **But**, we can do things for Him just as really as if He were here again in human form. We do the things for Christ, which we do, through love to Him. Even obedience without love does not please Him. **But**, the smallest services we can render, if love inspires them, He accepts with gratitude. So it would seem this word "Love" is a very important one in our world. Every sun-ray that touches the earth has the sun

at the other end of it; so every bit of love upon God's earth has God at the other end of it. There is nothing love cannot face, there is no limit to its faith, its hope and its endurance. Love will never come to an end; there are three things that last for ever; faith, hope and love; but the greatest of them all is "love."

In closing, I would like to pray: O Lord, who has taught us that all our doing without charity are nothing worth; Send Thy Holy Spirit, and pour into our hearts that most excellent gift of charity the very bond of peace and of all virtues, without which, whosoever liveth is counted dead before thee. Grant this for the sake of Jesus Christ our Lord. AMEN.

Following the Service the brethren returned in procession and resumed labor.

The Grand Master thanked the V:W: Grand Chaplain for the inspiring service and message.

It was moved that R:W: O. L. Nason, seconded by W: Bro. Stuart MacDonald and carried that the Devotional address, given by the Grand Chaplain, be printed in full in the Proceedings.

The Grand Master reminded all present that the annual meeting of the Grand Lodge Corporation would be held at 8:30 a.m. May 9th and that all members of Grand Lodge should be in attendance. He also called attention to the location of the ballot box which would be available to receive ballots from 9:00 A.M. May 9th until the time set for closing.

It was moved by M:W: Bro Steeves that Grand Lodge take recess until 9:00 A.M. May 9th 1986 and that the first order of business be the reading of nominations for the elected Grand Lodge Officers. Carried.

MORNING SESSION, SATURDAY MAY 10, 1986

The Grand Lodge resumed labour at 9:00 a.m. with the Most Worshipful The Grand Master presiding. He announced that nominations for elective offices were duly closed.

The Grand Secretary R:W: B. A. Prescott presented the nominations for the elective offices for the ensuing year.

It was moved by M:W: Bro Oulton and seconded that the ballot close at 2:00 p.m. and that the election of officers be at approximately 2:30 p.m. following the report of the Credentials Committee.

The M:W: The Grand Master requested the Deputy Grand to assume the Grand East and delivered Grand Masters Address 1987.

Our Grand Secretary, our Grand Treasurer M:W: Bro Fred Haycox, Deputy Grand Master Ossie Mason & Wor Bro Ken Dunn formed in committee to seek a replacement, and we are most pleased with their choice. She is Miss Doreen Ross who was hired to replace Mrs. Demmings in our Grand Lodge office, and we wish her well.

THE STATE OF THE ORDER

Last October Grand Lodge was called into session at an Emergent Communication to vote on a notice of motion: re the question of Masonic Housing. At this meeting, the Grand Lodge members agreed by vote to use a 2/3rds majority rule. After discussion, the motion was passed on written ballot and the concept was accepted. Previous to this communication, much background research was compiled by chairman R:W: Bro Don Gruchy and his committee. Since Oct., with a clear mandate, much progress has been made, and we can now report to this Grand Lodge that a new foundation has been set up under the title: The New Brunswick Masonic Charities and Housing Co. Ltd., with letters patent issued by the provincial government. We are indebted to Brother Doug Elsworth and Brother Scott Elsworth for handling the legal matters required to launch such a venture. Application has also been made to the federal government to obtain an income tax number. Once this is received, any contribution made will become deductible from your income tax. The by laws of this new Masonic foundation

are so framed, to permit supporting Masonic and non Masonic projects.

There is also a provision in the by laws that states any brother is permitted to become a member for a fee of \$20. The success of this foundation will depend very much on the involvement of each brother.

Building a Masonic housing complex is the ultimate aim, and we should not forget this goal. It has taken us 120 years to reach this level, so let's be positive in our outlook and build a stronger brotherhood.

I am pleased to announce that V:W: Bro Alex Pincombe has agreed to continue as editor of Mostly Masonry. He has brought this publication along in a most professional manner, and his interest in Masonic education is reflected in each issue. Mostly Masonry is the one common denominator that links each brother in this jurisdiction, and I hope it will continue to be of Masonic service for many years to come. And now my brothers, soon I will return the gavel of authority with which I was entrusted these past two years...to Grand Lodge.

It is true, I have not accomplished all the things I had hoped to do, but I trust the things we have initiated meet with your approval. It is human to err and I know that mistakes have been made, yet I hope you will view them charitably and give me credit for an honest desire to do the best I could. We owe an obligation to the next generation of Masons. Each of us must accept this obligation, and see that it is fulfilled. Thus will we insure that the good works entrusted to us by the founders of this institution, will remain in perpetuity.

Moved by W: Bro J. R. Andrews and seconded that the address by The Most Worshipful The Grand Master be received, printed in full in the Proceedings and referred to a Committee of Past Grand Masters for review and report. Motion carried.

The Deputy Grand Master, Rt. Wor. Bro Nason, then appointed a Committee of all Past Grand Masters present under the Chairmanship of Past Grand Master J. S. Brooks to review the Grand Master's address and present their report to Grand Lodge.

For several reasons, 1986 proved to be a year of many difficulties, problem frustrations for your Grand Secretary. The constant challenging of the B General Purposes and its authority to direct the affairs of Grand Lodge by communications, and which culminated in the non-acceptance of the 119th Report to the 119th Grand Lodge Communication and a subsequent call Especial Communication of Grand Lodge in October, 1986 left the Grand Secretary in a position without advice, direction or authority to deal with any but the routine matters of administration. It did, however, add greatly to the work and hours of work required for Grand Lodge Office operations. Naturally and quite sincerely, I am most grateful for the kind and generous support and encouragement given to me by most Grand Lodge Officers, Lodge Masters and Secretaries during this period, but I respectfully suggest that the time has when serious consideration must be given for the provision of proper and continuous direction to, and for services rendered by, the Grand Secretary's Council. Our beloved Fraternity is to grow and prosper. Possibly, this may require establishment of a deputy or assistant, part-time, Grand Secretary to relieve the take over if and when circumstances warrant.

At the end of October, 1986 Mrs. Verda Demmings retired after 14 years of devoted and dedicated service to Grand Lodge, but I am pleased to note we have been fortunate in obtaining the services of Miss Doreen Ross and that she is interested, always pleasant and is picking up the various routines quickly, efficiently and effectively. Thank you Doreen.

Again, as noted above, our membership dropped by 140 during 1986, and it is also noted, that suspensions were up at 76, which suggests that serious action is needed, by all concerned, to reduce the number of these dropouts.

Finally, I am again most grateful to R:W: Bro. Irvine for his assistance, encouragement and particularly for his help with the preparations for this Grand Lodge Communication.

REPORT OF THE RITUAL COMMITTEE

TO THE MOST WORSHIPFUL THE GRAND MASTER,
OFFICERS AND MEMBERS OF THE GRAND LODGE OF NEW
BRUNSWICK:

As Chairman of your Ritual Committee I wish to submit a report for the year just passed, and to say that we of your Ritual Committee have enjoyed being part of this most important committee of Grand Lodge.

Your Ritual Committee met three times during the year.

November 1986 a meeting with the District Deputies was held in Fredericton at which time the latest edition of the Ritual was checked against the Grand Lodge Jewel.

A meeting in January 1987 to consider suggestions that were referred to your committee.

Only two workshops or district meetings requested the attendance of the Ritual Committee during the year District No. 5 held a very successful workshop and four of the five committee members were in attendance District No. 3 held a workshop but unfortunately as it was only two days after District No. 5 the committee members were unable to attend.

I again make reference to a weekend workshop held in a central location for all districts one meeting such as this would replace (7) meetings held through out the Province each year this would be a benefit to all District Deputies.

We would like to say that members of your Ritual Committee are available to give assistance if requested and also would welcome any suggestions that would improve our work. If within the landmarks of our Fraternity.

RITUAL COMMITTEE REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The following are the changes and/or amendments recommended for consideration:

That the Ritual Manual

- (1) Be amended as per motion of the 1986 Grand Lodge Communication.
- (2) **Page 12** - obligations be prefixed by "Say I and" PYNAFLARAM:
----- and delete "I" before OMOFWAA etc-
- (3) Page 14, line 4 - **Change**-capital "I" to Capital "L"
- (4) Page 14, line 16 **after** "penalty add/insert "of the obligation"

That the Jewel be amended to agree with:

Ritual Pages 55, 71 and 92 (line 6)

From "the position of my left arm" **to** "the position of my hands"
That the following instructions be printed and added to the back of the Ritual Manual

- (a) "Proper instruction for showing the Due Guard and Sign is to be given to the candidate before leaving the south"-(all 3 degrees)
- (b) "The Junior Deacon and/or Stewards are to remain with candidates in the preparation room at all times".
- (c) "Lights are to be lowered during all obligations and remain lowered until the Master steps down to demonstrate the Dugard and Sign, etc.

That: one (1) copy of the Jewel be printed

That Three (3) official Ritual Manuals be issued to and be accounted for by each lodge.

That: Three (3) Official (Pocket Size) instructional booklets be issued to and accounted for by each lodge.

That: Official Rituals and Instructional Booklets be accounted for and checked by the D.D.G.M. EACH YEAR.

That all lodges inform and instruct Ruffians of the legal implications and of being too severe and the need for care and caution during the 2nd. section of the 3rd. (M.M.) degree.

That the possible standardization of lodge music be turned over to the Grand Organist for study and recommendations.

That the possible removal of "penalties" from the various obligations be given further study before recommendations are made.

We also recommend that the Grand Master issue a directive that the sign of Fidelity be included as being allowed to be given a memorial service and Masonic Funeral but not in any other public place and that the Master of a Lodge shall not wear his hat at a Masonic Funeral.

the status of The Board of General Purposes and have concluded that while the Board has traditionally been the operational arm of the Grand Lodge when not in session, it does not have that statutory authority in the Constitution and General Regulations. Hence the motion to grant that authority will be made at this session of Grand Lodge. I will speak more fully to that motion when it is placed on the floor of this Grand Lodge.

The Jurisprudence Committee, through the efforts of W: Bro. Richard Speight, has reviewed all of the legislative acts in the Jurisdiction pertaining to the Masonic Fraternity. While this may appear to be rather insignificant, it did, however, require a great amount of time in determining which acts may apply to the Fraternity.

This Committee was requested by the Board of General Purposes to review and make recommendations relative to the distribution of our Benevolent Funds for organizations or individuals outside the fraternity.

The following were the recommendations which were approved by the Board.

Report from Minutes of March Board Meeting.

Committee members continue to receive individual phone calls and personal requests relative to the clarification of various sections of the Constitution. Very often the individual making these requests is unaware the item is already addressed in our Constitution or occasionally they are working from an outdated edition of the Constitution.

REPORT OF THE MASONIC EDUCATION COMMITTEE

TO THE MOST WORSHIPFUL THE GRAND MASTER AND MEMBERS OF THE GRAND LODGE OF NEW BRUNSWICK F. & A.M.

Your Grand Lodge committee of Masonic Education submit the following report summarizing the activities of the past months.

We have visited lodges in all the districts at the request of the Grand Master or the masters of the lodges and have present talks of varying durations on 26 occasions.

On March 28, 1987 we conducted a workshop on education Sussex Lodge #4 at Dorchester at the request of R:W: Bro C. Graham, D.D.G.M. for District #2 and R:W: Bro Robert Kidner D.D.G.M. for District #7. This work shop was very well attended and the participation by all was excellent.

We also participated in a workshop in Lodge Saint John #27 Bathurst. This workshop was very ably conducted by R:W: Bro Murray Clouston with roughly 70 brethren in attendance. Many of the lodges should take an example from this and utilise the expertise that is within their midst rather than wait for others to prepare and organize workshops for them.

Although we are continuing in our efforts to provide shop papers and other educational material for the lodges, our main thrust has been the development of the Mentor Program. We foresee the Mentor Program as an educational tool which the lodges will use as their main method of transmitting Masonic education to all their members, not just the newly elected ones. We believe that the Mentor Program must be mandatory for all lodges. This will enable all Masons to become better informed and prevent those who disagree with the program from saying that they do not have the time to participate.

To assist in the operation of this and other educational programs we believe it is necessary for each district to have an educational officer appointed. He would be appointed by and report to the District Deputy Grand Master. This appointment would be subject to confirmation by the Grand Master. With proper utilisation of this educational officer the D.D.G.M.'s work load would be greatly decreased. This would serve two purposes. First, it would allow the D.D.G.M. to concentrate on other areas of concern not related to

education and secondly, it would provide each district with a resident expert on the educational materials available from Grand Lodge and their uses.

Finally, Most Worshipful Grand Master, we wish to thank you for the opportunity of being able to serve you during your two years of office. Your guidance and leadership has enabled this Grand Lodge to move forward into 1987 with a feeling of pride and accomplishment. We hope that those who follow in your footsteps will continue to provide us with the encouragement needed to fulfil our dreams.

I take pleasure in presenting an annual report on our fraternal publication, MOSTLY MASONRY, of which nine editions have appeared in exactly three years. Previous to June 1986 MOSTLY MASONRY was a component of and responsible to the Masonic Education Committee. Last year a separate committee was formed; unfortunately, the pressure of daily work, plus the long hours spent in the editing of an address for the purposes of publication, prevented a regular meeting from being held. However, three editions were printed and distributed to the lodges and, from comments received, our fraternal newsletter is being accepted as an instrument for the diffusion of knowledge and a forum for constructive discussion for the advancement of our Fraternity.

One change has been proposed, whereas at present we have three editions of 4 pages each; it is proposed to have two editions of 6 pages of a double fold, with an autumn and spring distribution the former for September and the latter for March. One of the main reasons for this change is the fact that most of our lodges are sending out notices for two months, three or even four months and thus the copies are delayed in transmission. The extra cost is more than off-set by the saving in shipping costs, to say nothing of the work in the office of the Grand Secretary, the District Deputies and the Secretaries of the individual lodges. This proposed change will be monitored and a report submitted in 1988.

In addition to many fine contributions from our own jurisdiction, I would also mention M:W: Bros. George Baldwin and Lor Copeland, Grand Masters from British Columbia and Ontario respectively, and R:W: Bro Leslie R. Ramier, of Shigawake on the Gaspé Coast, for permission to use several of his beautiful fraternal poems. I am most grateful to our Grand Master for his consistent support, not only in his present office, but also in his capacity as the founding Editor and to all those responsible for individual contributions and the distribution of the various editions. Your cooperation has made our Newsletter a reality and thus we face the future with confidence.

You will recall that in our Report last year we recommended that a Study and Forecast of our Financial Requirements for the next 5 years be made by the Finance Committee and to report our findings and recommendations to the Board of General Purposes and the subsequent recommendations to Grand Lodge.

As a result your Committee decided to have the Chairman of the Finance Committee introduce a Notice of Motion at this One hundred and Twentieth Annual Communication of Grand Lodge to amend the Constitution to change the Per-Capita Tax to \$10 per Annum. We feel that it is absolutely necessary to pass this change if our beloved Fraternity is to survive and flourish. This subject is dealt with more fully in the Notice of Motion.

We also recommend that the Scholarships totaling \$10,000.00 be again funded from the interest from the Quinn Trust Funds.

It is our recommendation once again that the Library Funding remain the same as before.

Also it is our recommendation that the grant to each Lodge in the Jurisdiction from the Quinn Trust Fund Interest be the sum of \$550.00 as it was the past two years.

Finally it is also our recommendation our Fiscal Year end on December 31, rather than March 31. This recommendation will be dealt with at greater length in the Notice of Motion required for this change.
