





In your Report of 1993 you were informed of a Request for
Recognition from the Grande Loge Nationale Togolaise, supported
by correspondence from the Grande Loge Nationale Française,
which consecrated the above noted Grand Lodge in Paris, France,
in 1992. Our decision on this request was deferred.

The Grand Lodge of Togo was constituted regularly and their
operation meets the accepted standards for recognition, it is
therefore deemed to be regular. Accordingly it is recommended
that the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick recognize the Grand
Lodge of Togo and exchange Grand Representatives.

The Grand Lodge of Senegal in West Africa was constituted by
the Grande Loge Nationale Française. It was formed from a District
Lodge of the National Grand Lodge of France. At the time
of the request there were 13 lodges, with a total membership of
which we are advised has increased by 20%.

The Constitution and By-Laws conform to the accepted
standards, therefore it is recommended that the Grand Lodge of
New Brunswick accord Recognition and Grand Representatives
to the same.

In your Grand Communication of 1992, your committee was
asked to recommend and receive approval that reciprocal
relations for the purposes of "Intervisitation" be extended
to the Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge, F. & A. M., Province
of New Brunswick and Jurisdiction. A like request has been received from
the Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge F. & A. M. of
Connecticut, Incorporated, which together with the Most
Excellent Grand Lodge A. F. & A. M. of the State of Connecticut,
agreed on October 14, 1989 to establish joint
visitation and Visitation rights.

Accordingly it is recommended that the Grand Lodge of New
Brunswick extend Recognition and Visitation Rights to the Most

Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge, Free and Accepted
Masons of Connecticut, Incorporated.

A request for Recognition has been received from the
Grand Lodge of the Republic of Venezuela at Caracas. It meets
the accepted standards for Recognition, therefore your
committee recommends its recognition by the Grand Lodge of
New Brunswick and Representatives be exchanged.

of the time as Advisors is taken up with fund raising. This we have
to make sure DeMolay does not become an organization just for
those who can afford it but for all boys who will benefit from its

The Masonic Fraternity has always benefited from its
relationship with DeMolay. The Blue Lodges in our area appear to


